FROM THE PASTOR

Dear St. Peter Family,

We had a wonderful and fruitful pilgrimage to Poland last week. Thank you kindly for your prayers; we also prayed for you and your intentions wherever we visited.

I would like to share my vision for the parish again, and my model of leadership, especially in light of the numerous tragedies we face regularly in this world. I know it is difficult and traumatizing to be subjected to these on a far too regular basis. The Charlie Kirk assassination, the school shootings, and the other violence around the world can be mentally and spiritually exhausting.

We know what to do in the face of these tragedies. Pray and pray a lot. Pray for those harmed by the violence, for those affected by it, and pray for the repentance and conversion of the perpetrators. We do this because this is what Jesus commanded us to do. "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew 5:43-44). "For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; but if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses" (Matthew 6:14-15).

One of the most significant problems in this country is that we have allowed media consumption to shape our worldview and political perspective on everything in our lives, and that too often includes our faith. We cannot view our faith through the lenses of politics or secularism. This view distorts our understanding of the faith, causing us to politicize the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Many of Jesus' interlocutors and even some of His disciples tried to get Him to preach His Gospel in a more worldly/political way but He refused.

Taxes to Caesar: The Pharisees and Herodians ask, "Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" This question was a trap — say yes and He offends Jews resisting Rome, say no and He's guilty of treason. Jesus asks for a coin: "Whose image is this?" When they answer "Caesar's," He replies: "Then render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." He refuses to be boxed into political conversations and instead re-centers the discussion on our ultimate fidelity to God.

Before Pilate: Pilate asks, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus doesn't answer politically: "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would be fighting... But my kingdom is not from here." He refuses to frame His kingship in political or military terms, pointing instead to a spiritual reign founded on truth.

The Galileans slaughtered by Pilate: People bring up a political atrocity (Pilate killing Galileans). Rather than comment on Roman brutality, Jesus says: "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners...? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish." He avoids political commentary and uses the event to call all to conversion.

These are a few examples of Jesus re-centering us on God in the face of worldly/political concerns. I share these because they represent my model of leadership. I suspect just like in Jesus' day; many will not like it. Many of Jesus' own disciples had expectations of how He should be the Messiah, and even His chosen twelve, such as Peter, Judas, James, and John, had similar expectations. I will never be able to satisfy everyone's expectations of how I should lead or what I should say regarding the things that happen in this fallen world. The only expectations I desire to fulfill are the ones God has of me. I will always strive to follow Him where He leads me. I am sure I will fail often. So please have patience and mercy for me. I promise you the same.

My vision is that of Jesus. I will preach the Gospel of the Kingdom. I will do all in my power and ability to help us encounter the love and mercy of God in the sacraments. I will help us develop and deepen a biblical worldview, enabling us to see things from God's perspective. I will help us to overcome the lies and works of the enemy in our lives and to live in the Truth, who is Jesus Christ. If we are looking for a more worldly interpretation of Jesus and His Gospel, I probably won't fulfill that desire. However, I invite us to begin surrendering that worldview to the Lord and pray that He will help us see all things through biblical lenses.

Let's spend more time in the Good News of the Bible and less time reading or watching the daily news. Spend more time as a family eating together, praying together, playing together, and less time on devices. Prioritize God in our daily lives with personal prayer and family prayer. Prioritize God in our week by attending Mass every week and participating in adoration at some point during the week. Prioritize God in every aspect of our lives by inviting Him into every part of it and repenting of the areas we know are not surrendered to Him through regular confession. Prioritize God in our minds: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and pleasing and perfect" (Romans 12:2). And "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).

Thank you for being part of St. Peter Church and School. Please pray for me to be a faithful and good pastor and be assured of my prayers for you.

THE PIETA

Some of you may have seen my ordination card already but I have never really taken the opportunity to explain it in this forum. It is a long-standing tradition that newly ordained priests will make an ordination card as a reminder to those who attend the ordination/ first Mass etc, to pray for the man who was ordained. This card also contains an image that the man is particularly fond of or has had an impact on their prayer or just finds powerful.

Over my years in seminary, I have had the privilege to draw and create the images for holy cards of various now priests that I have gotten to know in our time in formation together. And it seemed fitting that as my own ordination drew near, I should be the one to design my own card and create the image for it.

I decided to do a rendition of the Pieta; it is an image that has always had a profound effect on me. And as I prayed with that image I was reminded of the scene of the angel announcing to Mary that she was to bear a son, and in that moment she gives her response which is known as her "Fiat" (Latin for "let it be done"). And what was powerful for me was the observation that her "fiat", essentially her "yes" to the will of God, wasn't just to the receiving of Christ in her womb, but also to bearing him, raising him, watching him enter into his earthly ministry, and finally watching him enter into his passion, die, rise and ascend into heaven. She said yes to it all. The juxtaposition of Mary's yes to the angel and the image of the pieta was very profound for me because it also describes the priesthood very well. We also say yes to not just the good and sweet things, but also the difficult and challenging things. So that is most of the long rambling reason why the card is designed the way it is. To actually make it, I used a combination of traditional drawing with inks and digital editing to get the look I wanted.

