

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear St. Peter Family,

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a feast that reminds us of the paradox of our faith: the very instrument of Christ's suffering and death becomes for us the sign of victory, hope, and salvation.

The Cross was once a symbol of humiliation and defeat. But through Jesus' total gift of Himself, it was transformed into the throne of love and the bridge between God and humanity. As St. Paul says, "we proclaim Christ crucified... the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Corinthians 1:23–24).

The feast originated in the 4th century, when the true Cross was discovered in Jerusalem and a basilica was built over the site of Calvary. It has since been celebrated by the Church as a reminder that every time we look upon the Cross, we see not only Christ's suffering but also His glory and triumph.

For us, the Cross is not just a sign we wear or trace on ourselves; it is the daily path of discipleship. Jesus tells us, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). To embrace the Cross is to trust that God can bring life out of suffering, joy out of sorrow, and victory out of apparent defeat.

As we honor the Holy Cross, may we renew our gratitude for the gift of salvation and find strength to carry our own crosses with faith and love. "We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You, because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world."

WRITTEN IN STONE

Did you know that in the same way that scripture and books are meant to be read, churches are meant to be read as well. There is theology written in the paint and stonework of churches. And this theology is practically in all caps in the great European cathedrals and basilicas. There are a couple aspects of the theology these cathedrals and basilicas that I want to unpack, though there are many more. And a lot of what I will describe can be applied to most churches as well, thought certainly not all, accounting for various architectural movements and styles (both good and bad). Both of these aspects reflect the old description of the Christan worship spaces as the porta caeli, the gate to heaven.

Verticality: The first thing I noticed happened when I first stepped into St. Peter's basilica was my head craned immediately upward. The basilicas and cathedrals tend to be built with verticality in mind. All the leading lines force the gaze upward. When you enter a cathedral your orientation is craned toward heaven, to look away and beyond the earthly things. That's also why the most exquisite artwork in the basilicas and cathedrals are not at ground level but up on the walls and ceilings.

Symmetry: It was God who brought order to chaos, we see this in the first chapters of Genesis. So, the great cathedrals are built with a sense of symmetry and geometry. Sin and evil are inherently disordered and chaotic. So, disharmony and asymmetry should not be present in the architecture. Since we pass through that gate to heaven in the Church we also enter into that sacred order of heaven and leave behind the dysfunction of our chaotic world.

If you want to read more about the reading of Churches I can't recommend Bishop

Barron's book Heaven in Stone and Glass enough, though his focus is specifically on the Gothic cathedrals. I think I have mentioned it before. All the photos shown were taken by me.



NEW OCIA SESSION BEGINS!


Wednesday, October 8th


Candidates for OCIA are:


