



REPORT OF GIVING 2024-25

Singing City is a socially conscious vocal movement that educates, motivates, and empowers communities by bringing people together to lift the human spirit through the artistry of choral music.

Dear Friends.

"Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." – Margaret Mead

My grandfather, the Rev. A. Herbert Haslam, was, by all accounts, a forward-thinking individual. In 1946, he made the decision to leave his ministry in Toledo, Ohio, and return to Philadelphia with a clear purpose:

"A Baptist minister who for eight years has championed the cause of interracial harmony in Toledo, decided yesterday to take a unique step in fostering the Brotherhood of Man. Dr. A. Herbert Haslam resigned his position at Ashland Avenue Baptist Church to become the first administrator and minister of a new congregation in Philadelphia – Fellowship Church. His parishioners will be Jews and Christians of all races." Elsie M'Kay, The Blade, Toledo, Ohio, Monday, December 30, 1046

Admitting the venture has no precedent in the United States and perhaps the world, he said it was an outgrowth of the belief that "religious people have a heavy responsibility toward creating a community where prejudices and discrimination give way to opportunity and equal rights for all." This was the foundation upon which the Fellowship House Choir was born. Later renamed Singing City, the choir would go on to champion the vision of a world grounded in justice, non-violence, and racial and religious harmony. This remains an ambitious, important task—and one that we must continue to fight for.

The work we do here at Singing City is both artistically driven and socially imperative. I often think about the creative process and what compels people to engage in acts of creation. There's the image of the solitary writer or painter, creating in peace and quiet, bringing inspiration to life. But then there's the collective—community nurtured through the act of artmaking. That's who we are at Singing City. We are a community of individuals, each of us contributing our love of choral music, our talents, time, energy, and passion to create something greater than ourselves.

We are here to craft something beautiful, but also meaningful—to lift one another up, whether as singers or audience members. We are fortunate to have an artistic director who continually inspires and challenges us with his vision of choral music as a catalyst for social change.

Every organization goes through moments of self-reflection, questioning its core values and their relevance in an ever-changing world. As we face the daily challenges—learning new music, meeting our financial obligations, and building community through song—we must ensure that we never lose sight of the bigger picture. My work at Singing City has been incredibly gratifying, in spite of those challenges. I've had the privilege of working alongside incredible people, including Jeff Brillhart and Rollo Dilworth, who have been invaluable partners in this journey.

As I retire from my role as Singing City's Executive Director, I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to our choir and board members who volunteer countless hours, lending their expertise to guide the organization and helping to

ensure that Singing City's mission remains alive and well, now and into the future. Rehearsal nights are sacred. It has been my privilege to do my best to support Singing City and its commitment to a more just and joyful society.

I am deeply grateful to every one of you for providing me with that opportunity and for the trust you have bestowed in us and our work. I look forward to continuing as a choir member and volunteer and hope to see you in the coming seasons.

Singing City welcomes Michael J. Bolton as our new Executive Director. You will be hearing from him about all that is coming up in 2025-26 and beyond. Please welcome him to the Singing City family!

Teen Voices of the City Ensemble (T-VOCE)



Singing City is committed to providing choral music education to youth in Philadelphia. T-VOCE is a free, non-auditioned choral music program open to teens aged 13-19. T-VOCE builds community with youth from all cultural and economic backgrounds through a unique program of music education and choral performance that seeks to realize each teen's potential, while creating a model of artistic excellence and diversity that enriches the community.

Led by director Dr. Whitney Covalle, the students come from across the city and rehearse each Saturday from 10-12 at Friends Center in downtown Philadelphia. The program is made available at no cost to students or their families. They perform on their own or in conjunction with Singing City's

adult choir and in collaboration with other arts ensembles. Students learn repertoire from all styles and periods and absorb musical concepts, skills, and theory by singing, listening, and analysis. Guest clinicians, including composers, conductors, and professional singers, enhance the educational program. Students receive private voice lessons and mentoring from ArtSmart in addition to weekly group rehearsals.

For the second time, T-VOCE hosted an all-day workshop for Philadelphia teens in March 2025. Clinicians included Suzzette Ortiz, Norma Jean Hughes, Rollo Dilworth, and Whitney Covalle. "Love City Sings" is an inclusive, participatory high school festival where singers from across the city come together to make music. Unlike typical high school choral festivals where singers prepare music in advance, participants form a "UNITY CHOIR" that day and learn music in the aural-oral tradition together in real time from a variety of clinicians. This year's workshop was open to all singers in grades 7-12 from the School District of Philadelphia, with an emphasis on supporting emerging vocal music programs. 200 students from 8 different schools in Philadelphia participated.

In 2024-25, T-VOCE was a collaboration of Singing City, Opera Philadelphia, and ArtSmart. Beginning with the 2025-26 season, T-VOCE will be under the direction of Singing City, with mentoring from ArtSmart.
