Revenue from Retained Clients=10×5,000=\$50,000 annually

### **Total Savings:**

Total Saving s= 67,307 + 250,000 + 50,000 = **\$367,307 annually** 

#### **ROI Calculation:**

$$\frac{367,307-30,000}{300000} \times 100 = 1124\% \, ROI$$
