



The National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund (NLEOMF)

Each year on May 13th, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund presents a signature event of National Police Week, its annual Candlelight Vigil. During the Vigil, fallen officers whose names were engraved on the memorial in 2026 are formally dedicated. Held on the National Mall, it includes the lighting of provided candles, reading of names, remarks by dignitaries, and musical tributes to honor the memory of fallen officers.

The Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) and its Auxiliary

The National Peace Officers' Memorial Service, sponsored by the Fraternal Order of Police and its Auxiliary, is held each year on May 15th. This service is to honor fallen officers on the 2026 Roll Call of Heroes, in which participating family members will place a carnation on a memorial wreath that is then displayed at the National Peace Officers' Memorial Service. FOP busing to and from this event leaves from C.O.P.S. hotels only.

OFFICIAL C.O.P.S. NPW HOTELS

Please be sure to book your hotel room(s) for National Police Week (NPW) at one of the official C.O.P.S. hotels listed below.

- Booking at an official C.O.P.S. hotel is the only way to secure a discounted rate and receive busing to all of the week's events.
- When booking your hotel rooms, be sure to list anyone staying in the room by name - this is imperative for your event busing. Do not book multiple rooms under the same name, or forget to include additional guests. Multiple rooms in the same name may be canceled.
- Attendees are responsible for the full costs of their transportation and lodging for the week. C.O.P.S. provides some meals for those registered accordingly. C.O.P.S. Chapters may provide financial assistance. Visit <https://www.concernsofpolicesurvivors.org/aboutchapters> to find your local Chapter.
- Attendees will receive a booking link with options to stay at the Washington Hilton, Omni Shoreham and the Churchill following the NPW online submission. We highly recommend survivors stay at the Washington Hilton if their officer is being honored in 2026. Survivors also have the option to stay at an outside hotel, but transportation to and from the events is not provided.

All guests will be required to provide a form of payment when reserving and at check-in.

If you cancel your reservation within 72 hours of arrival, you may be charged for the duration of your stay.

YOUR COST

You will be responsible for your transportation to and from Washington, D.C., your hotel accommodations, and any meals not provided by C.O.P.S. Survivors may be able to find assistance with transportation and hotel costs from their local C.O.P.S. chapter or law enforcement agency. The Candlelight Vigil, National Police Survivors' Conference, and National Peace Officers' Memorial Service have no cost for law enforcement survivors.

TRAVEL


C.O.P.S. coordinates with Honor Guard members to greet survivors at Reagan National Airport. Upon de-boarding, you will be met and escorted to baggage claim to your escorted transportation to your C.O.P.S. hotel. In order to receive escorted transportation from the airport to your hotel when arriving into D.C. attendees must:

- **Register with C.O.P.S.**
- **Book their room at an official C.O.P.S. hotel via the C.O.P.S. booking link.**
- **Arrive into Reagan National Airport (DCA) on May 11th or 12th between 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.**
- **Provide travel information to C.O.P.S. by the April 20th deadline.**

Arriving on these days will allow you to take part in the honored escort to your hotel, pick up your credentials, check-in to your hotel, and sightsee before the week's events begin. If you fly into a different airport, there will be no transportation or escorts provided.



SCHEDULE OF EVENTS



Monday, May 11

Early Arrival day at Reagan National Airport (DCA)

C.O.P.S. provides escorted transportation between 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. to your C.O.P.S. hotel. Transportation is provided to those who have pre-registered, provided C.O.P.S. with travel plans, and will be staying at a C.O.P.S. hotel.

Tuesday, May 12

Official Arrival day at Reagan National Airport (DCA)

C.O.P.S. provides escorted transportation between 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. to your C.O.P.S. hotel. Transportation is provided to those who have pre-registered, provided C.O.P.S. with travel plans, and will be staying at a C.O.P.S. hotel.

