Circle Cardiovascular Imaging is committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking in our business activities and within our supply chains. This statement outlines the steps we have taken to address the risk of modern slavery and human trafficking.

Our Business and Supply Chain

Circle operates in the Healthcare Technology sector and has a very narrow supply chain. We are aware that modern slavery, which includes human trafficking, forced labor, and child labor, may occur in various industries and regions around the world. We are committed to taking necessary actions to mitigate the risk of these practices within our operations and supply chains.

Our Policies and Commitments

We have implemented a range of policies and practices designed to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not taking place in any part of our business or supply chain including:

Code of Conduct. Our Code of Conduct sets out the principles and expectations for all employees, contractors, and suppliers. It includes clear commitments to ethical practices, human rights, and explicitly prohibits slavery, human trafficking and the use of forced or compulsory labor in our organization.

Due Diligence and Risk Assessment

We recognize that modern slavery can affect various industries in different ways. As part of our due diligence, we conduct regular risk assessments to identify potential risks in our supply chain and take action to address those risks. New suppliers will be required to agree to Circle's supplier code of conduct. We also review existing suppliers to confirm they are adhering to our anti-slavery policies.


Training and Awareness

- Strengthen reporting mechanisms for employees to raise concerns about slavery or human trafficking.
