Please review the following guidelines on what to wear for class to include appropriate hairstyles.

No jewelry should be worn during class as it can be a safety hazard. Please remove all jewelry prior to entering the studio.

Skin tone or flesh color tights can be worn in jazz class.

Skin tone or flesh color tights and shoes can be worn in ballet classes. Sansha and Misty Copeland both sell these items.

Braided hair should be pulled up and away from face


Jazz and Tap classes - close fitting clothes







Tap Shoes for Tap I and above (Lace Up)



Bun (neatly styled) if hair is past shoulders Otherwise pulled back into a ponytail

Braided hair should be pulled up and away from face

Hip Hop classes – loose or close fitting clothes, but not oversized









Class use only sneakers





Preferred hair style/bun is acceptable as well Hair should always be pulled up and away from the face

Acro classes - close fitting clothes














that keeps hair up and away from face.

Braids should be pulled up and back


Musical Theater classes – comfortable but not oversized clothing
