

From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners of Saint Liborius parish and Saint Boniface church,

Make

This last week the priests of the Diocese of Joliet gathered for our convocation which occurs every other year. Bishop Hicks shared with us his pastoral letter entitled, "Make." You will get to read it on the launch weekend the first week in October. He takes, as his starting point, the last line of the Gospel of Saint Matthew, "Go and make disciples..." This, in some sense, is also a sequel to Bishop Conlon's pastoral letter entitled, "Go!"

All of us share the responsibility not simply to practice our faith privately but to go out and seek those who have been lost, those who have drifted off and those who have never heard the words of God. So, we will be hearing a great deal more about this challenge from our bishop in the coming weeks; however, one important an essential movement, in which we all can participate and which we can all accomplish with the Grace of God, is to make certain we have a strong deep friendship with Jesus Christ and begin praying that these efforts of Bishop Hicks will bear great fruit in our lives and the lives of those we love...and those we have never met.

Sacraments

Sacrament of Baptism

All parents asking for their children to be baptized must attend a Baptismal Prep class. Classes are held on the third Thursday of every month at 6:30 p.m. @ St. Liborius in the Church, with a reminder notice in the parish bulletin. If a child has already been baptized here no need to attend class again.

Please register for the class by calling the St. Liborius Parish Office at 708-754-1363. Godparents are also encouraged to attend the class. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays immediately following the 10:30am Mass. Families and attendees of the Baptism are encouraged to attend Mass as the Baptisms will commence immediately after Mass.

Sacrament of Marriage

Marriage preparation must begin a minimum of six months prior to the actual wedding date. Contact the parish office—St. Liborius (708-754-1363) or St. Boniface (708-534-9682) to begin the process.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of the priest, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ.

Due to the Privacy Act, hospitals can no longer inform us when a parishioner is admitted to the hospital. A close relative needs to call either Parish Office—St. Liborius (708-754-1363) or St. Boniface (708-534-9682) to request an anointing.






