

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Fr. Patrick Peyton, known as the Rosary priest, would say, "A family that prays together stays together." October is the Month of the Holy Rosary—a time the Church invites us to rediscover this powerful prayer of peace, protection, and unity. The Rosary is more than a string of beads or a recitation of prayers; it is a contemplative journey through the life of Jesus, guided by Mary. Each decade leads us to see the face of Christ anew—His joys, sorrows, and glory—until our hearts begin to resemble His.

In a world filled with noise, distraction, and fear, the Rosary offers a simple yet profound way to bring prayer back into the home. Families who pray together draw closer to one another because they draw closer to God. When parents and children kneel together, offering intentions and entrusting their lives to Our Lady, they create a sacred rhythm that strengthens love and peace in the family.

You don't need perfection to begin—just intention. Start with one decade after dinner or before bedtime. Let children take turns leading a mystery. Over time, this small act will form a habit of prayer that anchors your family in faith and grace.

As St. John Paul II wrote, "The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer. It has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety."

This October, take up the beads once more. Let the Rosary be the chain that binds your family together in love, hope, and holiness—under the mantle of Our Lady of the Rosary.

A TUTORIAL OF SORTS

I wanted to peel back the curtain a little bit and bring you all through a step-by-step of sorts of my process when drawing. For this example, I recently did a small drawing of Jonathan Roumie's

Step 1: Block In. This is one of the most important steps because it lays the foundation on which everything else is built upon. Here, I just use simple lines and shapes to establish proportions. I am not worrying about details yet.

Step 2: Features. Now I start laying down the basic features of the face. I am primarily just focusing on getting everything in the right place and in the right relationship to each other, since that is where the likeness will be.

Step 3: Values: At this point I start building the basic values of this image. I am, again, still trying to keep it simple and not go overboard. I want to establish where to dark areas and dominant shadows are.

Step 4: Smear Campaign. I now, use a tissue or blending stick to blend a consistent tone across the entire face. Not so much that I lose all the features and shadows I worked so hard to establish. But enough to where the graphite can work into all the grit of of the paper and give me a good base to start building the details.

Step 5: Finish. I start building back some of the sharpness that was lost by the blending as well as locking in the darkest values. I also use an eraser to bring out some of the specular highlights in the skin. Since the focal point is the face itself I didn't spend a whole lot of time on the shawl. At this point I usually double check things with my reference and call it good. I have a bad habit of overworking pieces, so I have had to learn to leave well enough alone.




