

## Mark 8:22-26

### Marcos 8:22-26



These past days, I reflected in the gospel of **Mark 8:22-26**, and it talked about the blind man of Bethsaida.

Interestingly, in the previous gospel of the day before, Jesus said, “**You have eyes and do not see, you have ears and do not hear,**” “**Do you still not understand?**” with this, Jesus referred to the blindness of the disciples in not understanding His presence in **the sign of bread**.

Well, the miracle of **the blind man of Bethsaida** points the way to enlightenment. What Jesus wants, through this miracle, is to make the community capable of recognizing **his presence through the sign of bread and his revelation as the suffering servant who saves his people**.

In this gospel, we see how the blind man first sees not clearly. He confuses men with trees, like the disciples who didn't understand the meaning of bread. They were the same disciples who confused Jesus with a ghost in the sea, or like "the people" who identify Jesus with figures from the past, already dead (John the Baptist, Elijah, the prophets).

Then, we see Jesus asking, “**Do you see anything?**” with this question, Jesus is trying to say something. Actually, Jesus asks in the chapters later, “**Who do the people say I am?**” so, what Mark wants, is to invite the audience to examine themselves to recognize Jesus in the sign of bread.

Likewise, Mark is demonstrating to the church that Jesus opens the eyes to the people so that they receive the light of the gospel. If we remember, in another chapter, Jesus asks **the blind Bartimaeus in Jericho**, “**What do you want me to do for you?**” and Bartimaeus says to him, “**Lord, I want to see.**” (Ch 10, Jesus, son of David, have pity on me)

Brothers and sisters, Jesus will come with his light and will show us the way to recognize Him. that's why He says “**I am the light; he who follows me doesn't walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.**”

En estos últimos días, reflexioné en el evangelio de **Marcos 8:22-26**, y hablaba del ciego de Betsaida.

Curiosamente, en el evangelio anterior del día anterior, Jesús dijo: “**Tenéis ojos y no veis, tenéis oídos y no oís,**” “**¿Todavía no entendéis?**” con esto, Jesús se refirió a la ceguera de los discípulos al no entender su presencia en **la señal del pan**.

Pues bien, el milagro del **ciego de Betsaida** señala el camino hacia la iluminación. Lo que Jesús quiere, a través de este milagro, es hacer que la comunidad sea capaz de reconocer **su presencia a través del signo del pan y su revelación como el siervo sufriente que salva a su pueblo**.

En este evangelio, vemos cómo el ciego primero no ve con claridad. Confunde a los hombres con los árboles, como los discípulos que no entendían el significado del pan. Eran los mismos discípulos que confundieron a Jesús con un fantasma en el mar, o como "la gente" que identifica a Jesús con figuras del pasado, ya muertas (Juan el Bautista, Elías, los profetas).

Entonces, vemos a Jesús preguntando: “**¿Ves algo?**” con esta pregunta, Jesús está tratando de decir algo. De hecho, Jesús pregunta en los capítulos siguientes: “**¿Quién dice la gente que soy yo?**”, por lo tanto, lo que Marcos quiere es invitar a la audiencia a examinarse a sí misma para reconocer a Jesús en la señal del pan.

Del mismo modo, Marcos está demostrando a la iglesia que Jesús abre los ojos a las personas para que reciban la luz del evangelio. Si recordamos, en otro capítulo, Jesús le pregunta **al ciego Bartimeo en Jericó**: “**¿Qué quieres que haga por tí?**” y Bartimeo le dice: “**Señor, quiero ver.**” (Cap. 10, Jesús, hijo de David, ten piedad de mí)

Hermanos y hermanas, Jesús vendrá con su luz y nos mostrará el camino para reconocerlo. por eso dice: “**Yo soy la luz; El que me sigue no anda en tinieblas, sino que tendrá la luz de la vida.**”

## *Sixth Sunday of Easter A Humble God*

The second reading from Revelation gives us a picture of the new Jerusalem as a sign of the power and majesty of God. Gleaming with precious stones, a massive high wall with twelve gates, it is illuminated not by the sun but by the glory of God. Yet the other two readings seem to describe a humble God who wishes “not to place on you any burden beyond . . . necessity” (Acts 15:28), and Jesus in the Gospel tells his disciples that “the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name . . . will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you” (John 14:26). This gentleness reminds me of an icon by the Russian monk Andrei Rublev that depicts the Trinity as three angels bowing in deference to each other. This humility may be what moved Jesus to say that “the Father is greater than I” (John 14:28). It is certainly a unique way of understanding God.

