Traditional Summer Day Camp - Oakland Beach Branch

Our 8-week summer camp program offers a wide range of enriching and fun activities for campers of all ages. Campers will be grouped with others in their age group for indoor and outdoor programming, creating new friendships, learning new games, and developing their skills.

The camp program includes STEM activities, sports, water play, arts and crafts, fun games, and weekly trips to the Masonic Family Center in Buttonwoods for swimming and field games. Off site field trips have limited availability and provide an additional opportunity for campers to explore and learn in a new environment.

Limited capacity for field trips; an additional fee is required.

STEAM Specialty Camp - Norwood Branch

Our Specialty Camp emphasizes STEAM education (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math).

Campers are immersed in hands-on learning experiences during each 1-week session.

To complement each themed session, we also offer traditional summer programs in the afternoon, including field trips to swimming pools and off-site destinations.

Popular sessions in the past have included Forensics Week and Animal Habitats. We are thrilled to be collaborating with Learn 365 and integrating Warwick Public School Teachers into our staff. Their presence contributes to our hands-on learning approach, which is implemented multiple mornings each week.

This summer, teens entering grades 6 through 12 can participate in various programs at the CLUB at Cooper.

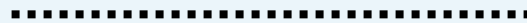

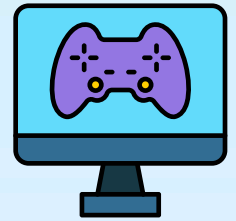

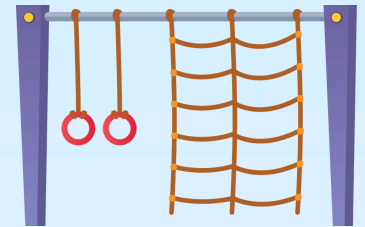

"Grab your magnifying glass and your field kit—the investigation begins now! This week, our lab transforms into a high-tech crime scene where only the sharpest minds can crack the case. Campers will gather evidence to solve a week-long mystery. Our investigators will use biology, chemistry, and math to connect the dots. We'll be learning the geometry of splatter patterns, decoding secret ciphers, and analyzing "trace evidence" left at the scene. Whether you're a Digital Decoder or a Evidence Engineer, every clue brings us one step closer to the truth."

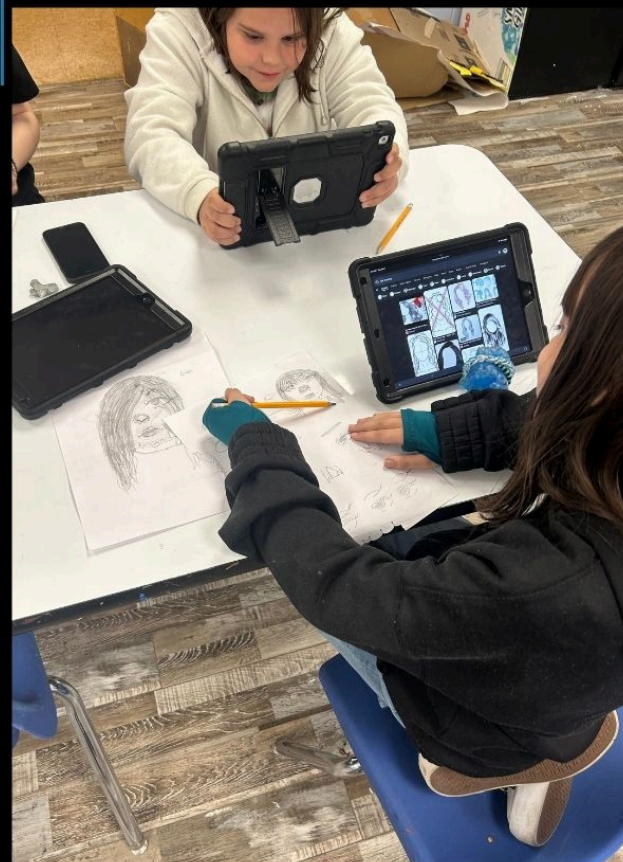

WEEKLY THEMES

Week 1: Welcome Week -

Youth are welcomed to the program and acclimated to Cooper. Youth and staff will play a variety of games meant to help get to know one another and build stronger relationships.

Week 2: Intro to the Arts -

A general overview of the basics to ensure everyone involved has an understanding of program areas, computer software and equipment. This week will focus primarily on musical instruments, basics of garageband/Logic Pro, iMovie/Final Cut. Youth will be encouraged to create at least one project using any video/audio software. Projects can be a podcast, song or beat, short film, etc.

Week 3: Band Plan -

Members will discuss ideas for a band performance. Youth and staff will come up with band names, song choices and decide who will play each instrument. Youth and staff will then begin learning their parts. Youth who decide they don't want to play an instrument will be encouraged to come up with other ways to be involved in the projects, such as band manager, photographer/videographer, logo designer, producer, etc.

Week 4: Visuals -

Continuing the Band Plan, this week members will start to focus on any and all visual projects related to the band/future performance. Youth will create band logos, create a poster/flyer advertising their future performance.

Week 4: Design Lab -

Youth will learn the ins and outs of designing, workshopping and printing their logos onto shirts using the design lab screen printer. Members will learn the process of screen printing from the early design stages, to transferring a logo onto a screen, to later creating their own apparel.

Week 5: Record Week -

This week's programming will have a heavy recording/production focus. The goal is for youth to take a deep dive into learning how to record and produce their own music. We'll begin by having members share some of their favorite records/songs and discuss how they may have been recorded. Members will try to recreate some of the effects we heard on the records using Logic Pro, and use those techniques to later record/produce their own projects.

Week 6: Project Prep/Rock Doc Week -

During this week leading up to the week of our performance, youth will prepare by having extra daily practices. During practice times, other members will work with staff and focus on making a documentary style video about the process including band member interviews.

Week 7: Cooper LIVE-

Band members will prep for a live performance which will take place on Friday afternoon. In addition to practicing, members will also think about performance set up and aesthetic, audio recording, lighting and camera placement in order to film the performance.

Week 8: Wrap Up -

During the final week, members will spend time reflecting on their performance while also working on editing the audio and video footage from the concert. During the final days we will 'premier' the footage from our Rock Doc, as well as the live concert footage.
