Welcome and Introduction

After a time of silence, the church bell is rung. All then stand and join in singing the opening hymn.

Opening Acclamation and Collect for Purity

All remain standing. The Celebrant says

Celebrant Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

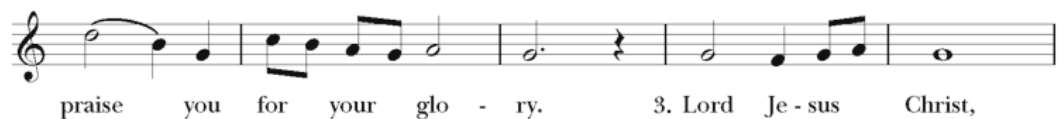
People **And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.**

The Celebrant then says

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

All remain standing.

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us pray.

The Celebrant says the Collect of the Day. You may follow in the weekly scripture insert.

People **Amen.**

All are seated for the lessons and psalm.

The First Lesson

You may follow along with the lesson in the weekly scripture insert.

At the conclusion of the lesson, the reader says

Reader The Word of the Lord.

People **Thanks be to God.**

Gradual Psalm

The psalm in the weekly scripture insert.

All join in reading the psalm antiphonally: the first verse of the psalm is read by those seated on the left side of the nave and chancel; the succeeding verse is read by those on the right side. Recitation continues by side until the end of the appointed psalm.

The Second Lesson

You may follow along with the lesson in the weekly scripture insert.

At the conclusion of the lesson, the reader says

Reader The Word of the Lord.

All then stand and join in singing the hymn.

Sermon

All are seated at the invitation of the Preacher. The sermon is followed by a time of silent reflection.

The Nicene Creed

All stand as able and say together

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

All remain standing as able.

The intercessor says: Let us pray for the Church and for the world.

Grant, Almighty God, that all who confess your Name may be united in your truth, live together in your love, and reveal your glory in the world. We pray especially for...

Confession of Sin

The Celebrant says:

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

The people kneel, as able. Silence is kept.

Celebrant and People

**God of all mercy,
we confess that we have sinned against you,
opposing your will in our lives.
We have denied your goodness in each other,
in ourselves, and in the world you have created.
We repent of the evil that enslaves us,
the evil we have done,
and the evil done on our behalf.
Forgive, restore, and strengthen us
through our Savior Jesus Christ,
that we may abide in your love
and serve only your will. Amen.**

*The Celebrant pronounces the absolution. The people respond: **Amen.***

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

The Celebrant proceeds

We praise you and we bless you, holy and gracious God, source of life abundant...

The Celebrant recounts before God the splendor of creation and remembers how when we fell away from God's purposes, God never ceased to care for us. Then the Celebrant says:

And so this day we join with Saints and Angels in the chorus of praise that rings through eternity, lifting our voices to magnify you as we sing:

Celebrant and People

heaven and earth are full of your glo - ry. Ho-san-na in the

The people remain standing. The Celebrant continues:

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God...

The Celebrant recounts before God how in the fulness of time, Jesus Christ lived among us to reconcile us to God. The prayer continues, recounting and remembering the Lord's institution of the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist at the last supper to feed God's faithful people throughout this life and in the ages to come.

The Celebrant voices our prayer that the Holy Spirit will descend upon our offerings of bread and wine so that they may be for us Christ's Body and Blood. We also pray that the Holy Spirit will also descend upon us, filling our hearts with God's presence as we prepare to receive them, and sending us into the world as Jesus' disciples.

The Celebrant concludes:

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

Celebrant and People

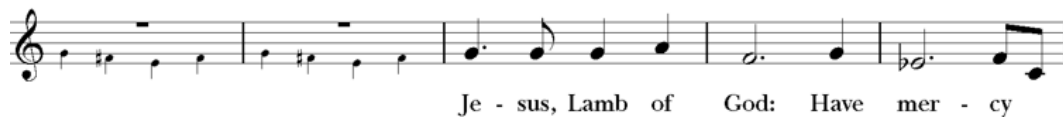
**Our Father in heaven,

The Holy Communion

The Celebrant says the following invitation: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

The ministers receive the sacrament in both kinds, and then deliver it to the people.

All are invited to come to God's table.

All baptized Christians, regardless of denomination, are invited and encouraged to receive Holy Communion.

Those who are not baptized, or those who do not wish to receive Holy Communion, may cross their arms over their chests to receive a blessing.

*If you would like to learn more about Holy Baptism, please speak to one of the clergy after the liturgy;
it would be our joy to walk with you as you enter into life in the body of Christ.*

Following the invitation the congregation may be seated and then come forward at the direction of the ushers.

All wafers used for Holy Communion are gluten free.

Post Communion Hymn

All then stand and join in singing the hymn.

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Post Communion Prayer

All stand as you are able.

**Eternal God, heavenly Father,
you have graciously accepted us as living members
of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ,
and you have fed us with spiritual food
in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood.
Send us now into the world in peace,
and grant us strength and courage
to love and serve you
with gladness and singleness of heart;
through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

All may be seated for announcements.

Birthday; Anniversary; Milestone Prayer

Any worshipper with a birthday, anniversary, or milestone to mark is invited to come forward at this time.

Offerings are accepted to benefit outreach ministries at St. Paul's, however, no offering is necessary to come forward for prayer.
