DEATH BENEFITS AVAILABLE TO THE SURVIVING FAMILIES
OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WHO HAVE DIED IN THE LINE OF DUTY

STATE DEATH BENEFITS

On May 25, 2024 Gov. Ned Lamont signed the Fallen Officers Fund into law, <u>Public Act 24-27</u>, through the fund, non-taxable benefits of up to \$100,000 will be provided to the families or beneficiaries of police officers who are killed while on duty, and those family members will be able to stay on that officer's health insurance for another five years after.

EDUCATION BENEFITS

Connecticut General Statutes CGS §§10a-77(d), 10a-99(d), and 10a-105(e).

The University of Connecticut, Connecticut State University, and the community-technical colleges must waive tuition for the dependent children of paid and volunteer police officers and fire fighters killed in the line of duty. Contact the Registrar's Office of the school you will be attending for application instructions.

CONCERNS OF POLICE SURVIVORS – provides financial assistance of up to \$2,000 per semester with a maximum lifetime amount of \$16,000 to surviving children and surviving spouses of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty, according to C.O.P.S. criteria, who wish to pursue a course of study beyond high school. Since there is a tuition-free education benefit available in your state, you must first apply for and be denied by the state or the institution to be eligible for the C.O.P.S. scholarship. The PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS' EDUCATION ASSISTANCE (PSOEA) Program provides financial assistance, for the purpose of seeking higher education, to the spouses and eligible children of local police, fire, and emergency public safety officers who have been killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty. Educational assistance through the PSOEA Program is available after the Public Safety Officers' Benefit (PSOB) death or disability claim process has been completed and benefits have been awarded. KIDS CHANCE OF CONNECTICUT - To be eligible for a scholarship grant, applicants must have a parent who has been killed or seriously injured as a result of a work-related incident that meets the criteria of the Connecticut Workers' Compensation Act and that has resulted

PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS' BENEFITS (PSOB) PROGRAM

A unique effort of the U.S. Department of Justice; local, state, tribal, and federal public safety agencies; and national organizations, the Public Safety Officers' Benefits (PSOB) Program provides death and education benefits to survivors of fallen law enforcement officers, firefighters, and other first responders, and disability benefits to officers catastrophically injured in the line of duty.

HEALTH BENEFITS

Connecticut provides health insurance coverage for the surviving spouse and dependent children of any law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty. Children's coverage terminates at age 18; remarriage will **not** terminate spousal coverage. The group medical plans offered to survivors are the same plans that are available to state retirees. Currently, available plans range from no cost to nominal cost.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION provides up to \$4,000 burial benefit to the dependents or to the person who paid the expenses. See Workers' Compensation section above.

This program provides dignified and honorable tributes, at no cost, for career and volunteer law enforcement officers who fall in the line of duty.
