
WND Synod Convention






McKenzie Co Fair Parade



A Story to Celebrate

One hundred years ago, April 8, 1923, four American Lutheran missionaries landed in Douala, Cameroon, West Africa, to begin ministries in what is now Cameroon and Central African Republic. Adolphus and Anna Marie Gunderson from Iowa, and Anne Olsen and Olette Berntsen were deaconesses from Brooklyn, New York.



For 26 days they trekked by foot into the interior. After some uncertainty, they settled in Mboula, northern Cameroon, learned the local language, opened schools, worked in healthcare, and shared the Gospel. Within the decade they were joined by Africans who rejoiced in being baptized, celebrated the faith and became missionaries in the region. They delivered the Good News of Christ across the region, from Abba to Rey Bouba, from Baboua to Balkossa. Their efforts were successful, and out of their work two Lutheran churches were born: The Evangelical Lutheran Churches of Cameroon and of Central African Republic. This summer, we will gather to celebrate this incredible journey and look to the future of companion engagement. Church leaders from Cameroon and CAR will be joined by ELCA and ELCIC leaders. Together we will celebrate, renew and inspire

Recipe of the Month Biscuits and Gravy



Ingredients 1 (16 ounce) can refrigerated jumbo buttermilk biscuits

1 (9.6 ounce) package Jimmy Dean® Original Hearty Pork Sausage Crumbles

1/4 cup flour

2 ½ cups milk

salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Directions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Arrange

biscuits 1 to 2 inches apart on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake in

the preheated oven until golden brown, about 13 to 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, cook sausage in a large skillet over medium heat until thoroughly heated, stirring frequently, about 5 to 6

minutes.


Stir in flour until well combined. Gradually add milk, stirring continuously

until the gravy thickens and comes to a boil.

Reduce heat to

medium-low; simmer and stir for 2 more minutes. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

Split biscuits in half. Place 2 halves on each of 8 plates; top with about 1/3 cup gravy.
