




### Revenue by Income Type





Health and Wellness Day is a district-wide day to prioritize well-being. Students and families focus on their personal wellness through at-home activities and curriculum. Employees are offered a variety of activities and resources to focus on their personal health and wellness thanks to donations from our community partners. In addition, the Foundation provides funding for both student and staff wellness rooms. Schools with wellness rooms have shown decreases in incidents requiring principal intervention by as much as 90%.

### JEF Stories: Unified Sports Day T-shirts



Unified Sports day brings together nearly 1,000 Jordan School District Elementary Students with and without disabilities to team up in a variety of sports for the day.



Last year some kids had school T-shirts and some didn't. This year the event committee teamed up with the Jordan Education Foundation and was able to secure a donation from Destination Travel's Kip Lambert to provide T-shirts colored by school for all the kids to wear while they competed. These

T-shirts helped teachers to easily identify their students and also helped to create support for Unified Sports in the elementary schools. Afterwards, the kids got to take home the shirts as a memento of the fun-filled day.



## JEF Stories: Providing Music to a Special Ed class at Mountain Creek




Ms. Karlee English started a 'United Sound' program at Mountain Creek Middle School, which is a band consisting of students with special needs, paired with peer tutors who teach them how to play instruments. But Ms. English had a bit of a problem. She didn't have enough instruments to go around for the band. So, the Jordan Education Foundation, partnering with the local Legacy Retirement Communities, decided to step in and solve the problem. They showed up with a number of different instruments for the students, everything from violins, to trumpets, flutes, and clarinets.

Ms. English and her students were beyond excited and grateful for the generous gift. In fact, Karlee said for her students with special needs simply being able to make a sound on an instrument changes them, and being part of 'United Sound' is having a huge impact on their lives.


