


## Vocabulary

climate	The weather in one place over a long period of time.
tropical	Warm or hot throughout the whole year.
equator	An imaginary line around the centre of the Earth, dividing it into the North and South Hemispheres.
plantation	A large agricultural property growing a few crops on a large scale
harvest	To pick or gather crops.
export	To carry or send goods to another country for trade.
Fairtrade	A worldwide movement that helps farmers in less economically developed countries to receive a fair price for the goods they produce.
consumers	People who buy goods and services..
region	An area of land defined by similar characteristics.
economic	To do with wealth- not just money but also the production of goods and services.
cash crop	Anything that's grown or sold to make a profit.
tropics of Cancer and Capricorn	Imaginary latitude lines 23.5 degrees north and south of the equator. Within these boundaries lie the tropics, a region characterized by a tropical climate.

**Previous Learning** - In KS1, pupils learnt about the seasons in Britain, the continents of the world, and about tropical climate zones. Hedgehogs have previously used atlases to locate countries of the world.

**Intended Learning** - Pupils will learn what Fair Trade Chocolate is, and what it means for workers and consumers. They will understand types of settlement and land use, economic activity and trade links, and be able to compare the life of a cocoa farmer with the life of a farmer in Oxfordshire.
