#### **Pastoral Council**

Members should be willing to contribute to the welfare of the parish and the overall mission not getting caught up in negative gossip but promoting a positive view of our parish's direction. This is the only way our parish will grow and fulfill our mission to invite others to discipleship and a loving relationship with Christ and His Church.

The pastoral council will meet quarterly with the date and time being posted prior to the meeting. Although not serving on the pastoral council, any parishioner may attend. Any parishioner wishing to speak at the pastoral council must submit their request in writing to the pastor no less than one week in advance of the meeting <a href="fathermilota@outlook.com">fathermilota@outlook.com</a>.

### Sacraments

#### Sacrament of Baptism

All parents asking for their children to be baptized must attend a Baptismal Prep class. Classes are held on the third Thursday of every month at 6:30 p.m. @ St. Liborius in the Church, with a reminder notice in the parish bulletin. If a child has already been baptized here no need to attend class again.

Please register for the class by calling the St. Liborius Parish Office at 708-754-1363. Godparents are also encouraged to attend the class. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays immediately following the 10:30am Mass. Families and attendees of the Baptism are encouraged to attend Mass as the Baptisms will commence immediately after Mass.

#### Sacrament of Marriage

Marriage preparation must begin a minimum of six months prior to the actual wedding date. Contact the parish office—St. Liborius (708-754-1363) or St. Boniface (708-534-9682) to begin the process.

#### Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of the priest, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ.

Due to the Privacy Act, hospitals can no longer inform us when a parishioner is admitted to the hospital. A close relative needs to call either Parish Office—St. Liborius (708-754-1363) or St. Boniface (708-534-9682) to request an anointing.
