### Topics:

Trash Billing Postcard Stock

Fiscal Officer Evans stated Jess brought up a suggestion which she thought was really brilliant. A lot of people lose their trash bill because it is white. Fiscal Officer Evans stated last time she purchased card stock it was \$53.00 for 1000 sheets of white. Right now, it is \$73.59 for the same package. Bright yellow is \$63.20 or we can choose green, yellow, green, or pink that is more of a pastel color for \$43.07. Since it is less expensive for the pastel, she asked the Board which color they would choose. She suggested the fluorescent yellow or green.

Trustee Johnston suggested to go with green and if we find there is still a
lot of loss, to go with the fluorescent color next time.

Trustee Warner asked to put a notice on Facebook and the website to notify residents the trash bills will be changing.

iWorQ Issues/Trash Billing Issues

Fiscal Officer Evans stated Jess sent all of us emails the past couple weeks, most of which involved the assessment letters that have recently gone out. The first one is for Entity #100918. iWorQ shows no payments since 5/2/24. The resident states this is not correct. He said that he always puts cash payments in the drop box. Based off his pay history, that is correct. Jess did find 2 old receipt books but there are no receipts for those payments. Fiscal Officer Evans stated that Lisa did not write receipts for payments in the drop box. The resident is stating that he has made all of his payments since May of 2024, but none of them have been applied to his account.

Trustee Johnston asked he has a history of paying in cash?

• Fiscal Officer Evans stated yes, he has a history of paying in cash, but that is 4 billing cycles now that raises the question of where did that cash go?

Trustee Heeter stated yeah, that's a problem.

 Trustee Warner said he has never been a fan of trash payments in the drop box but how do you get away from that. He said one of the things he has asked Jess to start doing and he thought he had asked Lisa to do it, is to write receipts for payments in the drop box.

Fiscal Officer Evans confirmed that Jess writes receipts for all

payments.

Trustee Johnston stated that Lisa was writing on their card if they walked in with a payment but she wasn't writing anything for any

payments put in the drop box.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated correct, and she believes that even the residents that came in person, she was asking if they wanted a receipt rather than just automatically writing one. She said what Jess does is write for everyone even if they say that don't want one she will advise that she needs it for her records and just not provide them a copy.

 Trustee Warner stated when she started he asked her to make sure she writes receipts for all payments even if they are put in the

drop box.

• Fiscal Officer Evans stated she does, for this reason. We have no way to prove that he did or did not make these payments.

Trustee Johnston said we are going to have to zero him out.

- Trustee Warner said we are going to have to take his word for it.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated the next one is Entity #101342. They had received a letter for \$308. They just purchased that property on 3/14/25. That property is just land and kind of a junk yard with an uninhabitable mobile home.

Trustee Warner asked if we have an address for that.

- Fiscal Officer Evans stated we do. She said they own the parcel next to it and pay the trash bill for the parcel next to it.
- Trustee Warner asked how there is even an account for it if it is just
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated when iWorQ was set up, it is used for zoning and trash payments. Every parcel has an entity #. She said that is what most of these are. In November/December of last year a lot of parcels were activated and they don't even have homes on them.

Trustee Warner asked how that happened.

■ Fiscal Officer Evans advised by the previous office assistant and she had brought that up before that it should not have happened and now it is catching up to us.

 Trustee Johnston stated that Rumpke requires us to update who is living where and Lisa took that as if it has an address, then it needs

to pay a trash bill.

- Fiscal Officer Evans stated the address is 218 N Church St in New Lebanon. The owner address is different because they don't live there, they live on the next parcel. She stated they just purchased it 3/14/25 which she and Jess had both verified on the Auditor's website. They don't believe they should have to pay the bill because no one has lived there in years and they own the adjacent property which they do have trash service at. She stated also, per the notes on the account, the balance was assessed to the trash bill in 2023. This was another situation where the trash billing was turned back on when it should not have been.
- Trustee Warner asked in 2023?
- Fiscal Officer Evans said no it was turned back on in November/December 2024.
- Trustee Heeter asked if all that has been corrected.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said no it has not. She said she told Jess since there are so many of these, we should ask the Board before we start zeroing them out.
- Trustee Warner asked if there is a way to get a compiled list.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised Jess will have to go through every individual account to do that and right now she is working on the tax assessments.
- Fiscal Officer Evans asked if the Board agrees to zero this account out as well.
- Trustee Johnston said zero it.

