FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord—the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the nations. In the visit of the Magi, the Church sees the fulfillment of God's promise: that salvation is not meant for one people alone, but for all.

The Magi were seekers. Guided only by a star and a restless longing for truth, they set out on a difficult journey. When they finally arrived, they discovered that God's glory was not found in power or wealth, but in humility—a child, born for us. Their response was simple and profound: they knelt in adoration and offered their gifts.

Epiphany invites each of us to do the same. Christ reveals Himself continually—in the Word proclaimed, in the Eucharist we receive, in the poor and vulnerable, and in the quiet movements of grace in our daily lives. The question is whether we are willing to seek Him, to follow where He leads, and to offer Him the gifts of our faith, our trust, and our lives.

As we move forward in this new year, may we be a parish that reflects the light of Christ to our community—not by drawing attention to ourselves, but by pointing others to Him. May our worship, our charity, and our witness help others recognize that the Savior has come, and that He is near.

May the light of Christ guide you and your family, now and always.







WISE MEN AND THE TONDO

Happy Epiphany! The artwork I am showing today is a painting of the Adoration of the Magi by Fra Angelico and Fra Filippo Lippi, completed around the mid-15th century. There were probably more artists who had a hand in this piece, since there is evidence of several edits being made, but Angelico and Lippi are the most notable. Now what fascinated me most about this piece is the fact that it was painted on a circular piece of wood called a tondo, which comes from the Italian word for round. I was very perplexed by this because it isn't the only Adoration of the Magi scene painted on tondo. It could be chalked up to the fact that the tondo had just come back into fashion around this era and so every artist wanted to try it.

There are also several themes that circles have historically signified such as unity, perfection, etc. But apparently one of the inspirations for the Renaissance revival of the tondo were the birthing trays used at the time. These would not have been ordinary, plain trays. The birth of a child is a sacred moment. They would have been elegantly decorated round trays that would have been presented to the mother with the various necessities for childbirth such as food and water.

The Magi also presented ornate gifts to mark the moment.

So, it's no surprise then that this scene in particular tends to be painted in this fashion. By a simple round canvas, so many ideas and traditions are connected and expressed with the depiction of Christ and the Magi. I just thought that was interesting, have a blessed week!

I don't have anything left to give. You can't pour from an empty cup. All I do is give. Who is giving to me? Raise your hand if these thoughts have ever run through your head. I'm sure they occur to all of us from time to time. We can become so easily depleted by the fast pace of life and whatever vocation God has called us to, whether that's parenthood, a demanding professional career or the caretaking of friends and family (or as so often happens, a hybrid of all three). Many of us also undergo certain seasons — seasons of the year, but also seasons of life — that seem to sap us of energy and leave us totally empty.

In these times, it seems impossible to continue in the spirituality of Everyday Stewardship. Graciousness, mindfulness, prayerfulness, gratitude, accountability — maintaining some semblance of these characteristics in our daily life feels not only overly optimistic, but totally impossible.

The Church gives us certain liturgical seasons that are meant to fill us up, almost like spiritual pit stops. Advent is one such season, and the Scriptural passages we reflect on at Mass during these four weeks are filled with images of nature defied. We see the dry steppe blooming. We see the weak made firm. We see the frightened made strong. We see the lame walk. We see the Virgin give birth.


If you think you don't have anything left to give this Advent, think again. This is the season of miracles when what we thought was depleted brings new life.


