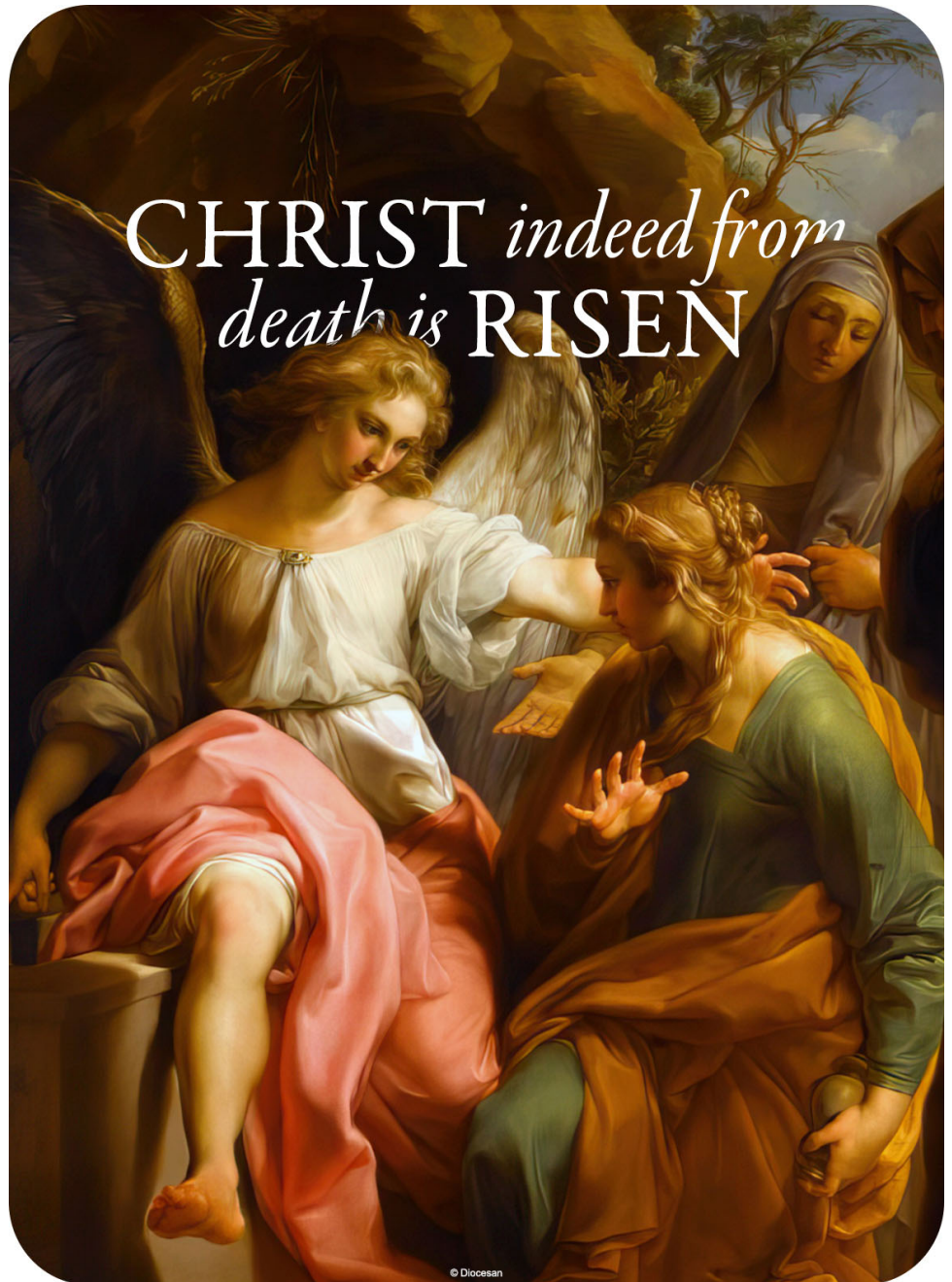

From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners of Saint Liborius parish and Saint Boniface church,

Thank you!

Thank you to all those who have helped to make our liturgies throughout the year truly blessed and especially our liturgies this Holy Week...all of our cantors, choir and musicians, lectors and EMHCs, altar servers and ushers and a special thanks to our Knights who cleaned the church, our volunteers who decorated and made this Holy Week beautiful!

Easter Sunday!

As we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord, we recognize the great love that our Lord has for us and His desire that we share His divine life with Him. He invites us into a deep relationship with Him that begins with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit given and strengthened through the regular reception of the Sacraments. This requires our commitment, effort and proper disposition when receiving the Sacraments and then giving thanks in prayer. This cannot be a one shot deal but a way of life...a way of life which places Christ, His Church, His Sacraments, a real prayer life and acts of virtue and charity at the very center.