I used to think of free will as God’s way of testing our worthiness for the kingdom of heaven. But it is more likely part of that same humility, God not being forced on us. While we are given ways to know God, especially through the scriptures and the witness of those who went before us in faith, God leaves us free to believe or not, to love God or not. When the Father sent his Son Jesus to show us his love, he sent us a tiny baby, born in a stable, not a mighty warrior leading an army. When Jesus rose from the dead on Easter, he appeared not in triumph to strike down Herod and those who had put him to death, but quietly to a handful of disciples who already believed in him.

So does this mean God leaves us on our own to get through life? No, God gives us the Holy Spirit to teach and remind us of all that Jesus said. That “reminding” is an important way the Spirit helps us today. You may have spent years in religion classes or the RCIA process. When you need an answer to life’s questions, the Spirit may remind you of something you heard from a teacher or read in the scriptures. As you pray over that question, the Spirit may help you understand how the scripture applies to you. So the more you read the Bible, the more likely that the Spirit will have something of which to remind you.

## *Sexto Domingo de Pascua Un Dios humilde*

La segunda lectura del Apocalipsis nos ofrece una imagen de la nueva Jerusalén como signo del poder y la majestad de Dios. Brillando con piedras preciosas, una muralla enorme y alta con doce puertas, está iluminada no por el sol sino por la gloria de Dios. Sin embargo, las otras dos lecturas parecen describir a un Dios humilde que no quiere “imponerles más cargas que las estrictamente necesarias” (Hechos 15,28), y Jesús en el Evangelio dice a sus discípulos que “el Espíritu Santo que mi Padre les enviará en mi nombre, les enseñará todas las cosas y les recordará todo cuanto yo les he dicho” (Juan 14,26). Esta gentileza me hace acordar de un icono del monje ruso Andrei Rublev que representa a la Trinidad como tres ángeles inclinándose en deferencia el uno al otro. Esta humildad puede ser lo que impulsó a Jesús a decir que “el Padre es más que yo” (Juan 14,28). Sin duda, es una forma única de entender a Dios.


Antes pensaba en el libre albedrío como la forma que Dios prueba nuestro mérito para el reino de los cielos. Pero es más probable que sea parte de esa misma humildad, que Dios no se nos imponga. Si bien se nos dan maneras de conocer a Dios, especialmente a través de las Escrituras y el testimonio de quienes nos precedieron en la fe, Dios nos deja libres para creer o no, para amar a Dios o no. Cuando el Padre envió a su Hijo Jesús para mostrarnos su amor, nos envió a un bebé pequeño, nacido en un establo, no a un poderoso guerrero guiando un ejército. Cuando Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos en la Pascua, no apareció triunfante para derribar a Herodes y a quienes lo habían condenado a muerte, sino silenciosamente a unos cuantos discípulos que ya creían en él.

¿Esto significa que Dios nos deja solos para atravesar la vida? No. Dios nos da el Espíritu Santo para enseñarnos y recordarnos todo lo que Jesús dijo. Ese “recordatorio” es una manera importante en que el Espíritu nos ayuda hoy. Es posible que hayas pasado años en clases de religión o en el proceso de RICA. Cuando necesites una respuesta a las preguntas de la vida, el Espíritu puede recordarte algo que hayas escuchado de un maestro o leído en las Escrituras. Al orar sobre esa pregunta, el Espíritu puede ayudarte a entender cómo se aplica esa escritura a tu caso. Así que, mientras más lees la Biblia, más probable será que el Espíritu tenga algo que recordarte.
