Gaudete!

This Sunday the Church celebrates Gaudete Sunday, a moment in the Advent season when the penitential purple softens into rose and the liturgy invites us to rejoice because the Lord is near. The name "Gaudete" comes

from the Entrance Antiphon: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. The Lord is near." Advent is a season of longing and preparation, but today we are reminded that Christian waiting is never anxious waiting - it is joyful, hope-filled, confident waiting for the One who has already drawn close and continues to come to us.

The readings capture this spirit beautifully. The prophet Isaiah announces a future filled with restoration and healing: "The desert and the parched land will exult." The weak will be strengthened, the fearful encouraged, and the blind, deaf, lame, and mute restored. Isaiah paints a world transformed by the presence of God—a world where life springs up in unlikely places, and where sorrow and mourning flee. His message invites us to lift our eyes and see beyond the present moment to the hope that God is always bringing forth.

Saint James encourages the early Christians to be patient as they await the Lord's coming: "Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand." This is not passive patience. It is the patience of the farmer who actively prepares the soil, tends the fields, and trusts that the harvest will come in its proper time. Advent calls us to this same readiness: to cultivate hearts capable of recognizing Christ's presence now, so that we may greet Him with joy when He comes in glory.

The Gospel gives us a deeply human moment in the life of John the Baptist, who sends his disciples to Jesus with a question: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" John, who boldly proclaimed the coming Messiah, now finds himself imprisoned and facing uncertainty. Jesus responds not with theory but with evidence: the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised—the very signs Isaiah foretold. In other words, Jesus is saying, "Look at what God is doing. The Kingdom is breaking in."

Gaudete Sunday reminds us that even in seasons of difficulty, discouragement, or waiting, God is at work. Like John, we may sometimes confront doubts or wonder where God is leading us. Yet Jesus invites us to open our eyes and see the signs of His presence—in acts of charity, in reconciliation within families, in patience that bears fruit, and in small moments of grace that brighten our days.

As we move into the latter part of Advent, let us embrace the spirit of joyful expectation. Christ is near. His light is growing. And He invites us to rejoice, not because all is perfect, but because He is coming to make all things new.
