



THE FOUNDER'S PHILOSOPHY

The H.O.P.E. Institute (H.I) is a dynamic, grassroots, emerging non-profit organization committed to transforming the lives of the homeless Female Veterans of El Paso County through partnering and strategic planning within our community. Our program of housing, mentoring, training, counseling, and empowering our residents focuses on moving them towards a goal of self-sufficiency. We will provide the tools required to rebuild their lives and achieve spiritual, social, physical, mental, emotional, and financial restoration through **Healing, Optimizing, Perfecting, and Empowering.**

Currently, there are **2.1 million** Female Veterans in this great country we live in. While the overall veteran population is projected to decline, Female Veterans are the fastest-growing demographic and are expected to represent **18%** of the total veteran population by 2040. In **Texas**, which leads the nation with the largest Female Veteran population, numbers have climbed to approximately **207,522** as of 2024 and are projected to reach over **222,000** by 2029.

H.I has to narrow the scope when addressing a need of this magnitude. We are physically located 10 minutes from **FT Bliss, Texas**, a cornerstone of the Army's footprint. In 2024, women made up **16.0%** of the active-duty Army, while the national average across all military services reached **17.9%**. Women continue to serve in record numbers; they are now nearly one-fifth of our active force and climbing! Given these statistics, exacerbated by traumatic experiences such as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), and Military Sexual Trauma (MST), we can safely presuppose the continued need for specialized support for our Female Servicewomen.

While National Female Veteran homelessness dropped **16%** between 2023 and 2024 to approximately **3,329** individuals on a given night, they remain more likely than their male counterparts to experience housing instability. The time to take radical action is now!

Our housing and supportive services program offers housing, subsistence, transportation, clothing, training, counseling, and a tailored educational curriculum in a stable environment for Female Veterans who need a "hand up" while working to develop the skills necessary to assimilate, reintegrate, and live independently. The residents must be committed to a program with the goal of self-sustainability.

Our Concept of Operation is as follows:

Core Program(s)/Service(s): Until an individual's basic needs are met, the transition to sustainable independence cannot begin. Therefore, the primary focus of our program is to ensure basic needs (housing, food, clothing, and transportation) are met in a safe environment these ladies would be proud to call home.

Secondly, the foundation of our ancillary services is a four-pillar, progress-based, and goal oriented approach to self-sufficiency. Those four pillars represent life skills training that address:

1. **Self-Awareness**
2. **Financial Management**
3. **Employment Sustainability**
4. **Housing Management**

Once a Veteran completes the program, H.I functions as a **Post Transition Support Center (PTSC)** to provide supportive services as needed following the Veteran's transition into permanent housing. The PTSC will assist or refer each woman in practical areas such as securing home furnishings, working with her landlord, and accessing community resources. Most importantly, the PTSC provides encouraging advocacy for each Veteran while settling into her new home and new life. An impenetrable lifelong bond will develop between the residents and Staff of H.I. We will be a lifelong support network for these ladies...we're their family!

We recognize that poverty is a multifaceted problem that requires a multifaceted response. We also understand that eradicating homelessness and poverty is a major undertaking and requires a methodically thought-out plan of action. While our long-term plan is to serve every Female Veteran in need, we understand it takes time, effort, resources, and a nationwide initiative. We will begin our campaign to eradicate homelessness amongst Female Veterans in El Paso County. No Female Veteran will be left behind...Ever! H.I is committed to rebuilding communities and strengthening lives.

Primary National Data Sources

- **U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA):** Specifically the **National Center for Veterans Analysis and Statistics (NCVAS)** and **VA News** reports from 2024 and 2025. These provided the projections for the total female veteran population (2.1 million) and active-duty representation.
- **U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD):** Data regarding the **16% drop** in female veteran homelessness and the **23% decrease** in unsheltered numbers came from the **2024 Point-in-Time (PIT) Count** results.
- **U.S. Census Bureau:** Statistics on poverty rates and general veteran demographics were pulled from the **2024 Official Poverty Measure** and the **2024 American Community Survey (ACS)** updates.

Texas-Specific Data Sources

- **Texas Workforce Investment Council:** The "**Veterans in Texas: A Demographic Study (2024 Update)**" provided the specific breakdown of female veterans by service era, such as the 17.4% figure for Gulf War Era II veterans.
- **Texas Veterans Commission (TVC):** Information regarding Texas having the largest veteran population (~1.42 million to 1.54 million) and the specific needs of minoritized veteran subgroups was sourced from the **2024 TVC Needs Assessment** and 2025 population projections.