Our Lord has truly risen as he promised. Alleluia! As we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord, we are reminded that faith deals in life and death. During the course of our life, we will encounter many joys and also sorrows...not only in times of pandemic. Parents will see their children growing up and, hopefully, succeeding in their careers...perhaps raising a family...perhaps choosing a religious vocation...or simply being a committed and faithful Catholic and Christian. We will also experience illness and the death of those we love...indeed ultimately each of us will encounter our mortality.

When does our faith become something that is lived and tested? We are invited this Easter not to allow that moment to be our last moment on earth. We are invited to allow our faith to touch our heart, mind and soul right now...to profess the understanding that Christ's cross will be a part of our life and this is not a sign of a hole in Christ's love but an opportunity for our love to be more pure and true. The Resurrection reminds us that life on earth is a brief moment...an important moment...but one that is transitory. Our ultimate purpose is not here but eternal union with the Almighty and all-loving Lord.

Divine Mercy Sunday

Next Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. In the midst of a world that rushes to judgment and condemnation, our Church holds up a feast of Mercy. We remember our Lord's sacrifice and His conquering of sin and death in His Paschal Mystery. The liturgical texts of that day, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy, and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast, which had already been granted to the nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Saint Faustina Kowalska on 30 April 2000.

Please join us for praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3 pm at Saint Liborius preceded by confessions from 2:00-3:00 pm.

May Almighty God bless you and keep you.

Sacraments

Sacrament of Baptism

All parents asking for their children to be baptized must attend a Baptismal Prep class. Classes are held on the third Thursday of every month at 6:30 p.m. @ St. Liborius in the Church, with a reminder notice in the parish bulletin. If a child has already been baptized here no need to attend class again.

Please register for the class by calling the St. Liborius Parish Office at 708-754-1363. Godparents are also encouraged to attend the class. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays immediately following the 10:30am Mass. Families and attendees of the Baptism are encouraged to attend Mass as the Baptisms will commence immediately after Mass.

Sacrament of Marriage

Marriage preparation must begin a minimum of six months prior to the actual wedding date. Contact the parish office—St. Liborius (708-754-1363) or St. Boniface (708-534-9682) to begin the process.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of the priest, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ.

Due to the Privacy Act, hospitals can no longer inform us when a parishioner is admitted to the hospital. A close relative needs to call either Parish Office—St. Liborius (708-754-1363) or St. Boniface (708-534-9682) to request an anointing.

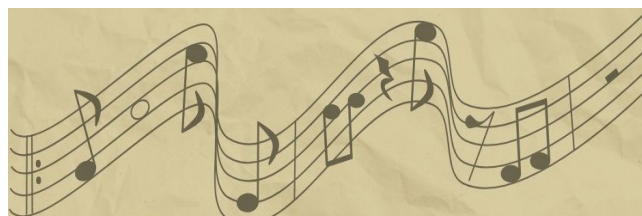

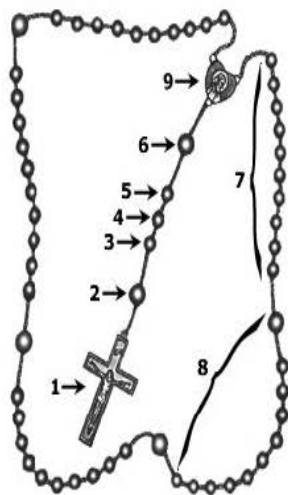

How to Recite the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited using ordinary Rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska* and followed by a closing prayer.



1. Make the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Optional Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

3. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

4. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

5. The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

6. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the Remaining Decades

Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in Whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself

Novena to Divine Mercy (April 3-12)

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death." (*Diary*, 1209)

"Today bring to Me..."

First Day: all mankind, especially all sinners

Second Day: the souls of priests and religious

Third Day: all devout and faithful souls

Fourth Day: those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Me

Fifth Day: the souls of those who have separated themselves from My church

Sixth Day: the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children

Seventh Day: the souls who especially venerate and glorify My mercy

Eighth Day: the souls who are detained in Purgatory

Ninth Day: souls who have become lukewarm

...and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy."

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy, You impart Your graces in great abundance to each and all. Receive us into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart and never let us escape from It. We beg this grace of You by that most wonderful love for the heavenly Father with which Your Heart burns so fiercely.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon faithful souls, as upon the inheritance of Your Son. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, grant them Your blessing and surround them with Your constant protection. Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

In the *Diary* of St. Faustina, Jesus asked that the Feast of Divine Mercy, known today as Divine Mercy Sunday, be preceded by a Novena to The Divine Mercy. A Novena is nine days of prayer in preparation for a feast. In the case of the Novena to The Divine Mercy, we pray the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy each day for a specific intention. **Our Lord told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw ... strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (*Diary*, 1209).**

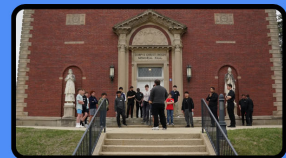