Law Enforcement United (LEU) Arrival Ceremony

The Road to Hope bicycle ride concludes after as many as 1,000 miles are ridden in honor of officers who will be recognized during the May 15th Memorial Service. Location details will be listed in the Information Booklet you will receive upon check in.

The **Police Unity Tour** bicycle ride will also be arriving this day at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial located at 450 F Street NW in DC.

Wednesday, May 13

Candlelight Vigil hosted by the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund (NLEOMF)

The NLEOMF will host the Annual Candlelight Vigil on the National Mall at 8:00 p.m. to honor the law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty.

Thursday, May 14

C.O.P.S. hosts day one of the National Police Survivors' Conference

Surviving family member sessions and surviving co-worker sessions will both be held at the Washington Hilton. Meals included at the conference are a light-fare breakfast and a buffet lunch for those who register accordingly.

C.O.P.S. hosts day one of the Kids/Teens Program

Surviving children, step-children, and siblings of the fallen officer, grades K-12, can attend while their parent/guardian attends the conference. Pre-registration is required.

C.O.P.S. hosts day one of the Daycare Program

Surviving children, step-children, siblings, nieces, and nephews of the fallen officer, ages infant to six, can attend while their parent/guardian attends the conference. Pre-registration is required.

C.O.P.S. hosts the Blue Honor Gala

Friday, May 15

National Peace Officers' Memorial Service hosted by the Fraternal Order of Police and its Auxiliary (FOP)

The FOP will host the Annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service on the West Front Lawn of the U.S. Capitol to honor officers on the 2026 Roll Call of Heroes.

Stand Watch for the Fallen

From noon until midnight, for 10-minute intervals, honor guards will stand watch over the officers that made the ultimate sacrifice at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial.



Saturday, May 16

C.O.P.S. hosts day two of the National Police Survivors' Conference

Surviving family member sessions and surviving co-worker sessions will both be held at the Washington Hilton. Meals included at the conference are a light-fare breakfast and a plated lunch for those who register accordingly.

C.O.P.S. hosts day two of the Kids/Teens Program

Surviving children, step-children, and siblings of the fallen officer, grades K-12, can attend while their parent/guardian attends the conference. Pre-registration is required.

C.O.P.S. hosts day two of the Daycare Program

Surviving children, step-children, siblings, nieces, and nephews of the fallen officer, ages infant to six, can attend while their parent/guardian attends the conference. Pre-registration is required.

EVENT INFORMATION



Candlelight Vigil

Held at the National Mall on May 13th to formally dedicate the fallen officers whose names were engraved on the Memorial in 2026. This event includes the lighting of provided candles, reading of names, remarks by dignitaries, and musical tributes performed to honor the memory of these fallen officers. In order to receive transportation to and from the event, you must pre-register through C.O.P.S. and be staying at an official C.O.P.S. hotel.

The National Law Enforcement Memorial is located at 450 F ST NW in DC. C.O.P.S. provides transportation to and from the Memorial on certain days if you are staying at a C.O.P.S. hotel.

Please note the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund and the Fraternal Order of Police have separate criteria for officers who are to be honored at their individual events. You will receive information from the coordinating organizations of each event if your officer will be honored.

National Peace Officers' Memorial Service



Held on the West Front Lawn of the U.S. Capitol to honor those officers on the 2026 Roll Call of Heroes. All participating family members will use FOP busing to be lined up properly for the service and placement of the carnation in the memorial wreath. In order to receive transportation to and from the event, you must pre-register through C.O.P.S. and be staying at an official C.O.P.S. hotel. Attendees will have an opportunity to speak to an FOP representative during check-in at the Washington Hilton.

C.O.P.S. Kids/Teens Program

C.O.P.S. Kids/Teens Program is for the fallen officers' children, step-children, and siblings, in kindergarten through 12th grade, who will have the opportunity to attend grief counseling sessions, as well as age-appropriate fun and social activities on May 14 and May 16. The program will take place at local law enforcement facilities.

