Save this guide to know exactly what's biting, when to go, and where to fish every month of the year!

JANUARY - Winter Steelhead Season

WHAT'S BITING

HOT: Steelhead, Whitefish ✓ GOOD: Sturgeon, Burbot

SLOW: Bass (dormant), Trout (deep & slow)

WHERE TO GO

Steelhead: Yakima River Delta, Snake River (Ice Harbor Dam)

Whitefish: Columbia River below Priest Rapids

Sturgeon: Deep holes in Columbia River

BEST TECHNIQUES

• Steelhead: Drift fishing with cured roe, jigs under float

• Whitefish: Small flies or maggots near bottom

• **Weather Tip:** Fish warmest part of day (11am-3pm)

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 38-42°F | Weather: Cold, possible snow

Best Days: After 2-3 days of stable weather

THE SPECIAL NOTES



Check steelhead regulations - selective gear rules apply

Dress in layers - mornings are freezing!

FEBRUARY - Late Winter Transition

WHAT'S BITING

HOT: Steelhead (peak season!)

✓ GOOD: Whitefish, Sturgeon

IMPROVING: Walleye (pre-spawn staging)

WHERE TO GO

Steelhead: Ringold Springs, Snake River confluences

@ Walleye: Columbia River deeper channels

Try ice fishing at local ponds (if frozen)

BEST TECHNIQUES

• Steelhead: Pink worms, bobber and jig

Walleye: Slow jigging with minnows

• Sturgeon: Smelt or squid on bottom

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 38-44°F | Weather: Cold but improving

Best Days: Overcast with light rain

THE SPECIAL NOTES

Local steelhead derbies often scheduled

MARCH - Spring Awakening

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Steelhead, Rainbow Trout (stocked)

✓ GOOD: Walleye, Bass (waking up)

IMPROVING: Channel Catfish

WHERE TO GO

Trout: Columbia Park Pond (freshly stocked!)

Steelhead: Snake & Yakima confluences

@ Bass: Shallow coves with sun exposure

BEST TECHNIQUES

• Trout: PowerBait or worms under bobber

• Bass: Slow-moving jigs in 5-10 feet

• Walleye: Nightcrawler harness, slow troll

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 42-48°F | Weather: Variable, windy Best Days: Warm afternoons after cold fronts

T SPECIAL NOTES

Rainbow trout stocking begins at local ponds

Get licenses before April 1st renewal!

🧰 APRIL - Prime Spring Fishing

WHAT'S BITING

+ HOT: Bass (pre-spawn), Trout, Walleye

✓ GOOD: Crappie, Bluegill, Catfish

STARTING: Spring Chinook

WHERE TO GO

@ Bass: Bateman Island, Yakima Delta backwaters

Trout: Howard Amon Park, stocked ponds

Walleye: Hanford Reach, McNary Pool

BEST TECHNIQUES

• Bass: Spinnerbaits, plastic worms near cover

• Trout: Rooster tail spinners, flies

• Walleye: Bottom bouncers with worms

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 48-55°F | Weather: Warming, occasional rain

Best Days: Stable weather patterns

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Bass (spawning), Crappie, Walleye

✓ GOOD: Channel Catfish, Spring Chinook

WHERE TO GO

Bass: Any shallow bay with cover

Crappie: Marina docks, submerged treesChinook: Columbia River main channel

A BEST TECHNIQUES

• Bass: Topwater early, soft plastics midday

Crappie: Small jigs under docks

• Catfish: Nightcrawlers or stink bait at night

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 55-65°F | Weather: Beautiful spring days

Best Days: Early morning and evening

T SPECIAL NOTES

JUNE - Early Summer Variety

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Smallmouth Bass, Walleye, Catfish✓ GOOD: Chinook Salmon, Sturgeon

MATERIAL STATE OF STREET AND SERVICE STATE OF STREET STRE

WHERE TO GO

Smallmouth: Snake River rocky points
Walleye: Columbia River current breaks
Family: Wade Park, Two Rivers Park

BEST TECHNIQUES

Smallmouth: Tube jigs, crawfish patternsWalleye: Worm harness, deep diving cranks

• Catfish: Fish at night with cut bait

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 62-70°F | Weather: Warming, longer days

Best Days: Overcast or early/late

SPECIAL NOTES

FREE FISHING WEEKEND (First weekend)

School's out - great camping/fishing combos

River flows increasing from snowmelt

JULY - Hot Summer Patterns

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Walleye (night), Catfish, Summer Chinook

✓ GOOD: Bass (deep), Sturgeon

SLOW: Trout (too warm in shallows)

WHERE TO GO

@ Walleye: McNary Dam area (night fishing)

© Chinook: Vernita Bridge to Priest Rapids

@ Catfish: Any river channel or pond

BEST TECHNIQUES

• Fish early (5-8am) or late (7-10pm)

• Go deeper: Fish move to cooler water

• Night fishing: Excellent for walleye & catfish

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 70-78°F | Weather: Hot & dry

