Hunger Sunday, October 12th

The first official Hunger Sunday will be celebrated in WND Synod on October 12th, 2025. Here you will find a worship liturgy to use. It is our hope that these worship resources could be used by congregations so that in unity with other ELCA congregations we can pray and seek an answer to the crippling hunger needs of our time. You are welcome to use all or some of the liturgy, sermon, children's sermon, hymn suggestions etc. to enhance your worship experience. When it has been prepared, a recorded sermon will be found on the Congregations page of the WND Synod website.

The Eastern and Western North Dakota Synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) are pleased to announce the calling of **Jen Engquist** as the first **Disaster Capacity Builder**.

This newly created position, funded through a three-year grant from Lutheran Disaster Response, will focus on building disaster resiliency and preparedness among ELCA congregations and communities across North Dakota. Engquist will work closely with both synods to recruit and support a statewide resiliency team, identify disaster-related challenges, build public advocacy capacity, and coordinate synod responses to disasters when they occur.

Engquist brings a wealth of experience in community building, justice-focused ministry, and international service. Most recently, she served as the Executive Director of a shelter for people who are unhoused and a community-building organization in Colorado, where she also welcomed youth groups to summer Service Learning Camps. Prior to that, she served as Country Program

Coordinator for the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission program in Cambodia, following her own YAGM year in Argentina. She has also served as a Director at Churches United in Moorhead, MN, worked in domestic poverty research and international development, and began her service to the church as a youth leader in a rural North Dakota congregation.

Engquist officially began her work with the Synods on September 8, 2025.




To help satisfy a growing need, DEM Tera Kossow has arranged for pastors of the WND Synod to provide one video sermon and manuscript to share each month.

LivingWorks FAITH Curriculum

Last year, the MN Department of Agriculture and partners in Wisconsin and South Dakota offered a Suicide Prevention for Rural Ministry course, which paired the online LivingWorks FAITH course with four virtual discussion sections.

This program reached 75 faith leaders in MN, ND, SD, and WI and received strong positive reviews from participants.

We have 40 additional enrollments for LivingWorks FAITH available, and we want them to be used! The course typically costs \$150 per person, but we're making it available to rural clergy and ministry leaders from any denomination or faith tradition at no charge. The simple online application form is here.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

Farm and rural suicides happen more frequently than in urban areas and are frequently shrouded with stigma. People may turn to clergy and other ministry leaders for help, but you may have little training in knowing how to ask someone about thoughts of suicide, how to connect them to help, or how to provide ministry after a suicide attempt or death.

ABOUT LIVINGWORKS FAITH

The course is interactive, online, and asynchronous (at your own pace). It takes approximately 6 hours to complete and teaches approaches and skills that will equip you for suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention (bereavement) tasks so you can effectively care for people who are struggling with thoughts of suicide or who have been impacted by suicide.

ELIGIBLITY

Applicants must be clergy or other ministry leaders who work in a rural area of Minnesota, Wisconsin, South Dakota, or North Dakota.