After the C.O.P.S. National Office receives your registration information, additional details for the C.O.P.S. Kids/Teens activities will be sent to the parent/guardian along with a request for additional paperwork on each child. Children must be pre-registered and must attend both days of the C.O.P.S. Kids/Teens Program. **Deadline to register is April 3, 2026.**

C.O.P.S. Daycare

C.O.P.S. Daycare provides child care for infants through pre-school (up to age 6) at the Washington Hilton while adults are in conference sessions on May 14 and May 16. This service is provided exclusively to the surviving children, step-children, siblings, nieces, and nephews of the fallen officer during Conference hours only. Children at daycare will be fed lunch on both days. After registration information is received at the C.O.P.S. National Office, a request for additional paperwork on the child(ren) will be sent to the parent/guardian. Children must be pre-registered. **Deadline to register is April 3, 2026.**

Bicycle Rides

The **Law Enforcement United (LEU)** "Road to Hope" bicycle ride, comprised of active/retired law enforcement officers and survivors, will complete their 250+ mile bicycle rides from five different locations or the 1,000 mile Long Ride into Washington, D.C., on May 12. They will present a NPW memorial flag to the surviving families of each officer being honored this year during the May 15 Memorial Service. *(One flag per family will be presented.)*

The **Police Unity Tour** bicycle ride will also be arriving this day at the National Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial.

Details on both these honorable bicycle rides will be available in your information book that you will receive upon check in, as well as via the National Police Week event app.



IMPORTANT “NEED TO KNOWS”



CONFERENCE MEAL FEE

Surviving family members and co-workers who worked at the same agency as an officer in the 2026 Roll Call of Heroes, have no cost to attend the meals provided on May 14 and 16.

Surviving family members and co-workers whose officer was honored in a previous year will pay \$175 to attend meals on May 14 and/or May 16. Returning children attending Kids/Teens and/or Daycare will pay a fee of \$50/child. There is not an option for a waiver. These fees will be paid at the time of registration.



DEADLINE

- The deadline to submit travel plans to C.O.P.S. for Reagan National Airport (DCA) pickup on May 11 and 12 is April 20, 2026.



CANCELLATION POLICY

Hotel room cancellations made within 72 hours of the arrival date are subject to charge by the hotel(s).



SPECIAL NEEDS

There is a significant amount of walking and/or standing during National Police Week, and due to the amount of people that attend NPW each year, C.O.P.S. cannot provide medical equipment nor can any of the other organizations involved in NPW. If you or someone in your family has a mobility issue, you should contact Zask International Medical Supply at (703) 354-1266 prior to arriving to arrange rental of medical equipment or you will need to bring all supplies needed with you.





DAILY TRANSPORTATION & EVENT TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to non-scheduled events or locations, such as shopping, restaurants, or sightseeing, will not be provided. If you would like to go to the White House, Capitol, Arlington National Cemetery, Museums, Memorials, etc., please use a taxi, Uber, Metro, or Lyft service.

C.O.P.S. provides transportation to and from the Washington Hilton for the LEU arrival ceremony on May 12. C.O.P.S. does not provide transportation to the Police Unity Tour arrival. The NLEOMF coordinates the busing to and from the Candlelight Vigil on May 13. All busing to this event leaves from official C.O.P.S. hotels only. You must have C.O.P.S. credentials to utilize this busing. The FOP coordinates the busing to and from the Memorial Service on May 15. **All busing to this event leaves from official C.O.P.S. hotels only. You must have C.O.P.S. credentials to utilize this busing. All participating family members need to use the FOP busing in order to be lined up properly for the memorial service.**



ATTIRE FOR EVENTS

Dress is casual for the LEU Arrival Ceremony, Candlelight Vigil, the National Police Survivors' Conference and the C.O.P.S. Kids/Teens Activities. Business attire is appropriate for the Memorial Service. Events are held rain or shine, bring an umbrella, sunscreen, poncho, and/or jacket.




