Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Looking Good

Don't you love it when the underdog wins? When the Cardinals beat the Yankees for the championship or the Blues beat the Redwings, or the Rams beat anyone? Even when I watch a game with no St. Louis teams playing, I still like to root for the underdog. That is what I like about today's Gospel: the last will be first and the first will be last.

Some say that Jesus was referring to the Jews, God's chosen people, whom Jesus called first to be his disciples. When they rejected him, the call went out to the Gentiles, who became followers. Or perhaps in Jesus' time, he was talking about the leaders of the Jews, the scribes and Pharisees. These refused to follow Jesus, while ordinary Jews who did not feel threatened by Jesus' teaching became disciples.

In a way, you can understand why the leaders rejected Jesus. They made a nice living out of the offerings made by ordinary Jews. As long as they could decide who could enter the temple, they had a nice income flow. They were smart enough to include the poor, by asking them for smaller offerings. And who could argue with them? They worked for God. How dare Jesus say that they would be cast out, while people from the rest of the world would enter the Kingdom of God!

And how about us? Remember that the Gospel was not written for non-believers. Are we threatened by Jesus' message? Just as the scribes and Pharisees considered themselves important in God's eyes because of their office, do we consider ourselves "saved" because we call ourselves Christians? Do we respect all people, or just the ones we like? Are we generous to the poor, or just to our friends? Do we give good example to the people we work with? Do we follow our conscience or do we follow the crowd?

Entry into the Kingdom of God is not a fashion statement. We don't get there by looking good. We are invited by Jesus to be last on earth so we can be first in the Kingdom.

Vigésimo Primer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario Lucir bien


Yankees por el campeonato, o los Blues a los Red Wings, o los Rams a cualquiera? Incluso cuando veo un partido donde no juega un equipo de St. Louis, me gusta apoyar al que no es favorito. Eso es lo que me gusta del Evangelio de hoy: los últimos serán los primeros y los primeros serán los últimos.

Algunos dicen que Jesús se refería a los judíos, el pueblo elegido de Dios, a quienes llamó primero para ser sus discípulos. Cuando lo rechazaron, el llamado se extendió a los gentiles, quienes se convirtieron en seguidores. O quizás, en tiempos de Jesús, se refería a los líderes judíos, los escribas y fariseos. Estos se negaron a seguir a Jesús, mientras que los judíos comunes que no se sentían amenazados por sus enseñanzas se convirtieron en discípulos.

En cierto modo, se puede entender por qué los líderes rechazaron a Jesús. Se ganaban bien la vida con las ofrendas de los judíos comunes. Mientras podían decidir quién entraba al templo, tenían un buen flujo de ingresos. Fueron lo suficientemente inteligentes como para incluir a los pobres, pidiéndoles ofrendas más pequeñas. ¿Y quién podía discutir con ellos? Trabajaban para Dios. ¡Cómo se atrevía Jesús a decir que serían expulsados, mientras que personas del resto del mundo entrarían en el Reino de Dios!

¿Y nosotros? ¿Nos sentimos amenazados por el mensaje de Jesús? Así como los escribas y fariseos se consideraban importantes a los ojos de Dios por su oficio, ¿nos consideramos "salvos" porque nos llamamos cristianos? ¿Respetamos a todos o solo a los que nos caen bien? ¿Somos generosos con los pobres o solo con nuestros amigos? ¿Damos buen ejemplo a quienes trabajan con nosotros? ¿Seguimos nuestra conciencia o seguimos a la multitud?

Entrar en el Reino de Dios no es una moda. No llegamos allí por lucir bien. Jesús nos invita a ser los últimos en la tierra para poder ser los primeros en el Reino.



A REFLECTION FROM....*Rev. Jesus Oliveros***Lord, save me**

The other day in Mass, we reflected on the Gospel of Mt 14:22-36 in which Jesus tried to walk on the water but he began to sink.

To me, this Gospel passage is multi-layered. We learn not only about Jesus' divine power, but also about the importance of calling out to God. We learn of the interplay between faith and doubt, as well as the compassionate presence of God among His people.

Today's Gospel passage presents Peter in all his fragility: "He was overcome with fear, and he began to sink, and he cried out..." In truth, while the Gospel never glosses over the defects of this beloved apostle, these verses do not fail to highlight Peter's passionate courage and the simplicity with which he recognizes his helplessness. Surely, sometime later, while remembering Jesus' hand holding his in the water, Peter might have recited this line from Psalm 18(17): "**He reached down from on high and took hold of me; he drew me out of the mighty waters.**"

In asking to walk on water, Peter was not seeking power like that of Jesus, but rather he simply wanted to accompany and follow Him despite the obvious risk. We should take note of Peter's determination because, after all, we too may collapse when we face difficult situations.

Brothers and sisters, the image that dominates in this Gospel passage is the hand of Jesus reaching out to the panicking Peter. Certainly, Christians have been called throughout the ages to extend the merciful hand of Jesus to sustain, to accompany, to care for others in His Name. However, only by recognizing our fragilities and our inabilities can we fulfill this mission...

Indeed, "Lord, save me" is the sincere cry of every Christian who needs Jesus's hand to lift them up to live and stand strong. In response, Jesus will reassure us by saying, "Take courage. . .do not be afraid."

A REFLECTION FROM....*Rev. Jesus Oliveros***Señor, sálvame**

El otro día en la Misa, reflexionamos sobre el Evangelio de Mt 14,22 -36 en el que Jesús intentó caminar sobre el agua pero comenzó a hundirse.

Para mí, este pasaje del Evangelio tiene varias capas. Aprendemos no solo sobre el poder divino de Jesús, sino también sobre la importancia de llamar a Dios. Aprendemos de la interacción entre la fe y la duda, así como de la presencia compasiva de Dios entre su pueblo.

El pasaje evangélico de hoy presenta a Pedro en toda su fragilidad: "Se apoderó del miedo, y comenzó a hundirse, y gritó..." En verdad, aunque el Evangelio nunca pasa por alto los defectos de este amado apóstol, estos versículos no dejan de resaltar el coraje apasionado de Pedro y la sencillez con la que reconoce su impotencia. Seguramente, algún tiempo después, mientras recordaba la mano de Jesús sosteniendo la suya en el agua, Pedro podría haber recitado esta línea del Salmo 18 (17): "**Bajó de lo alto y me agarró; me sacó de las aguas impetuosas.**"

Al pedir caminar sobre el agua, Pedro no buscaba el poder como el de Jesús, sino que simplemente quería acompañarlo y seguirlo a pesar del riesgo evidente. Debemos tomar nota de la determinación de Pedro porque, después de todo, también nosotros podemos colapsar cuando enfrentamos situaciones difíciles.

Hermanos y hermanas, la imagen que domina en este pasaje del Evangelio es la mano de Jesús que se acerca al aterrorizado Pedro. Ciertamente, los cristianos han sido llamados a lo largo de los siglos a extender la mano misericordiosa de Jesús para sostener, acompañar, cuidar a los demás en Su Nombre. Sin embargo, solo reconociendo nuestras fragilidades e incapacidades podemos cumplir esta misión...

De hecho, "Señor, sálvame" es el grito sincero de todo cristiano que necesita la mano de Jesús para levantarla para vivir y mantenerse fuerte. En respuesta, Jesús nos tranquilizará diciendo: "Ánimo. . . no tengas miedo".
