***Art as Healing: Voices Against Violence***, an exhibition at ***St Paul’s Cathedral’s Transept Gallery from May to June 2026.***

This exhibition is a collaboration between the PVAW Program, Holstep Health’s Living Well Family Violence group, and St Margaret’s Church in Eltham.

It brings together artists from diverse backgrounds and lived experiences, each of whom has been affected by family violence—many as survivors. Through their work, the artists explore themes of transformation, renewal, and healing, conveying a powerful message of hope: that despite the impacts of violence, the resilience, strength, and faith of women and children endure.

To celebrate the exhibition and raise vital funds for the PVAW Program, a reception evening will be held at **St Paul's Cathedral from 6:00–8:30pm on Thursday, 4 June.**

Guests will enjoy light refreshments while viewing the exhibition and hearing from speakers on family violence and the role of the Anglican church in prevention efforts.