Best Days: Cloudy days or nights

T SPECIAL NOTES

* Start EARLY to beat heat

Bring extra water & sun protection

Some of year's best night fishing

AUGUST - Late Summer/Pre-Fall

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Fall Chinook (starting!), Catfish
✓ GOOD: Walleye, Bass (deep water)

IMPROVING: Steelhead (early ones arriving)

WHERE TO GO

© Chinook: Hanford Reach, Columbia Point

® Bass: Deep structure, main lake points

@ Catfish: Yakima Delta, warm water discharge areas

BEST TECHNIQUES

Chinook: Kwikfish, spinners, cured roe
Bass: Deep diving crankbaits, drop shot
Walleye: Nightcrawlers in 20-30 feet

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 72-80°F | Weather: Hot days, warm nights

Best Days: Early morning essential

T SPECIAL NOTES

Fall Chinook run building Salmon derbies starting

SEPTEMBER - Fall Transition

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Fall Chinook (peak!), Coho Salmon
✓ GOOD: Bass (feeding up), Walleye

6 EXCELLENT: Steelhead arriving

WHERE TO GO

Salmon: Yakima River mouth, Ringold

® Bass: Shallow flats in mornings

@ Steelhead: Snake River, Yakima confluence

🞣 BEST TECHNIQUES

• Salmon: Twitching jigs, cured roe

Bass: Topwater at dawn, reaction baitsWalleye: Blade baits, jigging spoons

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 65-72°F | Weather: Cooling, stable

Best Days: Consistent weather patterns

T SPECIAL NOTES

Salmon fishing reaches peak

OCTOBER - Prime Fall Fishing

WHAT'S BITING

+ HOT: Steelhead, Fall Chinook, Coho

✓ GOOD: Bass, Walleye, Trout (active again)

MATERIAL STATE OF STREET AND SET OF STREET STREETMET STREET S

WHERE TO GO

@ Steelhead: Ice Harbor Dam, Yakima mouth

@ Trout: Stocked ponds get fall plants

Bass: Following shad schools

BEST TECHNIQUES

• Steelhead: Float fishing, side drifting

• Trout: PowerBait, kastmasters

• Bass: Lipless cranks, spinnerbaits

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 55-65°F | Weather: Crisp, beautiful fall days

Best Days: Stable pressure systems

SPECIAL NOTES

Many tournaments and derbies

Possibly the best month overall!

NOVEMBER - Late Fall Opportunities

WHAT'S BITING

★ HOT: Steelhead (increasing daily!)

✓ GOOD: Whitefish, Late Chinook

SLOWING: Bass, Walleye (getting sluggish)

WHERE TO GO

Steelhead: Snake River system
Whitefish: Columbia below dams

Trout: Deep holes in lakes

BEST TECHNIQUES

Steelhead: Bobber and jig, bead fishingWhitefish: Small jigs tipped with maggots

• Trout: Slow presentations, live bait

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 45-55°F | Weather: Cool, possible frost

Best Days: Warmer afternoons

T SPECIAL NOTES

🦃 Thanksgiving week can be excellent

Layer up - weather changes quickly

DECEMBER - Winter Steelhead Begin

WHAT'S BITING

HOT: Steelhead (winter run starting)

✓ GOOD: Whitefish, Sturgeon

\$\mathcal{L}\text{2}\ SLOW: Most warmwater species dormant

WHERE TO GO

Whitefish: Below any dam

Sturgeon: Deep Columbia holes

BEST TECHNIQUES

- Steelhead: Drift fishing, float and jig
- Slow everything down in cold water
- Fish midday when slightly warmer

CONDITIONS

Water Temp: 38-45°F | Weather: Cold, short days

Best Days: After warming trends

T SPECIAL NOTES

🎁 Fishing gear makes great holiday gifts!

Christmas break = steelhead time

* Check ice conditions on ponds

- **WALLEYE:** Hanford Reach, McNary Pool, Dam areas
- 🍣 SALMON/STEELHEAD: Yakima mouth, Ringold, Ice Harbor
- PANFISH: Two Rivers Park, Wade Park, Marina docks
- ** CATFISH: Yakima Delta, warm water outlets, river channels

JANUARY: Steelhead Derby (Snake River)

MARCH: Youth Fishing Day (Columbia Park)

APRIL: Trout Derby (Various ponds)

JUNE: FREE FISHING WEEKEND (1st weekend)

SEPTEMBER: Fall Chinook Derby

OCTOBER: Walleye Tournament (Columbia River)

PRO TIPS BY SEASON

🌸 SPRING (Mar-May)

- ✓ Fish are shallow and aggressive
- ✓ Target warming areas in afternoon
- ✓ Match the hatch with local insects

★ SUMMER (Jun-Aug)

- ✓ Fish early and late or at night
- ✓ Go deep during midday heat
- ✓ Night fishing can be magical

FALL (Sep-Nov)

- ✓ Best overall fishing of the year
- ✓ Fish feed heavily before winter
- ✓ Follow the baitfish schools

WINTER (Dec-Feb)

- ✓ Steelhead make it worthwhile
- ✓ Fish the warmest part of day
- ✓ Slow presentations are key
