This comprises the repertoire portion of the program, during which students perform three pieces of contrasting styles for a panel of faculty evaluators. Complete all three pages of this form and bring them with you to the Final Exam, along with your completed forms for **Performance Record**, and if applicable, **Special Project**. Repertoire must represent three different musical eras for Level 2 and higher. One piece must be from either the Baroque or Classical era, and you should also select a colorful piece from the 20th or 21st century. If completing Level 1 or higher, you will need to perform an etude for the mid-year exam as well as the technical requirements (Scales, Chords and Arpeggios) listed; the etude need not be memorized and cannot be used as a final exam piece. Please consult the syllabus for the Royal Conservatory of Music Certificate Program as a guide for repertoire selection – you are welcome to use other pieces, but the level of difficulty must be the same or higher. Please consult Joan Forsyth, Piano Department Chair, if in doubt! Junior and Senior diploma candidates should perform three pieces from their programs.
