Among the many Kelly/Strul Scholars gaining real-world experience this summer, senior Blandine Youte spent hers in Miami as an Audit Start Intern at PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC).

Her days were filled with meaningful work contributing to internal PwC initiatives, sharpening her technical and professional skills through weekly trainings, and teaming up with fellow interns on a project that put their learning into practice. Blandine's favorite memory from the program was the kickoff trip to Disney World, where she formed friendships with interns from around the world.

"The Kelly/Strul Emerging Scholars Program connected me with the Career Center and a former Kelly/Strul Scholar who had done the same internship. Their guidance, especially during interview prep, made me feel confident every step of the way."

On campus, Blandine leads Florida Atlantic's chapter of the National Association of Black Accountants as president, with plans to organize a conference linking Florida Atlantic students to career opportunities and industry connections. After graduation, she plans to further develop her skills by securing another internship with PwC and then earning her Certified Public Accountant license while working toward her master's degree, proudly representing the Kelly/Strul Emerging Scholars Program every step of the way.



BEYOND THE SYLLABUS: Building Skills for Life

The first semester of college can be both exciting and overwhelming as students are learning how to balance independence with new responsibilities. For many Kelly/Strul Scholars, these first months carry even more weight. As first-generation college students, they are navigating an entirely new world, from understanding university systems to building a community of support.

To help scholars make a smooth transition to college life, the Kelly/Strul Emerging Scholars Program offers a required Student Life Skills (SLS) course during their first year. Each week, students meet to discuss real-life topics, such as networking, time management, and public speaking, while learning to make the most of campus resources.

"I've seen tremendous growth in students' confidence since the start of the year," said Ryan Williams, an SLS instructor and Kelly/Strul Emerging Scholars Program coordinator. "Academically, they've always been strong. But socially, some of the quietest students are now leading organizations and finding their voices. The course has made a real difference."

Through the SLS course and our supportive wraparound services, Kelly/Strul Scholars are gaining more than academic success; they are developing the skills and confidence to thrive in every part of college life.