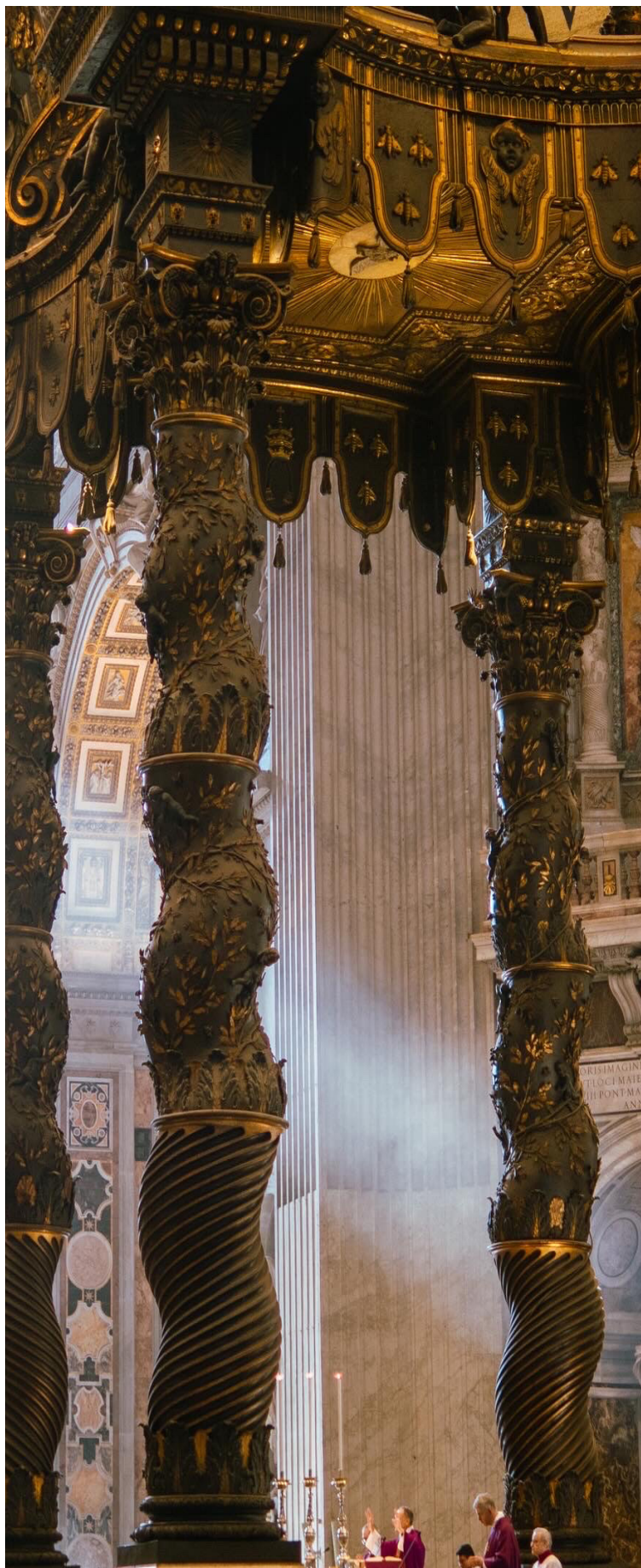

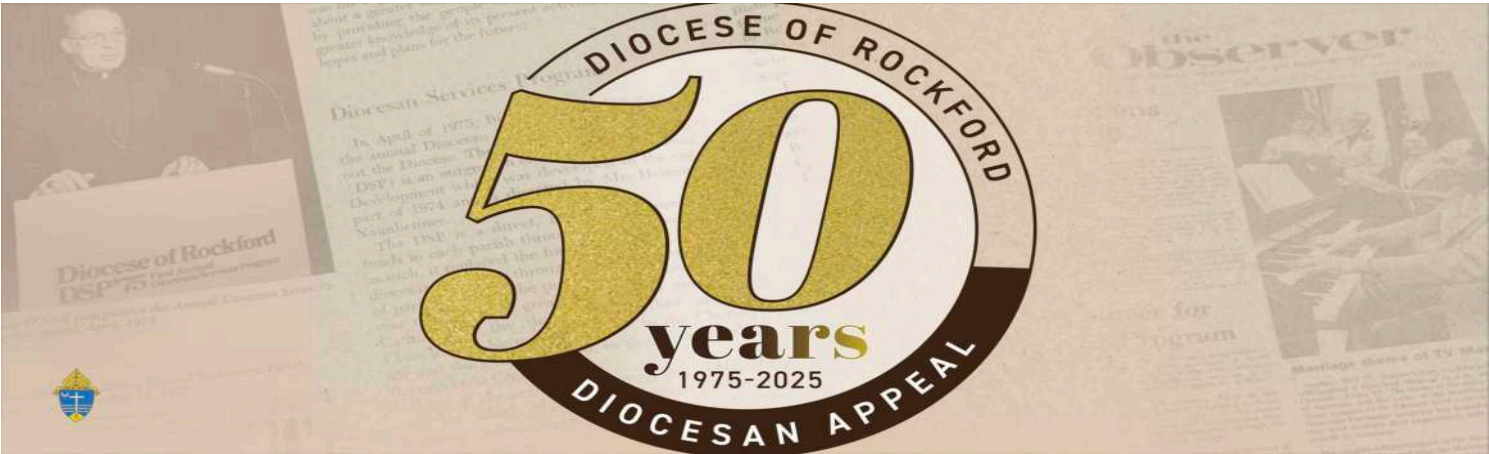

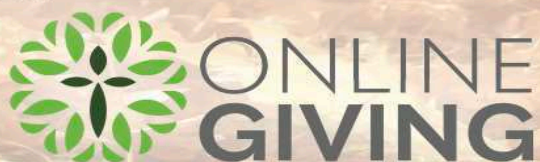
