Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to back to the Summer Term in Fox Class.

Please ensure that children are still wearing long sleeved tops and trousers (not dresses) as the stinging nettles will be out in force – attracting lots of wonderful wildlife but not always friendly to our skin!

Please could we also request that all children, even those who no longer have toileting accidents, have a **labelled** spare set of clothes (including pants and socks) in school with them. This is because there are occasions when children get wet or muddy and need to get changed to stay comfortable. If you could check bags at the end of the day for these wet clothes, it would also be helpful.

We are so impressed with the progress the children in Foxes are making in their phonics, reading and writing. Please continue to support them at home by going through their phonics folders, reading books from their reading folder, playing games with the phonics cards and the helpful word cards and if possible practising their handwriting too. The work you do make such a difference to their progress.