- Fiscal Officer Evans said the next one is 102563. This resident called on 8/27/25 asking why trash service has been reinstated after 5 years of no service. The notes on the account start on 12/11/24 that the previous office assistant had the zoning administrator drive by the property and he reported back that there are no trash cans and junk cars at the property. The owner's phone number was disconnected so the office assistant left a message for the previous renter. The same day, the renter called back and said he is still renting the property. The next note states that Lisa advised the renter she would begin billing that quarter, fourth quarter 2024. On August 4th, Fiscal Officer Evans received the bill returned in the mail which was in the name of the renter which we cannot do for tax assessment purposes. She put that back in the owner's name. She got on the Auditor's website and mailed the bill to the owner's address on the Auditor's website, which triggered the owner to call and ask why he was being billed on a property that hasn't been billed in 5 years. She said she understands that he has not been billed in 5 years, but according to the notes on the account from Lisa, there is a renter living at the property. The renter was sending the mail back to the Township stating that no one lives there.
  - Trustee Warner asked if the trash bill was in the renter's name.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans stated yes, it was in the renter's name.
  - Trustee Warner stated it should have been in the owner's name.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans stated correct, and now the owner is upset because the trash billing was turned off 5 years ago so the Township was allowing him to not have trash service.
  - Trustee Johnston stated the owner should be assessing the renter.
  - Trustee Warner said right.
  - Trustee Johnston said if you're renting a place it tells you what utilities are included and that's what the owner should be doing with that property.
  - Trustee Warner stated the other thing we don't know is if this owner had been renting this property in the past and they were picking up trash and it was never collected.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans stated Jess is extremely pro-active and she contacted Rumpke and had them send her a list of every address where trash is currently being picked up so she will be able to cross-reference whether or not they are picking trash up at this house. She said she did ask Jess to see if they are picking trash up at this residence. She asked if the Board wants to say if they are picking it up they need to pay it but what if they are not picking it up since he has not been billed for 5 years? He is now under the impression that this is okay.
  - Trustee Heeter asked there's somebody living there, right?
  - Fiscal Officer Evans said yes.
  - Trustee Heeter stated then he should be billed. It's up to him how he collects that trash money.
  - Trustee Johnston asked what if they are not picking up trash at that address.
  - Trustee Heeter said then it needs to happen.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans said the next one is really tricky. There are 3 entity numbers for one parcel because there are 2 houses on one parcel and one of those houses is split into 2 apartments. She stated she was in the office when the owner came in the other day. There were no permits pulled when the second residence was built, so the Auditor never knew there was a second house on that parcel.
    - Trustee Warner asked what the address is on that.
    - Fiscal Officer Evans stated it is actually 2 different addresses on one parcel.
    - Trustee Heeter said and Rumpke goes by parcel.
    - Fiscal Officer Evans said one is 5491 Crawford Toms and the other is 5473 Crawford Toms. She said the house that is 2 units is not going to be 2 units anymore and that is the issue she is running into now. She needs this to just be 2 entities on 1 parcel because it is 2 buildings. She is knocking down the dividing wall and making this 1 home. She stated these accounts are paid in full, she has

always paid when she is supposed to. She just needs one of these entities to be deactivated.

- Trustee Johnston said so it's 2 separate buildings.
- Trustee Warner said it's 2 houses, 2 residential homes.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said 2 residential homes and 1 of those homes was 2 apartments. It is 2 houses, but 3 residences on 1 parcel. She stated it was marked in iWorQ as A,B,C. She said she was looking at this again today and there are notes on the account from Lisa that it was confusing to her when they would mail the payment in because it says it is for 5491 A,B,C but it is in here as 5473. When the resident was in the other day she said she doesn't even know what her real address is. Fiscal Officer Evans said she asked her what the Auditor's website says.
- Trustee Heeter asked what does it say?
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she thinks it is 5473.
- Trustee Heeter said Rumpke charges per parcel, which is only 1 and we are billing for 3.
- Trustee Johnston asked if they have been paying for 3?
- Fiscal Officer Evans said yes, she has been paying for 3 trash bills.
- Trustee Heeter asked and they have 2 separate numbers?
- Trustee Warner said there's 3.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said there are 3 account numbers for 1 parcel in iWorQ.
- Trustee Warner asked if there are 3 bills going out?
- Fiscal Officer Evans said yes, there are 3 bills.
- Trustee Heeter asked who created the entities.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated it was Karen.
- Trustee Heeter said so we created the entities so if there is proof there is only 2 entities then we only charge for 2.
- Fiscal Officer Evans verified that it is okay to deactivate the third entity in iWorQ.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said the last one is 102295. 4331 Sulphur Springs Road is vacant. There is not electric and no one has lived in that house in over 11 years. The owner lives at 4551. There are notes on the account from November 20,2024 that state not sure why account is inactive, letter to be sent December 2, 2024 to let owner know will be reactivated. Service was discontinued in 2014.
  - Trustee Warner said that's a no-brainer there.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans stated that's another one that should not have been reactivated.
- Trustee Johnston brought up the \$308 assessment letter for Cynthia Moran.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans she talked to her for over an hour and completely forgot to add her to the list.
  - Trustee Warner asked what this one is about.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans stated this is where her daughter lives.
     Cynthia received a tax assessment letter for the farmland, not where the home is, but for the farmland.
  - Trustee Johnston said this is for the farmland that was split off when Cynthia's father passed away. Her daughter purchased the land where the home is. He said the farmland is separate and that is what she got the bill on.
  - Fiscal Officer Evans verified 102157 also needs to be brought back to zero and deactivated.

