The Triduum at St. Paul's



The Triduum - Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter - is the pinnacle our year at St. Paul's. This year, we are thrilled to welcome The Rev. Canon Scott Gunn, Executive Director of Forward Movement, as our guest preacher at all three services during the Great Three Days. Scott is a

much sought after preacher, and a gifted evangelist and advocate for discipleship in The Episcopal Church. Maundy Thursday (March 28) and Good Friday (March 29) services will begin at 7:00 pm; the Great Vigil of Easter (March 30) will begin at 7:30 pm; we are delighted that the Sacrament of Holy Baptism will be celebrated at this year's vigil. Make plans to join us! As has been our custom, we'll share a parish Agapé Supper before our Maundy Thursday service, and have a festive reception after the Great Vigil of Easter.

Prayer and worship during the Great Three Days is the single most spiritually significant journey we make during our church year - we hope you make plans to worship and pray with us.

Palm Sunday is not a tropical holiday

The week that leads up to Easter is filled with liturgical music, altar flowers, vestments and altar cloths that reflect the passion, suffering, mystery and, ultimately, the ecstasy of the Christ and His resurrection.

Palm Sunday starts of off with our congregation carrying and waving palm branches in a procession. This

feast day commemorates the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem, an event mentioned in each of the four Gospels. The name Palm Sunday originates from the palm branches waved by the crowd and placed in his path to greet and honor Jesus Christ as he entered the city, before his arrest on Holy Thursday and his crucifixion on Good Friday. It thus marks the beginning of Holy Week, the final week of

In the Episcopal church the day is officially called *The* Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday; in practice, though,

it is usually termed Palm Sunday. While palm branches are traditional, any local greens native to the area may be

Lenten Stations of the Cross



During Lent, we offer a lay-led Stations of the Cross. Our final
Stations of the Cross will be on Good STATIONS of the CROSS Friday (March 29) at 12pm in the

Nave. The Stations of the Cross (or Way of the Cross) is a prayerful devotion that recalls the series of events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion and burial. There are 14 traditional stations. Participants will take turns reading the relevant scripture at each station.

"Learning to Pray" - Shared Formation

Our practice of growing as disciples in a common parish focus is continuing! This time, we'll be considering what it is to pray, and the many ways we learn to pray using the book "Learning to Pray: A Guide for Everyone" by James Martin, SJ.
