Dear Beloveds in Christ,

Some of you have heard this story, but I think it’s worth sharing again. When I was on internship, the church secretaries and I spent some considerable time decorating the sanctuary during the week leading up to Pentecost with cut-out doves, dove balloons, candles, and even flames over the doorway into the sanctuary. When Pastor John got up to deliver his sermon, he began by thanking us for all of our hard work – but then, he said that he doesn’t really think of the Holy Spirit as a dove – and our hearts sank. But he went on to explain that he much prefers the Celtic

## VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

### It’s Going to be a Wild Time

We are excited about our upcoming VBS, which will be held at Redeemer from July 7-14. Our theme this year is **True North – learning to trust Jesus in this wild world**, and we need your help. Below are several ways that you can participate to make this a successful event.

#### Funding for VBS

VBS (9am-noon) is free to all students. Our anticipated cost for VBS is \$20/day for each child. This includes (but is not limited to) supplies, teaching materials, snacks, tee shirts, closing celebration and lunch for families. The following are received or anticipated funds:

- A \$500 grant has been approved from the Endowment Committee
- \$250 Trivent Action Plan have been applied for
- \$300 from the Learning Commission budget
- Instead of graduation gifts, Vicar Audra has generously asked that donations go to Redeemer’s VBS or other summer programs for children.



#### How You Can Help Sponsor VBS

A graphic on the bulletin board in the narthex will show our progress. Each box represents funding completed for a child for the day indicated. \$20 funds a child for one day of VBS. \$100 funds a student for a week. Any amount is acceptable, so please give as you are able. Envelopes are provided and can be dropped in the offering plate.

- After-Care helpers from 12-3 each day

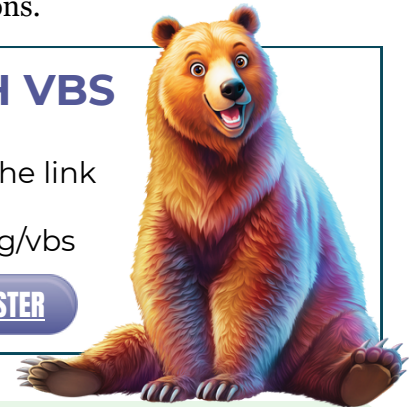

representation of the Spirit as a wild goose because He keeps on pecking at you continually until He has steered you in the direction He wants you to go. That, of course, made all kinds of sense – but I have still never seen a sanctuary decorated for Pentecost with wild geese. Maybe someday!

The truth is that the Holy Spirit is the animating and leading force within and around all of us. And yet, I think we are much more aware of this in the church setting than out in the world. Pentecost, after all, is considered the birthday of the church, but the Spirit is not contained in the building – He/She is part of each and every one of us and accompanies us both in church and out in the world every minute of every day. We may not notice or pay attention to the Spirit's direction in our lives, but it is always there. Some people tend to see this guidance as our conscience, or the angel on our shoulder, but the activity of the Spirit goes so much deeper than that. Jesus gifted us with His Spirit so that we would always have access to Him, as well as a live-in reminder of His teachings and direction of His plans for us. With that understanding, the

image of the wild goose has come to make more and more sense to me, because I have personally experienced the Spirit's relentless prodding. I would love to hear about those times when you have experienced the Spirit continuously pecking at you, too!

It is this tenacious nature of the Spirit that leads and directs our churches and our ministries as well. For we need the Spirit to continue to lead and guide us, simply because we can't do any of this on our own. And the same is true in our daily lives – although this is easy to forget as we have so many decisions to make, and we often end up doing so without consulting God first.

The true gift of Pentecost is the Spirit that helps us to know and follow our Lord and leads us to offer Him our praise and worship. And we are tremendously blessed to have the Spirit so active among us! May our hearts and minds continue to be open to following wherever the Spirit is leading us.

## Caring for Redeemer's Future Legacy Giving


Legacy Giving. Bequest. Endowment Fund. Trust Account. Estate Planning. These terms are usually associated with the wealthy and are thought to be too complicated for the average person to consider. Yes, these are actions that wealthy people do implement, but the average person could implement these same actions with proper planning. The purpose of these types of giving is to finance the future and to perpetuate the existence of an organization and its mission.

There is an excellent example here in Chatham County to demonstrate the impact of legacy giving. Thanks to an estate plan and charitable trust, the United Way of the Coastal Empire has been provided with an endowment fund that generates enough income each year to pay all administrative expenses. Therefore, 100% of donations to the United Way are available for distribution to the many charitable organizations it supports. Just imagine the programs that Redeemer could support if all administrative expenses were paid by an endowment fund.

Redeemer must have a financial plan for the future. There are members of Redeemer who have experience with financial planning and these types of legacy giving. A document will be written to provide guidance for legacy giving, bequests, endowment funds, trust accounts, and estate planning. More information will be provided on request.

## A Christian Steward is Loyal

In Matthew 6:24, Jesus tells us, “No one can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.” Serving a master requires being loyal to a master. To be a loyal person, one must have qualities of being faithful, trustworthy, devoted, dependable, and dedicated. As humans living on this earth, this can be a challenge as we are always striving to balance the many duties, responsibilities, and activities that are part of our daily lives.

As loyal Christian stewards, we should always be mindful of who we are, whose we are, and why we are here on this earth. Each person is born into a family and can also have a church family. We are here to fulfill God’s plan for his creation, and God has given us talents, abilities, knowledge, and experiences. With the assets that God has provided, we can strive to be loyal and serve God faithfully.
