POOJA, SIR (Feature)

When two boys are kidnapped in a border town in Nepal, Detective Inspector Pooja is sent from Kathmandu to solve the case. But when she arrives, the brewing political unrest and violent protests throw her off course, and she is forced to seek help from Mamata, a local Madhesi policewoman. By putting aside systemic discrimination and pushing through everyday misogyny, the women solve the case - but at what personal cost? [2025, Nepal/ US, 115 min, Rated: NR]

SAUNA follows Johan, a young gay man, through his experiences with love and sex. For Johan, the city is like a boundless paradise of opportunities with bars, parties, and one-night stands, but it is only when he meets transgender William that he experiences love up close. SALLY! (Documentary)

Sally Gearhart was a charismatic radical lesbian activist, author, and academic who spearheaded the 1970s and 80s lesbian feminist movement yet has been largely forgotten. But the film *SALLY* is not just a straightforward biography of this "hidden figure" deserving more recognition. It also shows the symbiotic relationship between spokeswomen like Sally and movements for social change, which are necessarily collective. And it highlights Sally's captivating iconoclasm and contradictions: *SALLY* is both a wild lesbian safari and a timely and deeply moving meditation on the tensions inherent in revolutionary movements: ideological principles versus human realities, separatism versus mainstreaming, and throwing down the gauntlet versus reaching across the aisle. Ultimately, Sally and compatriots' key contributions can help guide our current, urgent battles for social justice.

THE TRUE STORY OF TAMARA DE LEMPICKA AND THE ART OF SURVIVAL

A visually stunning and sweeping feature documentary that traces the life and survival of the renowned painter through her powerful paintings – from her rise to international stardom in 1920s Paris, to her move to the United States in 1940, fleeing the rise of fascism, and her revival in the current art market. Tamara de Lempicka was the preeminent Art Deco painter, known for her high-gloss sensual nudes and portraits of high society during the Jazz Age. She was marginalized and gained notoriety for her romantic liaisons with her models and her indulgent, decadent lifestyle, but she was so much more. [2025, US, 96 min, Rated: NR]

IT'S DOROTHY (Documentary)

Since Dorothy Gale started her epic journey down the Yellow Brick Road over a century ago in *THE WONDERFUL WIZARD OF OZ*, she's become a celebrity, a brand, and a beacon for marginalized voices across our culture. *IT'S DOROTHY!* brings to life her timeless adventures in Oz through those who've played her, from Judy Garland to Nichelle Lewis (*THE WIZ*), and the cultural icons (John Waters, Lena Waithe, Rufus Wainwright) who she's inspired to hope and to dream. With a magical remix of archival and cinematic art, director Jeffrey McHale follows up his *SHOWGIRLS* documentary with another insightful look at a queer cultural touchstone.

PETER HUJAR'S DAY (Feature)

Ira Sachs's new film, *Peter Hujar's Day*, stars Ben Wishaw and Rebecca Hall in a richly cinematic rendering of a conversation recorded in 1974 between photographer Peter Hujar and writer Linda Rosenkrantz. Their talk that day focused on a single 24 hours in the life of Hujar, the brilliant and famously uncompromising artist who was one of the most important figures in downtown New York's legendary cultural scene of the 70s and 80s. Set entirely in Linda's Manhattan apartment, the film freely and imaginatively recreates that long-ago afternoon and the wonderfully discursive exchange between these two singular individuals. As the photographer vividly describes interactions with leading cultural figures of the day, including Allen Ginsberg and Susan Sontag, as well the challenges of living on limited financial resources in 70s New York, *Peter Hujar's Day* transforms unexpectedly into a Bloomsday-like rumination on both an artist's life and time itself.
