BOIGRAPHY OF MR. PRINCE CHARLES WHYTE

Rev. Prince Charles Kweku Whyte was born in Ghana on 12th July 1967 to Mr. Daniel Kwame Whyte of Otuam in the Central Region and Madam Christiana Afua Agbley of Peki-Dzake in the Volta Region, both of blessed memory. He received his primary and middle school education in Peki-Dzake in the Volta Region. Prince Charles was the second son among his mother's eight children. He was gifted with his hands and he later learned photography and worked as a professional photographer in Kaneshie and Bubuashie in Ghana.

Prince Charles was a devoted member of Alive Chapel International (A.C.I.) and later attended the Alive School of Ministry, where he was ordained as a Reverend Minister in 1998. Following his ordination, he established his own fellowship at the Roxy Cinema in Adabraka, Accra, before he got the opportunity to travel to the United States.

Whilst here, Mr. Prince Charles joined the ICGC Liberty Temple, Orange, New Jersey in 2010 where he actively served on the media team as a sound engineer. A position he was dedicated and passionate about.

Prince Charles started his career with the Hilton Hotel in Short Hills New Jersey as an overnight Steward. He was passionate and extremely hardworking, so within three months on the job, he was promoted to a Supervisor, a position he held until 2023.

Prince Charles met and married the love of his life but unfortunately the marriage didn't last and ended in divorce. He was blessed with two children Felicia Whyte Commey and Godsway Whyte and three grandchildren.

We are admonished in Psalm 90:12 "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom". Prince went to sleep on this night in April with hopes of waking up the next morning but passed on peacefully in his sleep in the early hours of April 7th 2026.

Prince will be remembered for his jovial, friendly, easy going and warm-hearted nature, which endeared him to many.

Prince will be sorely missed by his children, surviving siblings, relatives, friends and church family.

Rest well Prince! You are deeply missed!



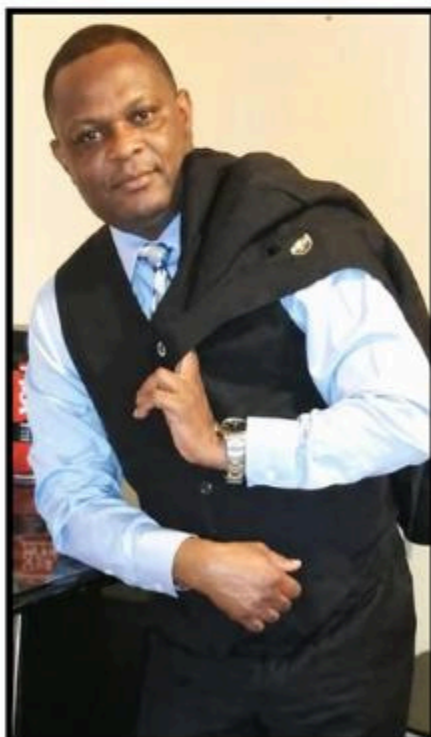
TRIBUTE FROM THE HILTON HOTEL, SHORTHILLS N.J