### ProSource Contract

- Fiscal Officer Evans advised Trustee Johnston that they had reached out to her the other day.
- Fiscal Officer Evans provided the Board with a copy of the ProSource contract. She advised she had to email them to get a copy of it as it was never provided to her.
- Trustee Johnston stated the background is that the Police Department and Zach signed a 5-year contract on the printers.
- Trustee Heeter asked if that was for the printer in the Police Department.

Fiscal Officer Evans advised one is on the administrative side but the admin side was not a part of that agreement. She said that is why the last page where the Fiscal Officer signature is, is an addendum to the contract because she advised ProSource the Township cannot enter into an agreement without the Fiscal Officer's signature. She said that she did not know until she got the copy of this contract that both of those printers are leased to the Police Department.

Trustee Heeter said so one is in there and one is out here and it is a 5-vear contract.

Trustee Johnston asked what are they saying about modifying.

Fiscal Officer Evans advised it is the same thing they said when they were on-site. They cannot exchange the black and white printer that is a pain to print trash bills through for one that is more like what we used to have and set up to print a large amount of trash bills. She stated that she did trash bills last quarter and it is difficult because you can't feed cardstock through anything but the manual feed tray and can only feed 5 through at a time. She said they advised we are stuck with that printer for the next 3 and a half years. They said the only thing we can do is add another printer and allow someone else to use that printer.

Trustee Warner asked if Trustee Johnston talked to them and asked there's nothing that they're willing to do?

- Fiscal Officer Evans said Hayes and I both had a meeting with them. We can either add another printer on or switch the current printers.
- Trustee Johnston said we can give the Police Department the black and white and we take the other one.

Trustee Warner said yeah.

 Trustee Heeter said he doesn't have a problem with that. He asked why they need a color printer.

Fiscal Officer Evans said I couldn't tell you.

Trustee Warner said but if they need it for something, it's out here.

Trustee Heeter said it should be out here then.

- Trustee Johnston said that will resolve that and it won't cost us anymore then. He said the other thing is that the color printer inside the Police Department went over it's targeted number of copies every single month. He said he doesn't know what they were running off but our upcharge was not pennies, it was hundreds.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said there is an allowance on the number of pages.
- Trustee Heeter asked if the company needs to come out to make the switch.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said she believes Interlink was also here at the time.
- Trustee Heeter asked when we want to move them.
- Trustee Warner said as soon as possible.

Trustee Heeter said next week.

- Fiscal Officer Evans stated that since she was not part of that contract set-up and wasn't the contact person on it, she had no idea that we were being charge extra on the contract because no one provided proof of insurance on those printers. We are no longer being charged insurance since she sent over proof of insurance on the printers.
- Trustee Warner said it sounds like just 2 people were involved with it.

 Trustee Johnston said we got all that taken care of during the meeting and everything is on track.

 Fiscal Officer Evans said they confirmed receipt of the insurance documents and removal of the property damage surcharge we were being charged.

#### GovDeals

Trustee Johnston stated that he wants to change how we do GovDeals. He said that right now the Maintenance Department and the Police Department have GovDeals. He said Fiscal Officer Evans needs GovDeals as the Fiscal Officer of the Township. She doesn't have access because GovDeals only allows us 2 accounts. He suggests we terminate the Police Department's ability to put stuff on GovDeals.

Trustee Heeter said she should have all of it.

 Trustee Johnston said we can do that. He said he was focused on the 2 accounts. Trustee Heeter said he has 2 or 3 cruisers to put on there so let's put her

in charge of it.

Fiscal Officer Evans suggests the Fiscal Officer and a Trustee. She always puts the President Trustee on all accounts. She said that last year when the trailer was sold, it took several months to receive the funds. She said it took forever to get anyone there to talk to her because she wasn't on the account and the issue was because GovDeals was not notified that the trailer had been picked up by the buyer.

Trustee Heeter said that's even more reason for you to do it.

- Trustee Johnston said it's just like these filing cabinets over here. We can't get anybody to tell us whether they were put on GovDeals or not.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said Caleb said they were, it was either Caleb or Erica, she doesn't remember, but she doesn't have proof of it and she doesn't want to dispose of that until we have actual proof that they were listed and didn't sell.
- Trustee Warner asked if there is a minimum amount of time they have to be on there.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said she honestly doesn't know.

Trustee Warner said okay, we can check into that.

- Trustee Heeter said the other option would be with these vehicles for instance if they don't sell, we receive donated cruisers, so if they don't sell they could be donated for education and that may be what it is if nobody buys them. He asked if there is a write-off or something for that.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated yes.

Trustee Warner stated there is.

Trustee Johnston said the other thing with the cruisers is that Perry B has all the parts for those cruisers, the seats, the bumper guards.

Trustee Heeter asked if we know what goes with what.

Trustee Johnston said we don't have a clue.

- Trustee Heeter said we might have a skid of seats to sell on GovDeals then.
- Trustee Johnston said the thing with those seats is that they are probably very valuable.

Trustee Heeter said they aren't worth anything sitting in a building.

