#### **Honey-Almond Granola with Yogurt & Fresh Berries**

3 c rolled oats

1 c shelled raw pumpkin seeds

1 c shelled raw sunflower seeds

1c raw almonds

1/2 c lightly packed brown sugar

3/4 c honey

1/2 c extra virgin olive oil

1 teaspoon salt

1 c dried sour cherries or other dried fruits

Yogurt for serving

#### Fresh berries for serving

- 1. Preheat oven to 300 and spray a baking sheet with nonstick cooking spray
- 2. In a large bowl, combine the oats, pumpkin seeds, sunflower seeds, almonds and brown sugar
- 3. In a large glass measuring cup, combine the honey, oil, and salt. Microwave for 30 sec, stir and then pour wet ingredients over the oat mixture. Stir until everything is coated. Spread the granola out on the prepared baking sheet and bake for 45 min, stirring every 15 min or until the granola is golden.
- 4. While the granola is baking, place a piece of parchment paper on a clean baking sheet and set aside.
- 5. Remove the granola from the oven and immediately scrape it onto the parchment paper lined sheet. Spread it out and let it cool. It will be very sticky when it first comes out of the oven, but will crisp up as it cools.
- 6. When the granola is completely cool, crumble into small chunks with your hands, then mix in the cherries. Serve with the yogurt and fresh berries. Store in an airtight container up to 10 days.
