Dear Beloveds in Christ,

Music has always held a unique place in the lives of people of faith. In fact, one of the earliest ways in which people learned their faith was by singing the Psalms. Energy Reduction and Facility Improvements at Redeemer

The Property Committee has been diligently working to lower our costs associated with energy and be better stewards for our environment. Redeemer has partnered with Georgia Interfaith Power & Light (GIPL) by enrolling in their Solar Wise and Energy Wise programs. We have received several proposals to install solar panels which would reduce our electrical consumption. We have had an Energy Audit conducted of our facility to see where we could implement Energy Conservation Measures. GIPL conducted briefings to Church Council and Property Committee members of findings for both programs. Because of our enrollment in the Power Wise Program, Redeemer is eligible to submit for matching grants from GIPL for the next five years to implement the Energy Conservation Measures recommended in our Energy Audit. Grants could be up to 50% of the cost of the project but will not exceed \$7,000.

Redeemer's Property Committee has also developed a priority list of projects that are needed to improve our facility, reduce energy consumption, and to be better stewards of our facility and environment. This list continues to be revised based on completion of projects. Projects already completed include the repairing the entrance to our parking lot, removal of several trees, new HVAC unit for one room in the education wing, labyrinth renewal, clearing of the land for greater visibility of Redeemer from Wilmington Island Way, security cameras installed, resealing of narthex, sanctuary, and stained glass windows, building a fence behind the Columbarium,

and having a walkway from the front of the church to the Columbarium. We have accomplished many projects, but there are many more projects to be completed as a part of the long-term vision for our facility.

The Church Council has approved submission for a grant request to GIPL for the replacement of the old, single pane windows in two of our rooms and an exterior door in the education wing used by Explorers Montessori. We will find out if we received a matching grant for \$7,000 in December. There will be a presentation at December's Second Sunday Brunch concerning this initiative and coordinated ministries associated with this long-term vision to

becoming better stewards of our environment and caring for creation. Redeemer has formed a "GREEN TEAM" and if interested to become a member, please contact Jim Heater for additional information.

In worship, music also forms us. The melodies and lyrics we sing week after week settle into our hearts and help to shape how we understand God. In fact, one of the greatest gifts of music is that a song can lead us to remember what matters and bring us peace, even when our world seems to be spinning wildly out of control. Whether loud and joyful or quiet and meditative, music invites us to come together and enter fully into worship, rather than just observing it.

As we move into the new year in the church – which begins this year on November 30, the first Sunday in Advent – we have multiple opportunities to come together and be uplifted by the gift of music. Yes, we sing together every time we worship, but this is even more true on the upcoming Wednesday evenings, as we will again sing the Holden Evening Prayer service. And, of course, on Christmas Eve and during the Christmas Season, we will once again be singing some of our most beloved Christmas carols. There is just something beautiful about lifting our voices together in joy, thanksgiving, and praise!

In the month of December, we will also have two more opportunities to bring music into our lives – the Hilton Head Choral Society's Christmas Concert that will be held at 7:00 at the First Presbyterian church on Hilton Head Island on December 5, and

the Cantata that will be held at 3:00 at the Wilmington Island Methodist Church on December 14. No, these are not sing-alongs, but they offer the gift of music in a different way – one that you don't have to feel you can sing to enjoy.

Throughout the Seasons of Advent and Christmas, the music we share in worship helps us slow down, pay attention, and remember what these seasons are really about. Then the music we sing and hear become more than melodies that fill the sanctuary, they become a source of peace that steadies us in our waiting, opens our hearts to God's nearness, and reminds us that the Holy One still chooses to come close. These songs don't need to be perfect to matter – they just need to be sincere as we make a joyful noise to our Lord.

My hope is that the music we sing together will give us a sense of God's presence, encourage us in the weeks ahead, and help us carry the hope of Christ into our everyday lives long after the worship services end. November 2025

- Church Council met on November 18 and approved the monthly financial statement and the Commission reports.
- **Explorer's Montessori Update**- The Building Usage Agreement was discussed and their new monthly fee will increase to \$2750 in June.

Old Business:

- **ECN** –Pastor Lynne would like to begin forming First Impression Teams soon.
- **Annual Audit Update** has been completed by Jim Drinnon and his team. There were no significant findings.
- **The ELCA Youth Protection Policy** is scheduled to be discussed in January.
- **Nominating Committee** - Church Council openings will be presented in December to vote on at the Congregational Meeting to be held in January.
- **2026 Budget Preparation**- Commission budget reports are due November 30.
- **Comcast Business Phones Update** - Waiting for new phones from Comcast.
- **Energy Audit Update** - The Energy Audit plan was presented to all Council members to review. Jim Heater will submit an energy grant.

- **Grace Ministry** - Redeemer will sponsor one dinner the first Tuesday each month at Ascension Lutheran Church's Grace Ministry program beginning December 2025 through June 2026.
- **Second Sunday Brunch** - Visioning Team and Pastor Lynne will make presentations at the brunch to be held on December 14.
- **Hearing Impaired Adapters** for those who need assistance in hearing the worship service is being looked into.

Community Benevolence Fund



A Christian Steward is Trustworthy

In Exodus 18:20-21, Jethro, the father-in-law of Moses, gives him some advice about selecting judges for the people. Jethro tells Moses, "You should look for able men among all the people, men who fear God, are trustworthy, and hate dishonest gain; set them as officers over thousands, hundreds, fifties, and tens." The key advice given by Jethro is that those he selects must be trustworthy. If someone is trustworthy, they will make wise decisions that will be fair and equitable for all parties involved. All leaders of groups of people must be trustworthy, or their leadership will be unsuccessful.

In Daniel 6:3-5, we learn that the king planned to appoint Daniel to govern the whole kingdom because of his exceptional qualities. Upon hearing this, there were other governors and administrators who tried to find grounds for charges against Daniel to discredit him. However, they could find no corruption in him because he was trustworthy. Daniel's trustworthiness guaranteed his successful position of leadership. Our world leaders of today should have the same exceptional qualities as Daniel.

While on this earth, we are all stewards of God's creation. God has placed trust in us to be responsible caretakers. 1 Corinthians 4:1-2 states, "Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy." Christian stewards are required to make intelligent decisions concerning the resources placed within their care. All Christian stewards should be compassionate, content, generous, grateful, loving, loyal, obedient, prayerful, responsible, and trustworthy.