- Trustee Johnston said half the building over there has got seats, bumper guards, and other parts to the cruisers. He said he hasn't been over there in a few months. He said Al has been over there with him and he's seen it all. He said he doesn't know if it is all still there.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said she thinks there is the 1 push bar that belongs, she believes, on the unmarked car and all the seats that were taken out when the cages were put in.

Trustee Johnston said they all need to be disposed of also.

Trustee Heeter said agreed.

## Concrete Pad at Maintenance Building

- Trustee Johnston said they have moved the oil tanks inside the building where the waste oil was going that they burn. He said the propane tank has been boxed in. He said one of the problems at the maintenance building is there is no wash-down area for the trucks and equipment. He said now that they have this space, they wanted to put a pad down to be able to wash the equipment down outside of the building because the building floods when you start washing in there. He said he guesses there's a blockage in the drain.
- Trustee Warner asked if there is a reason they can't wash it on gravel?

Trustee Johnston said no, they could.

 Trustee Warner said he doesn't know why it's necessary to have a concrete pad. He said he washes his car in the gravel driveway.

Fiscal Officer Evans asked if it was already started.

Trustee Heeter said it sounds like that's a no.

- Trustee Warner asked what is the benefit to a concrete pad versus gravel or grass.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said she is only asking if this was already started because of all the quikrete that was purchased on the Lowe's card the other day.

- Trustee Johnston said he can use that on the cemeteries.
- Trustee Heeter said he thinks we should just not do that.

Trustee Warner agreed.

- Trustee Johnston said there is a problem with the drain in the building so that's why they were taking it outside and in the summer time it is perfectly fine.
- Trustee Heeter said so the drain doesn't work very good or at all.
- Trustee Johnston said it's at a different slope and, before him, they had it looked at.

Trustee Warner asked if you can Roto-Rooter it?

 Trustee Johnston said no, you would have to go in there and cut the concrete to fix the plumbing and that's just one of the problems with the building over there. He said it all slopes towards the office so it floods out.

Trustee Warner asked if it has always been a problem.

- A former Township resident stated it has always drained slow.
- Trustee Heeter said he would rather address the drain issue than a concrete pad. A concrete pad outside is not going to do any good in the winter.
- Fiscal Officer Evans if the office has always been where it is. She stated she is just curious because she has only been there once.
- A former Township Trustee stated it has not. There was one small office and the bathroom up front.

Audit Update

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated an extension request was received and approved again. The new due date is September 30<sup>th</sup>. She stated she has been extremely busy the last week and a half providing requested documents. She said we will be receiving some findings on the Audit.

Trustee Warner asked how many extensions we have had.

- Fiscal Officer Evans advised this is number 4. She stated this is not her asking for extensions, this is the CPA doing our audit asking for extensions from the State. She advised that this time, the State is telling the CPA to ask for an extension because now the State is involved.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised that no time sheets, including hourly and salary employees, for the Police Department will be a finding and a citation on the Audit. She said this was also mentioned on the previous audit which was an AUP (Agreed Upon Procedures) audit. This would have been listed in the managerial notes of that audit. The lack of time sheets affects the audit in several ways. The auditor cannot perform a leave balance test for any employee in the Police Department. They also mentioned that the Board needs to put a stop to the inflated vacation accrual. There are 2 department heads that have been receiving inflated vacation.
- Trustee Heeter asked if it is outside of the policy.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said absolutely.

Trustee Heeter said then it will stop; it has to.

Fiscal Officer Evans said Caleb just hit year 4 and is now accruing at the
rate he is supposed to be. Chief Barga has been accruing at the same time
since she was promoted to Chief. When asked why she was accruing at a
higher rate, she said it was a verbal agreement when she was promoted.

Trustee Heeter said that has no validity.

- Fiscal Officer Evans said the auditor doesn't care about verbal agreements. There is nothing signed in her personnel file.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated regarding the Finney Law Firm payment, because that was court-ordered interest there will be no finding as far as the payment made in March of 2024. The only issue there may possibly be is a managerial note regarding prior years not being listed as debt.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated there was a resident complaint submitted to the auditor regarding the Fiscal Officer being paid for Zoning duties on top of Fiscal Officer salary.

Trustee Warner said that's a policy.

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated per O.R.C. 519.16 that is perfectly fine and legal counsel approved it.

Trustee Warner said that is in our handbook as well.

 Fiscal Officer Evans said the auditor checked with the state as well and the stated said it is fine. Fiscal Officer Evans said regarding the resident complaint that the Board is making decisions outside of public meetings, the state said although it does seem as though in some public meetings there was no prior discussion in a public meeting, the complaint was too vague because they did not list specific topics discussed on specific dates.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated regarding the resident complaint that the Board has hired employees without posting, this will be possibly a management note and this needs to be a management discussion.

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated regarding the hay contract, the state is not concerned about that because the contract was only for \$1.00.

