### Melt in Your Mouth Toffee


### **Ingredients**

1 lb Butter1 C Sugar1 C Packed Brown Sugar1 C Chopped Walnuts2 C Chocolate Chips

### **Directions**

In a heavy saucepan, combine butter and sugars. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until mixture boils. Boil to brittle stage, 300 degrees without stirring. Remove from heat.

Pour nuts and chocolate into a 9x13 dish. Pour hot mixture over the nuts and chocolate. Let the mixture cool and break into pieces before serving
