

Welcome to the 2026 Festival

It is always a great pleasure to devise a programme for our discerning audience in Chipping Campden and the 2026 line up features music from across the ages performed by some of the world's finest artists.

Star saxophonist and broadcaster Jess Gillam will make her Festival debut performing both with her own ground-breaking Ensemble and in concerto with our Festival Academy Orchestra. Other debutants include pianist Jeneba Kanneh-Mason with a beautiful, varied solo recital programme. Superstar countertenor Iestyn Davies will perform a programme of music old and new with Fretwork. Leading baritone James Newby's recital is inspired by the BBC's Shipping Forecast, and fast-rising violinist Benjamin Baker performs all six of Bach's Partitas and Sonatas for solo violin. The Tallis Scholars open the Festival with a glorious programme of music linked to the Vatican's Sistine Chapel, and period ensemble Florilegium perform all 6 Brandenburg Concertos. Piano phenomenon Marc-André Hamelin will appear both in recital and in concerto with our Festival Academy Orchestra and chamber music lovers will be treated to the world-renowned Pavel Haas Quartet and The Nash Ensemble of London.

Every year since 2008 we have created our Festival Academy Orchestra by inviting leading professional orchestral players to sit alongside advanced students selected by audition from the nation's conservatoires. Their three concerts include popular symphonies by Beethoven, Schubert and Dvoräk, and concertos by Brahms (Marc-André Hamelin), Anna Clyne (Jess Gillam), and Barber, whose violin concerto will be performed by the orchestra's leader Ruth Rogers

Our ever-popular Young Artist Lunchtime Series is a showcase for classical music's brightest emerging talent and we are delighted to welcome the multi-award winning pianist Antoine Préat, the Hyde Clarinet Quartet from the Royal College of Music, Royal Overseas League Gold Medal winner Ewan Millar (oboe), and tenor Sebastian Hill.

Our Education Programme

In 2025, we launched our education programme thanks to a seed donation from Roger and Jean Grenville-Jones. So far, over 750 children have benefitted, with free instruments and free weekly lessons for 85 children, Peter and the Wolf workshops and concerts performed by members of the Festival orchestra, ambitious side by side playing opportunities for young orchestral players, a commission from a young composer and the formation of a youth choir in partnership with Campden Edge.

The Renaissance composers in this concert all worked in the Sistine Chapel and wrote for the choir there, and a number of the works in this programme can be identified as having been written specifically for that building: Allegri's Miserere was composed for the exclusive use of the Sistine Chapel during the Tenebrae services of Holy Week, Morales was there for much of his life, and Carpentras' Lamentations are especially interesting as he is said to have gone back there later in life and found the choir to be using faulty copies. The framework for the programme is a composite mass by Palestrina.

The Nash Ensemble returns to Chipping Campden with a programme bringing together elements that define this unique group. A trailblazing beacon of British music since its formation over 60 years ago, they present music by Benjamin Britten (marking 50 years since his death), Elizabeth Machonchy's wonderful clarinet quintet (written in the same year as the Ensemble was founded, 1964) and finishing with Beethoven's Septet, one of many masterpieces forming the core of the Nash repertoire.

Jess Gillam joins our Festival Academy Orchestra in Anna Clyne's Glasslands, conjuring an imaginary world of three realms governed by the banshee - a female spirit who, in Irish folklore, heralds the death of a family member. Britten's 'The Suite on English Folk Tunes' is a sequence of five wonderfully characterised movements for chamber orchestra, ranging from boisterous folk-like fiddling to daring orchestral effects and the achingly beautiful final movement, with its mournful cor anglais solo. The concert ends with Beethoven's playful and exuberant second symphony.






