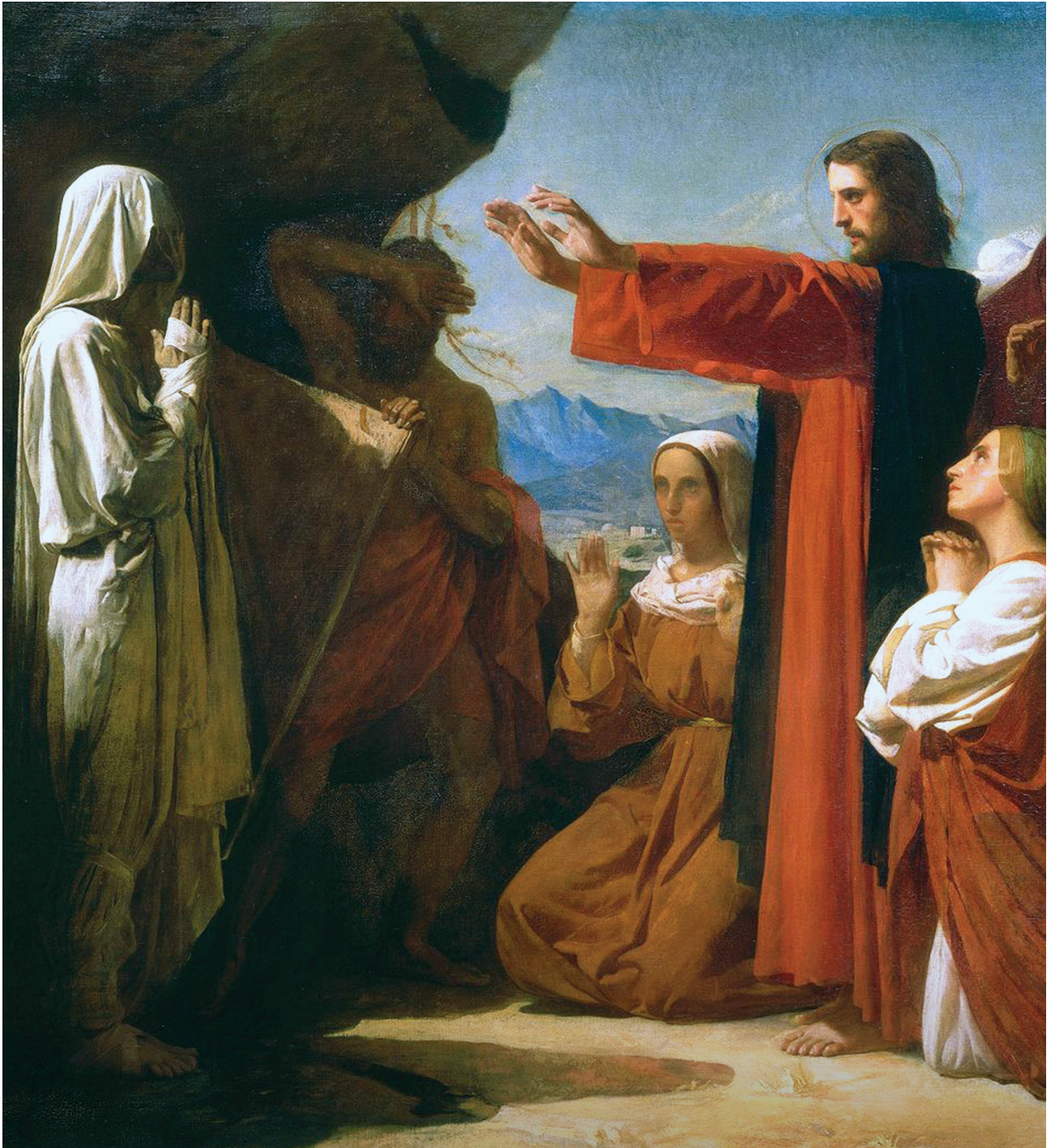

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

There is a quiet truth about the Sacrament of Confession today: Many Catholics have not been in a long time—but many also want to return. Recent research from Vinea Research Group confirms what many of us already sense as pastors: Most people are not rejecting Confession. They are simply unsure, out of the habit, or hesitant to come back. And yet, deep within the heart, there remains a desire for something more—for mercy, for peace, for a fresh start.

When Catholics are asked what would draw them to Confession, the most common answer is simple and powerful: “To receive God’s forgiveness and mercy.” That desire has not gone away. In fact, it is often stronger than we realize. Many people carry burdens—regret, sin, wounds, habits they wish they could break. Confession is not about shame or judgment. It is about bringing those burdens to Christ and hearing the words we all long for: “I absolve you... your sins are forgiven.”

