FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

The Communion of Saints: A Month of Hope and Remembrance
November opens with two powerful celebrations that remind us who we are and
what our lives are about. On All Saints' Day (November 1), the Church lifts her eyes
to heaven to honor the great multitude of men and women who now share in the
glory of God. They are not distant figures from history but our brothers and sisters
who once walked the same paths we walk today. Their lives show us that holiness
is possible in every vocation—whether in family life, work, or hidden acts of charity.
They inspire us to follow Christ with faith, perseverance, and joy until we, too, are
gathered around His throne.

The next day, **All Souls' Day (November 2)**, turns our hearts to those still being purified in God's mercy. The Church, in her tender wisdom, invites us to pray for the dead, confident that love can reach even beyond the grave. Our prayers, Masses, and sacrifices offered for the souls in purgatory assist them on their journey toward perfect union with God. "It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins" (2 Maccabees 12:46).

The entire month of November continues this spirit of remembrance and gratitude. We are encouraged to visit cemeteries, light candles, and keep photos of our departed loved ones in prayerful remembrance. At the same time, the Church invites us to reflect on the "last things"—death, judgment, heaven, and hell—not with fear, but with hope, for we believe that Christ has conquered death and opened for us the gates of eternal life.

As Thanksgiving approaches, this season also calls us to gratitude—for the saints who intercede for us, for the souls we commend to God's mercy, and for the promise that one day we too shall join them in the eternal joy of heaven.

SIGNS

Of the M. Night Shyamalan movies, two stand out as my favorites. The first is *Unbreakable*, and the second is Signs. I want to talk about Signs, firstly, since Halloween was just this Friday it seems fitting to discuss the "spookier" of the two. And second, Signs is, at its core, less about the terrifying prospect of aliens coming to earth, and more about a religious man having an existential crisis and his relationship with his

There is one scene in particular where Mel Gibson's character is having a conversation with his son (played by Joaquin Phoenix) while they are watching a news report about the impending alien invasion. Gibson uses the situation to describe two groups of people. Group 1, when they experience something good in their life see it as more than luck. They see it as a sign that there is someone in heaven watching out for them. Group 2 sees that same thing as just dumb luck, turn of chance. However, for the Group 2 people since all is just luck, whatever happens to them, they are on their own. Jesus at many points in the Gospel describes a certain perception of faith that all believers need to have. Because, truth be told, God is always active and acting in the world and in our lives. But do we perceive that or not? Do we have the eyes to see the signs and miracles that the Lord is working each and every day? Too often, we can be like the Group 2 people, and think of all things as just coincidence, which is lonely and isolating way to live. It disconnects us from the God who wants to connect with us.

Now to throw nuance in this stew. Does everything that we see and experience in our life have huge

profound divine meaning? Not necessarily. God works through all things; there is reason behind everything he does or permits. But the reason is not necessarily the first thing that pops into our head, nor something that we will necessarily be made aware of this side of heaven. Heavily scrupulous people tend to read God's punitive justice in all their misfortunes and that is not why misfortune befalls us nor is that the takeaway. Seeing with the eyes of faith requires a real relationship with God and healthy relationships with others who help build that faith. So that we are not reading into everything but relating out of everything. That everything we experience might be an opportunity for deeper relationship, to give God thanksgiving, petition, lament or surrender.

This week's image is a portrait of Mel Gibson's character from Signs that I drew last year. I don't really know why I drew it on notebook paper. It must have just been what I had around.





DESSERT BAKERS NEEDED FOR STEAK & LOBSTER!


Friday, November 14th - 6pm
