FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

As we begin this new year, I want to share a few truths about the Holy Mass, both as an obligation and the spiritual foundation of our lives, our families, and our parish. I know at times Mass can seem like a burden, given the struggles of life. I want to encourage us to battle those struggles and to watch the fruit of devotion bloom in our lives through our faithfulness to Mass. If we stumble and fall, then we find our new beginning in the sacrament of confession. I have failed much in my life and have become so thankful for the great gift of this sacrament.

Each Sunday, Catholics are bound by a sacred obligation to participate in the Holy Mass. This is not an arbitrary rule, but a command rooted in God's own law: "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy" (Exodus 20:8). The Church reminds us that Sunday Mass is the foundation of Christian life, and therefore "*the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass on days of obligation*" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2180).

But the Mass is far more than a mere requirement. **It is an encounter with the living God.**

At every Mass, the sacrifice of Christ on Calvary is made present sacramentally. Jesus offers Himself to the Father for our salvation, and we are invited to unite our lives—our joys, struggles, sins, and hopes—to His perfect offering. In the Liturgy of the Word, Christ speaks to us. In the Eucharist, He gives Himself to us completely: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. To miss Mass deliberately, without a serious reason, is to step away from this life-giving encounter. The Church speaks clearly: "*Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin*" (CCC 2181). At the same time, the Church recognizes that illness, care of the infirm, dangerous weather, or other serious circumstances may excuse one from the obligation.

Ultimately, the question is not merely "*Do I have to go to Mass?*" but rather, "*Why would I not want to?*" The Mass strengthens our faith, unites us as the Body of Christ, forgives venial sins, deepens charity, and prepares us for eternal life. It is heaven touching earth. As Catholics, we do not go to Mass simply because we must—we go because **we need to**. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, and Sunday Mass is the heartbeat of parish life. May we never take for granted this extraordinary gift Christ has entrusted to His Church.

Wherever we are in our journey of faith, let us begin or continue to build our spiritual foundation on our presence at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. A special word to our families, we know how much it takes to be here. Maybe sometimes it feels like you are playing defense the whole Mass, and you feel like you didn't hear a word of anything. The Lord understands, and He blesses you for being at Mass. Remember that baby and toddler noises are welcome at Mass as we are one big family. We love all the children present at Mass!

This is an amazing parish, and I am blessed to be your Pastor. Together, we can make 2026 a year of spiritual renewal and growth, starting with our devotion and faithfulness to Sunday Mass.



Please remember to update your address, contact info, children, etc. Our biggest reminder is for young adults to register as their own family! There is no magic answer to when a person becomes an "adult" within the Church. However, in order to establish their role as stewards of the Church, we recommend young adults register on their own once they have a job and a somewhat permanent address (not running back and forth from college campuses). For some, this is not an age, but a stage in life when they begin their own history of actively practicing their faith.

For others, a logical age to be established independently is the age of 23.

Even if living at home with mom and dad, young adults should register with the parish. If no longer at home and living in another area, they should register with the parish where they live. Once registered on their own either at St. Peter or elsewhere, it is important to notify St. Peter so we can remove them as active members of their parents' household.

This question of adulthood often comes up when a person is asked to be a sponsor for someone receiving a sacrament or wishes to be married in the Church, but has never established themselves beyond their parent's family registration.

Once registered on their own, young adults who engage in stewardship of time, talent and treasure are able to build a record of sorts that they are actively participating in parish life. In essence, it helps them take ownership of their faith. It is important for young adults to be registered independently, as they are the future of our Church and society in general. It is another step in their journey of adulthood.



In the US today, there are an estimated 65 million caregivers; that's almost one-third of our population caring for an aging parent, grandparent, or spouse. Often, we don't identify as a caregiver, but see ourselves as a responsible child helping our aging parents, or simply a loving spouse. Caregiving can come on gradually – first it's just helping with extra chores around the house or going to doctors' appointments, but often these activities grow over time. 
