# Badger Class Topic - Winter Wonderland Autumn 2 2025

### English:

We will be reading 2 books: Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers and Gorilla by Anthony Browne.

We will be focusing on using imaginative language:

Describing character and settings

Writing our own story

Drama and role play being the characters in the stories

Writing in full sentences and using conjunctions

Learning to use editing pens and set out our writing neatly.

We will also be doing handwriting three times a week.

#### Science: materials

- Children will observe changes across this season and compare it with different times of the year
- Children will observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
- Children will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive
- Children will identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other

# History/Geography

The children will identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles.

The children will learn key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