Fiscal Officer Evans said regarding the issue of asphalt grindings, there are no documents therefore no action can be taken.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated there was a resident complaint about a public records request that was received between the time that Charity resigned and the time Fiscal Officer Evans came in, she stated she has no way to find that request because it would have gone to Karen and all of Karen's emails prior to 5/22/25 have been deleted. She stated she sent an email to the Board about Karen's emails as well as Lisa's emails being deleted as these are not recoverable. She said she would like to speak with Patrick with Oasis about archiving all of our emails.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated there will be a managerial note because in 2024 temporary appropriations were not done until 1/16/24 and should have been done by 12/31/23. She stated that since she was not appointed until 1/9/24 it would have been impossible to have temporary

appropriations done before the deadline.

- Fiscal Officer Evans said this will be a big one on the audit. The Verizon bill for the GPS units on the cruisers was being paid on a credit card by an employee in 2023 from September through December. She stated the auditor asked if the previous Fiscal Officer had spoken with the Board or employee about that. She provided the auditor with emails from the former Fiscal Officer to the employee advising her that she would prefer she not pay this bill on the credit card. There was also sales tax on this bill. She the former Fiscal Officer had cancelled that card and in January of 2024 the bill remained on auto-pay but from the checking account. Fiscal Officer Evans stated this bill continued to be charged sales tax until May of 2024 when she got access to Verizon Connect and was able to see the full bill because prior to that time she was only receiving the first page of the bill that does not provide a breakdown. The sales tax is on page 2. March through May of 2024 sales tax was reimbursed. Now that bill is mailed to the Township and paid with a check since Fiscal Officer Evans no longer has access to the Verizon Connect account.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated there was a resident complaint regarding ARPA Funds and the temporary appropriations for ARPA Funds, that they were not used for allowable purposes. The auditor was sent the end of year appropriation for 2022, 2023, and 2024 and the temporary and permanent appropriations for all those years. The auditor said it looks like all Funds appropriated for each year were expended in those years and he doesn't believe this to be an issue.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated that more hours will be billed for this audit.

The original contract was for \$8,000.00.

Fiscal Officer Evans advised that the auditor asked for the credit card policy due to the payment of bills on the credit card. She provided the previous policy and the current policy. The auditor saw that there is a credit card inventory mentioned in the policy and asked for the inventory. Fiscal Officer Evans advised the auditor that she had never received the inventory. He asked her to send him proof of when and how she asked for the inventory. She provided him with meeting minutes from December of 2024 and February, April and May of 2025.

Trustee Heeter asked how many credit cards we have out.

 Fiscal Officer Evans advised there are 3 Huntington credit cards, she has one, Caleb has one, Chief Barga has one. She stated she has no idea how many Speedway cards we have.

Trustee Heeter asked if this is just the Police Department or both Maintenance and Police.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated both.

Trustee Heeter asked so these are Speedway credit cards? And those

don't run through you?

 Fiscal Officer Evans advised they do now. There were 7 new cards ordered earlier this year and she asked the Board to allow her to be the sole person over the Speedway account because nobody was aware that those new cards were ordered. She said she thinks at that time it brought us up to 22 fuel cards.

Trustee Heeter asked why do we need 22 cards.

- Fiscal Officer Evans stated that is why she asked for an inventory, so she could cancel and destroy the cards we do not need.
- Trustee Heeter said so you need an inventory of how many credit cards they have.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated yes, how many and where are they.

- Trustee Warner stated that when Trustee Music was here he had mentioned more than once about an excel spreadsheet.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she has never seen it. It was never sent to her, ever. She said Trustee Warner has his email.
- Trustee Heeter asked when she would like this, as soon as possible?
- Trustee Johnston stated that Fiscal Officer Evans told him on the cards that are not used, Speedway suspends them.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated that is correct. Speedway mails their cards activated. She said if the cards go for a while without being used, Speedway will block them. She stated the cars that are sitting out there not moving, the one sitting in the corner with a flat tire, whichever cards are assigned to those cars will probably be blocked soon because the cars have not moved in a while.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated that the auditor obviously always audits payroll. At the time of the audit, he asked about the policy regarding the insurance stipend. She finally located it with the help of former Fiscal Officer Behnken. Now that we have located the policy, we have found that the stipend has been severely overpaid to the employee. She said when she started in January of 2024 she asked the employee and Trustee Music how the stipend was supposed to be paid. The answer she received was that it was an agreement when the employee started that they were supposed to receive this every 2 weeks. In 2023, sometimes it was paid every 2 weeks and sometimes once a month, which is why she questioned it and she was told incorrectly.
- Trustee Warner asked which one was correct.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated it was supposed to be paid monthly.
- Trustee Heeter asked that's specified by policy, right?
- o Fiscal Officer Evans said absolutely.
- Trustee Heeter said then that's it.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated now it is August, so he has already been paid too much for the year.
- Trustee Heeter asked so he's done then, right?
- Trustee Johnston stated we are probably going to have to eat that.
- Trustee Heeter said on the time sheet thing, obviously you still aren't getting any of that?
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she gets a schedule.
- Trustee Heeter asked if the Police Department has a time clock system.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised that she told former Trustee Music all the time that the auditor says we have to have time sheets, not a schedule that says so-and-so worked this many hours this day with 12 hours here, 8 hours there, it has to say time in and time out. She stated the answer she got back was that if the auditor asks for those, then the auditor can come ask the Chief for those when the auditor is here. She advised the auditor is not going to come ask for something that should already be in the Fiscal Office. She said to her understanding, from what former Trustee Music said, time sheets can be produced from the Police Department's time-keeping system.
- Trustee Heeter asked that you have? Or that they have?
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised that she does not have it.
- Trustee Heeter asked if they do have a time clock system.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she guesses they do. She doesn't know how that system works, she never had access to it. She said the system that

