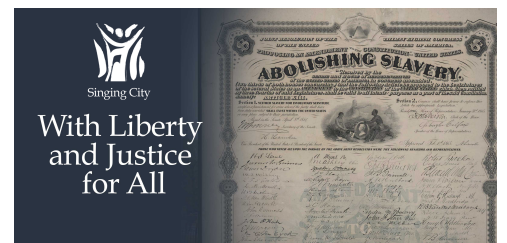
With Liberty and Justice for All
