### WAYS YOUR CONGREGATION OR COMMUNITY CAN HELP

- Donate to your local food pantry. Did you know that \$1 donated to *Great Plains Food Bank* helps provide \$4 worth of groceries to neighbors in need!
- Host a food drive for your local pantry.
- If you have extra, unopened, shelf stable, nonperishable, not expired food, drop it off at your local pantry.


## SEEKING STORIES! - Hunger/SNAP/Food Security

# Minot Area Youth Groups: Making an Impact

In September, youth from eight ELCA congregations in and around Minot gathered under the spreading trees of Oak Park, turning a pleasant autumn evening into a vibrant outdoor sanctuary for nearly 300 worshipers.

As part of the service, supplies were collected for Fresh Start Kits, sturdy backpacks prepared for people stepping out of the Youth Correctional Center, the North Dakota State Penitentiary, and the Missouri River Correctional Center. Each kit is a small anchor of hope, filled with practical essentials and the quiet message, "You're not alone as you begin again."

By the end of the night, more than 60 Fresh Start Kits were packed, and later delivered to Trinity Lutheran Church in Bismarck, ready to be placed in the hands of those about to take their next brave step.

The Parish Nurse Ministry Program of Concordia College in Moorhead, MN will be offering the Foundations of Faith Community Nursing course March 5, 12, and 19 (on-line via ZOOM) and April 9, 10, and 11 (in-person at First Lutheran Church, 619 N. Broadway, Fargo, ND, 58102). The deadline to register is February 5, 2026. The program is open to licensed RNs who are interested in personal growth and/or starting a health and healing ministry within a faith community.

The program cost of **\$450** includes the participant workbook, current practice standards for FCNs, and a binder of program specific materials. We are working on the application to offer 36.5 contact hours (ANCC).