Caleb uses, she used to have access to it, she had access for a few months and doesn't anymore. She stated that system is like a time clock system and can be accessed from a phone or a computer.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated there is a time clock on the counter and one

at the maintenance building.

 Trustee Johnston said the time clock that is in there was for the previous Police Department to clock in and clock out. He said when he questioned why they don't use it he was told what do you want me to do, go out and patrol and protect the neighborhood or spend all day clocking in and out with a time card.

Trustee Heeter said first of all, the first part of that is your job.

Trustee Johnston said we use the time clock to time stamp all mail.

### **Policies**

Fiscal Officer Evans asked Trustee Warner if he had his list.

 Trustee Warner stated one of the things he and Fiscal Officer Evans were talking about is other policies that need to be updated or revised or improved or new policies the Board needs to start implementing.

Trustee Johnston said he is working on a policy to evaluate employees based on 2 evaluation periods. He stated we will close all employees out in the month of December, then at the 6-month point there will be a selfassessment done to the supervisor or the supervising Trustee of how they are meeting the elements of their job.

Trustee Warner asked Fiscal Officer Evans to run down her list.

- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she added personnel files to the list because there is always an argument of where they are located and who has the most recent one. She said she has sent a couple emails this week showing who used to fulfill requests for Police Department personnel files and why she doesn't do them because she doesn't have full personnel files. She stated even our legal counsel has said those files should be in the Fiscal Office. She said she would like it if the Board would implement a policy to that effect.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated the Board had talked about implementing a pay scale for each Department and position.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated time sheets and cards were already discussed.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated the insurance stipend policy needs looked at. She stated she did have something to add to that. She said at the beginning of 2025, the Board made a decision to no longer cover spouses if the spouse was offered insurance at their employer. She stated per the policy that was located, the \$120 is for a family. She asked why would the Township pay for a spouse's insurance premiums elsewhere if we do not cover spouses.

Trustee Warner asked what if it is single with kids.

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated it is \$90. It is \$60 for employee, \$90 for employee and children, \$100 for employee and spouse, and \$120 for family.

Trustee Heeter said if the employee elects not to have the insurance because their spouse is carrying it, it should just be for that person, not the

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated the Township policy and O.R.C. state that the employee is responsible for proving to the Township every year that they are covered on another insurance policy. She stated that she thinks it would be in the best interest of the Township, since the other is outdated and the Township no longer offers insurance for spouses if they are covered, to write a new policy.

Trustee Warner agreed.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated the last time the Records Retention Policy was written and sent to the state was done by Fiscal Officer Behnken. This should probably be updated with new verbiage.

Trustee Johnston said we are probably holding onto information that we

don't have to.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated we are. She added, does that room not lock

Trustee Johnston stated there is no lock on that door.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated there used to be, so she is confused.

Trustee Heeter stated that doesn't sound right.

 Fiscal Officer Evans confirmed so the records room doesn't lock anymore? Does the PD room lock?

Trustee Johnston stated the PD room does lock.

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated the Public Records Policy is very old. She is not sure that everyone has read it. She also feels it would be beneficial to add to the Policy Book that all employees take the Public Records Training as it is a requirement.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated that Trustee Heeter had asked for a review of

the 4 new policies the Board had passed.

- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she also wanted to bring up the recently adopted Spending Policy because there have been several credit card purchases recently that are not following policy by not having a Purchase Order or that they have sales tax.
- Trustee Johnston stated the problem with the spending policy is that the
  employees are still focused on the old policy that they can spend up to
  \$10,000 on the credit card. He said that one of the employees said they
  can spend up to \$3,000 on the credit card.

Fiscal Officer Evans said the \$3,000 is mentioned under the Then-and-Now Certificate.

Trustee Johnston stated you have to ask the Board to spend the money and the reason you have to ask Jamie is because we have to make sure

we have the money before you spend it.

