EVERYONE is invited to participate in any of the above meetings ~ ALL are welcome!!








If you ever happen to stop by FLC on a Monday afternoon you will be sure to hear some good natured chatter, find a pot of coffee on and some goodies on the table. After an hour or so of busy, productive work, the quilting ladies relax for refreshments. The ladies have been meeting weekly for well, pretty much forever!

This faithful crew of ladies have turned out hundreds of quilts for those in need, sending them off to world relief and keeping some back to offer consolation for local people going through disastrous times. In 1987 they also began making cherished quilts for our graduating seniors. They also make keepsake quilts for baptisms, send several to Upper Missouri Bible Camp for their annual benefit auction and most recently, quilts for the people in a local addiction center.

Up until we built our addition in 2012, the magic happened in the church basement, using every nook & cranny to store fabric, batting, sewing machines & supplies, pulling out & setting up tables each week. The ladies were able to help design their dream quilting area in the new addition which is the envy of the area. Many have heard about it and have come down to see it and get ideas.

Their creative work and dedication is so inspiring! You will most likely find them taking fabric home and cutting or sewing squares or securing backing to bring back the next Monday.

Part of the beauty of the quilting group is that you don't need to make a big commitment or be an advanced seamstress. If you can tie a knot, there is a spot for you! They welcome anyone to stop by and join in the projects. There is no weekly commitment, come when you can. Although you may not want to miss once you start!

If you happen to have a stash of fabric or bed sheet you aren't using, they are always happy to take it off your hands. Monetary donation is also welcome as they buy all their batting & thread.

Pumpkin Dump Cake

30 oz 100% Pumpkin 12 oz evaporated milk 3 eggs

1 c sugar
3 tsp cinnamon
1 box yellow cake mix

3/4 c melted butter1 c chopped pecans

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Grease 9x13 baking dish, set aside
- In large bowl, combine pumpkin, evaporated milk, eggs, sugar and cinnamon
- Mix until blended
- Pour, spread mixture into prepared baking dish
- Evenly sprinkle cake mix over the top of batter
- Sprinkle pecans over the cake mix
- Pour melted butter over the top of the other ingredients
- Bake 50 minutes
- Allow to cool before cutting
- Garnish with whipped topping




James "Jim" Eugene Tveter 8-20-43 ~ 2-13-21
