DEATH BENEFITS AVAILABLE TO THE SURVIVING FAMILIES
OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WHO HAVE DIED IN THE LINE OF DUTY

STATE DEATH BENEFITS

Currently there is no one time death benefit in California.

EDUCATION BENEFITS

Alan Patte Scholarship Act: Under this act, an eligible student who is a surviving spouse or child of a deceased person who meets all of the following requirements may be eligible for exemption towards tuition and fees at a California Community college, California State University, or University of California campus. Requirements include:

- Was a resident of California
- Was employed by a public agency, or was a contractor, or an employee of a contractor, performing services for a public agency
- Had principal duties consisting of law enforcement service or active fire suppression and prevention
- Passed away in the performance of active law enforcement service or active fire suppression and prevention duties, or died as a result of an injury incurred in the performance of those duties.

CONCERNS OF POLICE SURVIVORS provides financial assistance of up to \$2,000 per semester with a maximum lifetime amount of \$16,000 to surviving children and to surviving spouses of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty, according to C.O.P.S. criteria, who wish to pursue a course of study beyond high school.

The Public Safety Officers' Education Assistance (PSOEA) Program provides financial assistance, for the purpose of seeking higher education, to the spouses and eligible children of local police, fire, and emergency public safety officers who have been killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty.

Educational assistance through the PSOEA Program is available after the Public Safety Officers' Benefit (PSOB) death or disability claim process has been completed and benefits have been awarded.

California Peace Officers' Memorial Foundation- Dependents of California peace officers who have died in the line of duty are eligible to receive annual scholarships.

Scholarship recipients must be a survivor of a peace officer killed in the line of duty and enrolled on the California Peace Officers' Memorial Monument. Eligible survivors are:

- Spouses, Children, Stepchildren, and adopted children.

Students must be enrolled in, at a minimum, the fall semester of the forthcoming school year. For more information visit the **California Peace Officer's Memorial Foundation** – <https://camemorial.org/scholarship-program/>

The **Law Enforcement Personnel Dependents Grant Program** provides need-based educational grants to dependents and spouses of: California peace officers (Highway Patrol, marshals, sheriffs, police officers), Department of Corrections and California Youth Authority employees, and permanent/full-time firefighters employed by public entities who have been killed in the performance of duty or 100% disabled as a result of an accident or injury caused by external violence or physical force incurred in the performance of duty. Grant awards match the amount of a Cal Grant award and range from \$100 to \$12,192 for up to four years.

KIDS CHANCE OF CALIFORNIA - To be eligible for a scholarship grant, applicants must have a parent who has been killed or seriously injured as a result of a work-related incident that meets the criteria of the California Workers' Compensation Act and that has resulted in demonstrated financial need. Applicants must be between the ages of 18-25.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION

Death benefits are payments to a spouse, children or other dependents if an employee dies from a work-related injury or illness. **This includes reasonable burial expenses, not exceeding \$10,000 for injuries on or after Jan. 1, 2013.** The amount of the death benefit depends on the number of total and/or partial dependents. In the case of one or more totally dependent minors, after payment of amounts specified below, death benefits will continue until youngest minor's 18th birthday (disabled minors receive benefits for life). Death benefits are paid at the total temporary disability rate, but not less than \$224.00 per week. The period within which to commence proceedings for the collection of death benefits is one year from death where death occurs within one year of date of injury (DOI); or one year from date of last furnishing of any benefits or one year from death where death occurs more than one year from DOI. No such proceedings may be commenced more than 240 weeks from the DOI.

Burial expenses- \$10,000

1 total dependents- \$250,000

2 or more total dependents- \$290,000

3 or more total dependents- \$320,000

1 total plus 1 or more partial dependents- \$250,000 plus four times annual support for partial dependents not to exceed \$290,000

1 or more partial dependents- Eight times annual support not to exceed \$250,000

A unique effort of the U.S. Department of Justice; local, state, tribal, and federal public safety agencies; and national organizations, the Public Safety Officers' Benefits (PSOB) Program provides death and education benefits to survivors of fallen law enforcement officers, firefighters, and other first responders, and disability benefits to officers catastrophically injured in the line of duty.