- Fiscal Officer Evans said explain it like this, when the auditor comes, he sends me a list of samples to pull. He expects the invoice, the purchase order that was issued before that purchase was made, and the check stub. She stated that if she doesn't have a purchase order attached to that, it falls on her. She said let's say there's a Then-and-Now Certificate on it which means that it was needed and the Fiscal Officer wasn't available or it was an emergency. She has to be able to prove that was an emergency and why she issued a Then-and-Now Certificate. She said that is where the \$3,000 comes in, under the Then-and-Now Certificate. Those can only be issued in strict compliance with O.R.C. subject to approval by the Resolution of the Board.
- Trustee Johnston said we need to hold a training session so they can come in and ask questions. He said each one of them has a different thought process on how to do business. He said he told the Fiscal Officer to just turn the credit cards off or have them come get the card from her.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated she will not be available for them to come get the credit cards from so it will have to be she will just turn the credit card off. She said we cannot be paying sales tax on any purchases.
- Trustee Warner said he thinks it's important to just do the training.
- o Trustee Heeter said yes, we do the training, then if there's a problem...
- o Trustee Johnston stated then it's a write-up.

Trustee Heeter added and loss of privilege.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated we have a credit card policy and Section 5 of the Spending Policy is the credit card use policy which says that she is supposed to have credit card receipts within 2 business days. She said she thinks that is a little soon. She stated however, every month she has to ask for invoices from credit card purchases.

Trustee Heeter said that will be another reason to lose privileges.

Fiscal Officer Evans brought up the logins for the Amazon account.
 Everyone is using Caleb's login which makes it look like Caleb is making purchases for the Police Department.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated that every time there is a holiday on a Friday or a Monday there is no one working in the Township the day before or the day after the holiday. She stated it is not in the handbook and she has never worked anywhere where that is okay. She said she doesn't know if anyone else gets complaint calls on that, because she does.

Trustee Heeter stated that he has requested the Police Department's schedule a month in advance and he has requested that he be made aware if someone will not be there that he be aware if this will be a vacation day or sick day. He stated he has received responses on some of what he has requested and has not received an answer of why the

Township was not covered today and he is working on that. He stated it will be resolved.

 Trustee Johnston stated he is told when they are taking a day off or a sick day.

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated she had received calls from 2 different residents today asking why every time there is a holiday Caleb takes the Friday off. She said she told them she doesn't know.

Trustee Heeter stated that each should be approved and he doesn't care how it was done in the past but that is how he wants it done. He stated the expectation is that if you are not going to be here, he wants to know. He said anywhere he worked, that is how it is done.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated it does raise a question when residents start noticing that every time before a holiday, nobody works. She mentioned Juneteenth. The day after was when Eversole Cemetery was broken into and nobody worked that day which is why she had to go take care of it. She said that is why she is bringing it to the Board's attention.

Trustee Heeter asked if she is speaking from a policy perspective.

Fiscal Officer Evans stated from a policy perspective. It does not say in the policy that employees will not be paid for holidays if they don't work the

day before and the day after a holiday.

Trustee Heeter stated it has been his experience that you can request a vacation day the day before or after a holiday and if you're sick you could possibly still be paid but that you cannot take a personal day the day before or after a holiday. He said authorized leave is one thing, but not is another. He stated comp time does not apply either. You cannot take comp time the day before or after a holiday.

Trustee Johnston said you can't take vacation and comp time at the same time either.

 Trustee Heeter said he doesn't know why you would want to do that; you'd lose your comp time.

Trustee Warner asked if that was all regarding policies.

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated yes, and again, she just wanted to bring that up because she is asked about it all the time.

Trustee Johnston asked if the handbook addresses it at all.

Trustee Warner said it doesn't, she just said that.

Fiscal Officer Evans said it doesn't at all.

Trustee Warner said so according to our policy right now, it's fine.

Fiscal Officer Evans said yes.

 Trustee Johnston said so if they want to take a vacation day on Friday and the holiday is Monday it's fine.

Trustee Heeter stated as long as it was authorized vacation. He said if you're going to take a day of vacation, we should know.

Trustee Johnston stated that in this particular case, he was asked. He said then he tells Jamie because when the time sheets come in, she is tracking. He said when the time sheets come in, he goes through every single item on the time sheets looking for discrepancies.

Future Scheduled Special Meeting Update

Trustee Warner said originally we had these scheduled for the last Friday of the month before the next month's Trustee meeting and because of our flexible schedules and with former Trustee Music being off on Fridays, Friday mornings worked out. But now with Trustee Heeter having to work in the morning time, we had adjusted these to the evening. He said he is suggesting a Thursday 5:00 PM meeting.

Fiscal Officer Evans asked for that to be changed to 6:00 PM.

 Trustee Johnston stated the reason is that Jamie has a new job 25 minutes away.

Veteran's Day

 Fiscal Officer Evans stated the November regular meeting falls on Veteran's Day and she doesn't feel like it's okay to have a meeting on Veteran's Day.

Trustee Warner asked if we want to make it Wednesday?

Trustee Heeter stated he can make Monday or Wednesday.

Fiscal Officer Evans suggested the following Tuesday.

Trustee Johnston stated or the first Tuesday.

Trustee Warner said that is election day.

