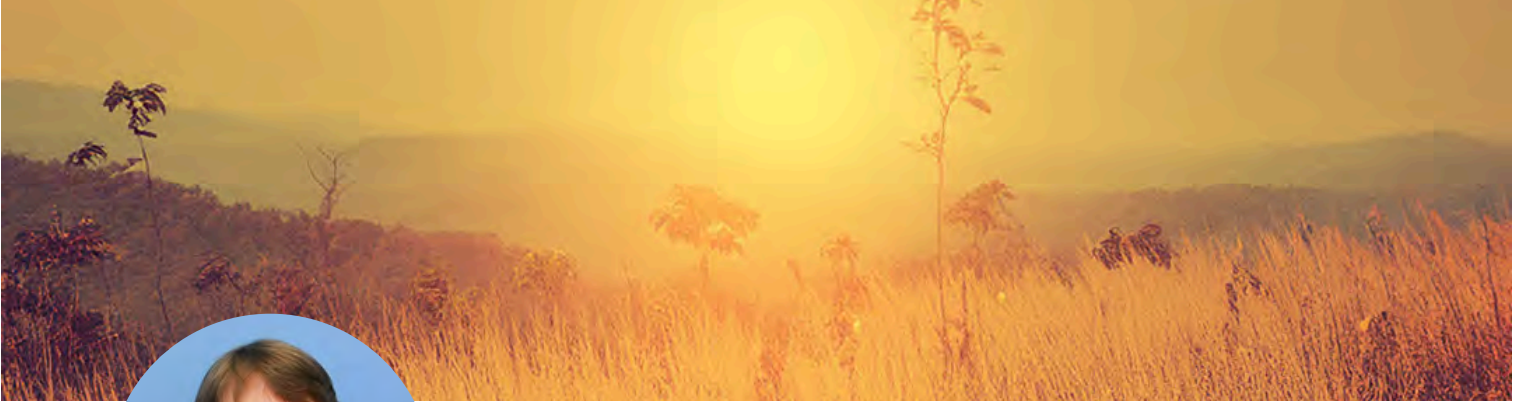


Explore Your Faith

We are excited to offer both a children’s and an adult Sunday school, as well as confirmation classes this year. ***These learning opportunities will begin on August 17*** and will be held after worship on all but the second Sundays of the month. The adult class (ALOFT) will be led by Brian Woods and will be based on Dr. Michael Youssef’s book, *You Want Me to Do What? Get Off Your Blessed Assurance and Do Something!* This engaging – and often entertaining – book follows the story of Joshua and is intended to help us see that we too can overcome our fear and reluctance and become the empowered outreach ministers that Jesus has called us to be.

GIFT, the children’s Sunday school class, will be using the re:form curriculum, which is a video, discussion, and activity-based way of answering some of the big questions of what it means to be a Christian and how we are to bring that identity into the world around us. John Mason will be the primary teacher, and he is looking forward to the fun that he and the children will have with the games and activities found in their “Anti-Workbooks” each week.

For confirmation, I plan on using *By Heart: Conversations With Martin Luther’s Small Catechism*. This resource walks the participants through the Lord’s Prayer, Apostles’ Creed, and the Ten Commandments in ways that make them easier to understand and to remember why they are important.

The books for each of these classes will be provided by the church, and we hope that you will come and be an active participant in whichever of these options fits you the best!

not all learning takes place in classrooms or formal settings with a teacher up front and students sitting at desks supposedly trying to absorb what they are hearing. Instead, some of our most powerful learning comes from people who are walking the same path as us but have had different experiences or insights than we have.

As part of our continual learning hear, our leadership teams have been focusing on learning new ways to reach our neighbors with the Good News of Jesus. We went through a course together called Church Marketing, which helped us to think about what we are doing in new ways – and it was helpful! But not wanting it to stop there, the church has generously agreed to put me through the Effective Church Network, a coaching course that is specifically designed for pastors. This course consists of self-paced modules of instruction, plus small group coaching sessions each week, and accountability through email and a Facebook group where we are challenged to say what we have done in the past week to reach our neighbors or grow our church.

The six modules of instruction are:

1. *Identify Your Calling:* Get clear about who your church can effectively reach in your community.
2. *Focus Your Content:* Create events and content that are vitally important to your target audience.
3. *Get Ready for Guests:* Ensure your hospitality is excellent.

4. *Extend Your Ministry:* Model church growth, don't just talk about it.
5. *Retain Your Guests:* Turn your first-time visitors into returning guests through effective follow-up.
6. *Increase Your Baptisms:* Implement a disciple-making strategy that transforms lives.

Each of these modules contain multiple video lessons and a workbook to help us process and plan ways to implement what we are learning. I am currently working my way through Module 2, and am already amazed by the new ways I am learning to see what we are already doing, how we could be doing it better, and other things we could be doing. If you would like to learn more about this program or join me for any of these training sessions, please let me know. I would welcome your input!

Either way, while I am primarily the one going through this learning process, the learning cannot stop with me. So, you will be hearing a lot about ways in which we can all work together to grow God's footprint in our community and welcome more of our neighbors into the Body of Christ in this place. I am already sharing what I learn with our leadership and marketing teams, and together we will be planning ways to put these ideas into practice.

Yes, this is going to take a lot of work, but nothing worthwhile is ever easy. And I know that there is nothing that we cannot do together with God's help.

Resource Management Commission

The Resource Management Commission (RMC) is responsible for ensuring that Redeemer succeeds both spiritually and operationally in accordance with God's teachings. The RMC ensures careful stewardship of financial resources and prudent allocation of the assets God has entrusted to us.

There are many components of the RMC. The Finance Committee prepares an annual financial budget, reviews the monthly reports on income and expenditure, and submits recommendations to the Church Council. The Growing God's Gift Team (formerly Stewardship) encourages our members to use their time, talent, and financial resources to support God's work at Redeemer, in our community, and in the world. The Endowment/Scholarship Committee manages all of our endowed funds and determines what scholarships and grants will be made. And the Counting Team counts and deposits all offerings and other revenues of Redeemer. The RMC maintains transparent records and confidentiality of donor contributions to preserve trust within the congregation.

Church Council met on July 15 and approved the monthly financial statement and the Commission reports.

Old Business included review of this year's successful VBS, planning for the Get to Know Your Neighbors Gathering on August 23 from 9-11, and planning for Rally Day on August 3. The Columbarium proposal was approved, and the Disaster Preparedness team observed Shutter installation on July 19.

New Business included developing an audit team, review of the monthly calendar, and review of Child Care and Sexual Misconduct Policies. Other items included donation of an electronic sign, and a vote to pay Savannah Glass for repair of narthex and sanctuary windows.

A Christian Steward is Prayerful

In Jeremiah 29:11-12 the Lord declares, "For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you." Before a contractor builds a structure, an architect must first draw plans. These plans must be complete in every detail: proper materials, proper use of space, and proper organization to maximize the efficient use of space. As our creator, God is our architect. God has plans for each of us. Our life in this world is a continuous period of construction. During the period of construction of a structure, the contractor frequently consults with the architect. During our period of life in this world, each one should frequently consult through prayer with God, our architect.

Prayer is a powerful tool. Prayer does not require any special talent, license, or permission. Prayer does not require certain content to be included or to be excluded. Prayer is not restricted by time. Prayer can occur at any time, by anyone, and can be any length. Prayer is simply having a conversation with God.

Be a prayerful steward by acknowledging the greatness and goodness of God through prayer, fellowship, study, worship, and the utilization of gifts.
