### System Investment Analyst

#### Role Purpose...

- Provide analytics, insight and performance support across the System teams portfolio to help improve outcomes for people with cancer.
- Support engagement with Partner data and finance teams, building relationships with key leads to ensure compliance with data sharing processing and procedures across the organisation.
- Support synthesising of data and insights across multiple datasets and sources, building dashboards to facilitate a view of system change, progress, successes and failures that create a learning environment which shares best practice for the benefit of internal and external audiences.

#### In this role, your accountabilities and responsibilities are...

##### Data analysis and insight

- Develop and implement robust frameworks to measure the impact of investments, programmes and system changes on desired outcomes.
- Collect and analyse data across diverse data sets to assess the effectiveness of system interventions.
- Bring data together in PowerBI/ Excel formats dashboard development, impact reports and other associated products to provide teams with interactive visualisations to explore further key priorities and trends.
- Support the monitoring and evaluation of system investments and wider team activities, including tracking progress toward goals and identifying opportunities for improvement
- Apply financial forecasting models and outcome frameworks as required to provide evidence that supports the development of new proposals and investment cases for projects.
- Lead and support deep dives with external sites and internal stakeholders to share data trends and identify opportunities for continuous improvement and to facilitate sustainability plans with partners.

##### Stakeholder engagement & collaboration

- Build and maintain strong relationships with health and care providers, commissioners, community leaders and other stakeholders.

- Be familiar with Information Governance and related processes concerning data sharing, storage and use. Provide guidance to external partners and internal stakeholders to ensure compliance.
- Support external partners to present their data in a meaningful way by sharing advice and guidance on dashboard development, impact reports and other associated products.

#### **Knowledge Sharing and Learning**

- Prepare impact reports, case studies, and other communications materials, as directed by the wider team.
- Identify learning and key insight themes from external partners by supporting with collating case studies, patient stories and testimonials, in accordance with data governance internally and with partners.
- Foster a learning environment by providing key insight, evidence and learning and enabling cross team collaboration to support high-quality internal and external engagement.
- Represent Macmillan at events and conferences.

- Strong writing, listening and inter-personal skills, with the ability to summarise and communicate information clearly and effectively.
- Confidence in public speaking, with the ability to deliver insightful presentations that synthesise findings, promote learning and encourage discussion across diverse audiences.
- The ability to work both independently and collaboratively, with a proactive approach to feedback and continuous improvement.