- Trustee Warner said let's keep it on Tuesday and do it on November 18 at 6:00 PM.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated for full disclosure, she wants to try to help get some of these policies done that way if she is not successful in the election, the new Fiscal Officer will not have to worry about it.
- Trustee Heeter asked if we are going to break those up and share.
- Trustee Warner said yeah.
- Executive Session pursuant to 121.22 (G)(1) to consider the employment, dismissal or discipline of a public employee
  - Trustee Heeter stated we have decided that we are not going to do this tonight. Executive Session tabled.

Fire Department Contracts

- Trustee Warner stated there was a Fire Levy passed in 2022 when the new contract was entered into and the one that they have currently proposed has an increase for 2026, 2027, and 2028 at 3% per year of the levy fund distribution.
- Trustee Warner read the following: The Trustees shall pay to the city an additional percentage increase above the 2024 levy fund distribution of \$408,205.06 per year compounded each year of the contract to equal the following payment schedule: 2026 \$12,246.15, 2027 \$12,613.54, 2028 \$12,991.94. These funds are to help offset the rising cost of Fire and EMS equipment and services. He asked Fiscal Officer Evans where that increase will come from.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated that proposal forces the Township into a levy. She stated the Board decided to put on a levy and that levy fails, then the increase will come from the General Fund. She advised the General Fund cannot afford that increase. She stated that every year, the Fire Departments receive in more than what the contract requires. She said there is a set dollar amount and there is always more received in and sent to the Fire Department Departments than what the contract states. Any Funds brought into Fund 2111 (Fire Department Levies) has to be disbursed to the Fire Departments.
- Trustee Warner asked why that is.
- Fiscal Officer Evans stated it is because the levy goes off Schedule A & B
  which tells us the minimum amount that could potentially be brought in but
  is always more.
- A resident asked who already met with the Fire Department.
- Trustee Johnston advised that Zach Music did.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised that \$797,011 is the projected amount to be brought in for the fire levies in year 2025.
- Trustee Warner asked if that was for both Fire Departments.
- Fiscal Officer Evans said it is.
- Trustee Warner said this is just for Brookville.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised you have to divide it in half.
- Trustee Warner asked if it is 50/50.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised it is. She stated in 2024 we had to disburse equally between the Fire Departments \$785,077.39. Funds received were \$825,194.95.
- Trustee Warner asked how. The contract is the contract.
- Fiscal Officer Evans advised that anything receipted in has to be disbursed. She stated she explained that to former Trustee Music before he had that meeting with Brookville, that they are already getting more than the contract and they always have.
- A resident asked if it is still in the contract that they attend meetings.
- Trustee Warner stated it is.
- The resident stated that they broke the contract.
- Fiscal Officer Evans asked if they noticed that the new contract states that Brookville Fire Chief is to be appointed as the Fire Prevention Officer rather than appointing one or the other.
- Trustee Warner said the new contract says that the Fire Chief and City Manager may meet.

- Trustee Warner said he thinks we are all in agreement that we are not interested in an increase.
- Fiscal Officer Evans asked if anyone has gotten anything from New Lebanon.
- Trustee Heeter asked if there is a reason we use both?
- Trustee Warner said because Amity Road is the halfway line.
- There was inaudible discussion in the audience.
- o Trustee Warner said he will reach out to New Lebanon and get theirs.

#### Trustees:

I have brought up the medical waiver stipend several times over the past 19 months. I have asked about this because when I started, this was set up to be paid out on each check and looking back at 2023 and 2024, some months it was paid biweekly and some months it was paid monthly. Former FO Behnken has also brought it up in a few meetings. I have attached emails that both former FO Grill and I had with Caleb. I was told by former Trustee Music to continue to pay Caleb out biweekly as he had been since there was no policy in the handbook directing if this payment was to be paid biweekly or monthly until a new policy was decided on.

Former FO Behnken and I reviewed the 2018 and 2019 meeting minutes together as she thought the original resolution for this stipend was in one of those years. Former FO Behnken remembered this was started when Randall Robbins asked the Board to entertain a medical waiver stipend in 2020 when he was promoted to full-time. It was passed at the 3/10/20 regular meeting by resolution 20:36 as an attachment to the Perry Township Policy Book.

Unfortunately, Caleb was paid the \$120.00 stipend 7 times in 2021 (should have only been 6 as he started in late June, first payment would have been in July), 17 times in 2022, 13 times in 2023, 26 times in 2024, and 16 times so far in 2025. This amounts to an overpayment in medical waiver stipends of \$3,000.00.

You will see on the attached email I exchanged with Caleb, he advised me this payment was to be biweekly per an agreement he had when he first started and that Lisa Kozarec told him this was paid out just like the insurance comes out of a biweekly check.

Per the attached meeting minutes and resolution, this is a monthly stipend and should never have been paid out biweekly. Also, any employee receiving this stipend is responsible, per this Township Policy and ORC, for submitting proof that they are covered under another health care plan. There is no proof of such in Caleb's personnel file. The monthly waiver credit (stipend) is also based on the employee's enrollment level of their other health care plan based off the attached resolution.

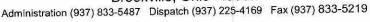