For many, the obstacles are not what we might expect. It is not usually about scheduling or even disagreement with the Church. Instead, the most common reasons are:

- “I can just ask God for forgiveness on my own”
- “I feel embarrassed to say my sins out loud”
- “I don’t really think about going”
- “I’m not sure what to say or how it works”

In other words, it is often hesitation, not rejection. If that is you, you are not alone. One of the most important things to remember is this: God is not waiting to judge you—He is waiting to forgive you. In the Gospel, the Father runs to meet the prodigal son. He does not shame him. He restores him. The same is true in Confession. The priest is there not as a judge, but as a father—a witness to God’s mercy and a minister of His forgiveness.

Many people hesitate because they feel stuck: “I keep falling into the same sins.” But this is not a reason to stay away—it is a reason to come. Growth in the spiritual life often happens gradually. Returning again and again is not failure. It is faithfulness.

If it has been a long time, you do not need to have everything figured out. You can simply begin: “Bless me, Father, it has been a while since my last confession...” The priest will help guide you. There is no need to be afraid of “doing it wrong.” Yes, we can and should ask God for forgiveness in prayer. But Jesus gave us something more. In Confession, we receive: certainty that our sins are forgiven grace to begin again peace that comes from laying down our burdens Many who return to Confession say the same thing afterward: I feel lighter, I feel at peace, I know I am forgiven. If it has been a long time, consider this your invitation. Not because you “have to,” but because God is calling you back to His mercy. Come as you are. Come with whatever you are carrying. Come even if you are unsure. You will not be turned away. If you haven’t been to Confession in a while, this week could be the perfect time to return. The soul does not find peace until it has laid down its burden at the feet of the priest.

Dear Parishioners of St. Peter,

The You Will Be My Witnesses Campaign is approaching, and our entire diocesan family will soon be invited to take part in this historic effort. When we are asked to do something significant—whether a major project or a meaningful financial commitment—it is often most manageable to break it into smaller, more attainable parts.

One helpful way to do this is through a pledge. By spreading a gift over time—annually, semi-annually, quarterly, or monthly—you can more easily support the important goals of the campaign while remaining mindful of your financial situation. For example, a family of four asked to consider a gift of \$3,600 may initially find that amount overwhelming. However, when divided over three years, it becomes \$1,200 per year. Broken down even further into monthly payments, it becomes \$100 per month—an amount comparable to what many families might spend on dining out.

Ultimately, each family must prayerfully discern what is both meaningful and appropriate for their circumstances. In the coming weeks, Bishop Malloy will invite each of us to reflect on how we can participate. He will ask us to consider: What sacrifice can I make over the next three years to help strengthen and build up our Catholic community for the future?

Through the “You Will Be My Witnesses” Capital Campaign, funds will support:

Parish renewal and local parish projects
Evangelization and ministry throughout the diocese
Support for parishes in need
Important diocesan ministries and facilities

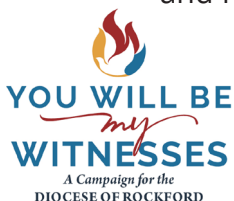

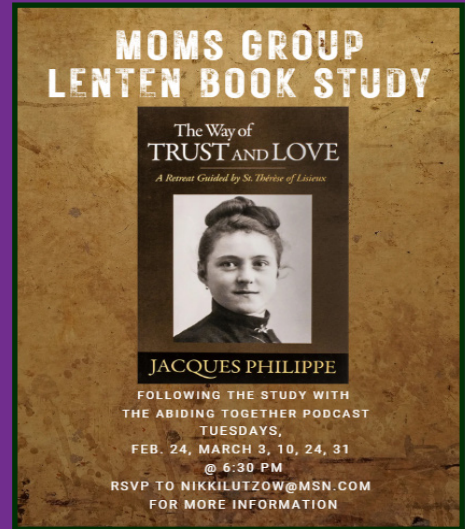

TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE **BENEFICIARY MONTHLY** **HIGHLIGHT**



Every year the Knights of Columbus host the "Tootsie Roll Drive" for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Last year, with the help of Holy Cross and St. Peter Parishioners, we raised over \$30,000. These funds go directly back to our local community to support organizations that help those with intellectual disabilities. This week we want to highlight one of the organizations we support:

Valley Sheltered Workshop (VSW) in Batavia.

- Cozy 14(c) workshop environment provides a safe, welcoming, and self-paced workplace for those with disabilities.
- VSW coordinates with local businesses to create meaningful work tasks such as packaging, labeling, and medical supply prep.
- Most importantly, the shelter provides local citizens a place to feel welcome and avoid self-isolation through outings/group activities.
- While the employees of the shelter do get paid for their work, VSW relies completely on donations to keep the lights on.

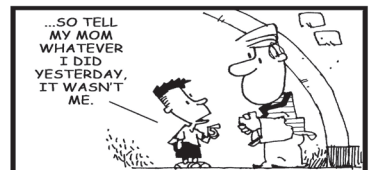
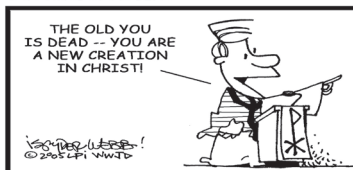
