

living, in our joint mission, and in our loving response to the disasters that happen all too frequently in our Synod.

In addition to the fellowship, we were blessed to hear from the Churchwide Representative to our Assembly, ELCA Churchwide Treasurer Lori Fedyk, Bishop Felix Malpica from the La Crosse Area Synod, and Dr. Lisa Kimball, our Keynote Speaker, who introduced herself as a layperson and part of the priesthood of all believers. All of these different messages and perspectives were impactful and thought provoking, as each addressed the theme of being called, gathered, and sent in different ways. (If you want to learn more, you can pick up summaries of my notes of what they said in the Narthex.)

Of course, we were also gathered to do the business of the Synod, which included elections for our Bishop, Synod Secretary, Synod Council members, and more, hearing from our churchwide partners, and adopting two memorials (For an End to the Occupation and Recognition of Palestinian Statehood in the United Nations, and To Affirm Transgender, Nonbinary, Gender Expansive, Two-Spirit, and Genderqueer People of God). Bishop Kevin Strickland was re-elected on the first ballot – which is a resounding affirmation of his ministry as the voting members simply wrote in the name of the person they felt was best suited for this call. The Rev. Ruth Hamilton was elected as Synod Secretary, and

the new Synod Council members are Beth Ford and Sarah Stewart. Elections are always exciting as we come together to discern and celebrate the people who will lead the church forward.

The next big gathering will be the Churchwide Assembly, which will meet from July 28 - August 2, 2025, in Phoenix, Arizona under the theme of Church for the Sake of the World. According to the ELCA website, "Early in her tenure, Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton set forth her own convictions to guide the members of the ELCA in understanding our unique identity: we are church; we are Lutheran; we are church together; we are church for the sake of the world ... Rooted in the ancient creeds, we are called to live boldly in service to a world longing for healing, justice and hope. We will continue to faithfully pursue God's mission of reconciliation for the life of the world."

As you can see, we belong to an active and engaged church in all three of its expressions – our local congregation, our Synod, and our Churchwide organization. And I would love for every one of you to experience a Synod – or even a Churchwide – Assembly at some point! If you are interested in this, please let me know!

## A Christian Steward is Obedient

Obedience of a Christian steward is demonstrating a commitment to God's commands and instructions as presented in the Scripture. An obedient steward is someone who acknowledges God's ownership of everything; who faithfully manages God's gifts of time, talents, and possessions; who follows God's will; who serves God and others; and who is focused on God's glory. We must be willing to sacrifice our personal desires or possessions for God's purposes.

Being obedient includes being a steward. Deuteronomy 14:22 states, "Be sure to set aside a tenth of all that your fields produce each year." Later in Deuteronomy, we read that all the tithes would be shared with those who have no allotment or inheritance and that the Lord will bless those who provided the tithes. In Malachi 3:7, the Lord Almighty says, "Return to me, and I will return to you."

An obedient Christian steward sets aside part of his or her income for others. As Christians, we have been blessed with the gifts of God. In obedience to the commands of God, we should reinvest a portion of our gifts in the work of the Lord. In business, the reinvestment of capital will yield a growing and prosperous company. Likewise, we should reinvest in the church for the growth and prosperity of Christianity. Although different people have been blessed with different gifts, we should all make a sincere effort to follow God's command by returning that portion of our income as we are able. An obedient Christian steward is one who releases control of possessions and dedicates a portion of his or her blessings to reinvest in the Kingdom of God.

# Church Council Minutes

## - June -

### **Explorer's Montessori (EMCC) Update:**

EMCC will be closed from July 2<sup>nd</sup> to July 5<sup>th</sup>. There are 17 students currently enrolled in the school.

### **Approvals:**

- **Minutes from May Church Council Meeting:** David motioned and Brian seconded. All members of the Council approved.
- **May 2025 Monthly Financial Statement:** Sylvia motioned and Robert seconded. All members of the Council approved.
- **May 2025 Commission Reports/Pastor's Report:** Peggy motioned and Sylvia seconded. All members of the Council approved.

### **Old Business:**

- **Ministry Interests** – Council Contact/ Committee Chair Liaisons are reminded to contact the members who signed up for their committees.
- **Get to Know Your Neighbors Update** – This Meet and Greet has been scheduled for August 23<sup>rd</sup> from 9-11. It will be held in our Social Hall. Community members will be invited for coffee and pastries to get to know each other.
- **VBS Update (July 7-11)** – There is a total of 37 registered for this great event. It is still not fully funded, and volunteers are still needed. Please look at the chart in the narthex and the sign-up sheet on the Call-to-Action table to see how you can help.
- **Visioning Team meeting update** – This committee has conducted two meetings, and an action plan is being developed to present to the congregation at a later date.
- **Disaster Preparedness Plan update** – This committee has met once. Jim Drinnon is looking into the CEMA guidelines and the Synod information.
- **Columbarium Proposal** – The Columbarium Committee is continuing to review the proposal.

- **Solar Review Update - GIPL** – Jim Heater has provided us with the information concerning the solar panels. It was discussed that we would wait on this until the windows in the narthex are repaired.
- **SE Synod Assembly update** – Pastor Lynne provided a short update of her trip to the Synod Assembly with the Drinnons. Bishop Strickland was re-elected on the first ballot and a new Synod Secretary was also elected.

### **New Business:**

- **Effective Church Network** – This is the oldest church consulting company in the United States. The Council voted to pay the \$99 monthly fee to provide Pastor Lynne (and others as invited) some additional training and coaching to assist in relationship building and church growth.
- **Upward Sports - Be the Neighborhood Church** – It is an additional way to reach out to the community and its youth. It was decided that it will be something to review in the future.
- **Camp in the City** – This is a program sponsored by Holy Spirit Lutheran Church for underprivileged youth. It was voted to donate \$200 to the camp that will be held from June 24<sup>th</sup> to July 1<sup>st</sup>.
- **St. Andrews Choir** – St. Andrews Choir director has contacted Pastor Lynne to see if they could use our building to perform 2 or 3 times a year. It was discussed that additional information needs to be obtained, but it was voted upon and approved.
