#### **SVdP Has Partnered with ReSupply for Donation Pick Ups**

This summer we partnered with ReSupply, a veteran run company that coordinates donation pickups with local haulers. They offer a 24–48 hour in-home pickup of household items—turning your cherished belongings into valuable resources for those in need. You can schedule a donation pickup online from our website (www. svdpsm.org) or by calling them. They will provide a cost estimate that is much lower than junk removers, an arrival window, and can break down items and carry down stairs.



We have had dozens of donation pickups and are getting rave reviews from donors who used the service.

#### Did you know?

SVdP's Safety-Net Services deliver aid and comfort to families and individ-uals in our community who are not able to climb out of crisis by them-selves — the homeless, the precariously housed, and all people living on the margins in our community.

SVdP's Safety-Net Program has two components:

1) SVdP's Peninsula Family Resource Center (PFRC) is a homelessness prevention program which provides food, grocery store gift-cards, rental/utility assistance, clothing vouchers (used at SVdP Thrift Stores), and other targeted assistance to individuals and families in need.

**2)** SVdP's Homeless Help Centers are a lifeline of support for the homeless. Lunches, clean clothing, socks/ shoes, sleeping bags, toiletries, and other survival necessities are provided to guests who visit either of our two locations in the County.
