MEET *Karen Drucker* A HEART FOR HOME, HARMONY AND HELPING OTHERS

Born on the last day of September in 1946, Karen Drucker's earliest memories are rooted in Crossett, Arkansas—a town where pine trees edge the streets and neighbors are more like family. She was the youngest of two, always looking up to her brother, who was five years ahead of her in life's adventures. Their home was lively, the kind of place where laughter echoed and there was always room for a little mischief.

Karen's constant companion in childhood was Sandy, a gentle German Shepherd who never tired of games in the yard. But perhaps her closest bond was with her mother, whose days were dedicated to caring for the family until Karen reached twelve. Those years, with her mother always nearby, left a mark—a sense of being cherished, of having someone in her corner.

Her father brought stories from a world beyond Arkansas. He'd spent time in California with the Civilian Conservation Corps, working the land and building hope during the Great Depression. Karen grew up understanding that strength sometimes means rolling up your sleeves and getting through hard times together.

Church life shaped Karen from the start. Sundays were for hymns,

fellowship and the quiet rituals of Baptist faith. It was at church that Karen discovered the piano, her fingers learning to wander over the keys as she played the songs she'd heard since she could remember. The piano became more than music—it was a friend, a comfort and a way to bring joy to others.

Sports lit up another side of Karen. She picked up a softball bat as a little girl and didn't put it down until well after high school. Through every inning, she found grit and fun, lessons about teamwork and friendly competition that she carried into adulthood. Later, tennis would join her list of passions, and she'd find the same thrill in a crisp volley as she once did in a home run.

At twenty-eight, Karen's story opened a new chapter. She met her future husband, and the two quickly discovered their mutual love for tennis and fishing. Their first date—a fishing trip—set the tone for a partnership built on shared adventure and easy laughter. In Atlanta, they joined a tennis league, but it was in Rome, Georgia, where their life together truly blossomed. They put down roots, tending a garden side by side, coaxing fresh vegetables from the earth and savoring every bite at the dinner table.

Karen's heart for children led her into teaching. She took college classes to become a pre-k teacher, pouring her patience and warmth

into helping little ones find their feet. Each day in the classroom was an opportunity to shape young lives, to encourage curiosity and kindness in the next generation.

Helping others has always come naturally to Karen, whether in the classroom, the church, or among friends. She finds deep satisfaction in making a difference—sometimes in small, quiet ways, sometimes with a word or a gesture that means the world to someone else.

Through all of life's chapters, Karen's faith has remained her anchor. She has known joy and sorrow, and she carries with her a piece of advice that has seen her through loss: "You don't get over the loss of a loved one, you simply learn to live with it, which gives you strength." It's a truth she's lived, a strength she's offered to others in their own times of need.

If she could speak to her younger self, Karen would offer gentle wisdom: don't be mischievous—not every adventure needs your participation. It's advice shaped by experience, spoken with a smile and a twinkle in her eye.

Today, Karen's story continues—rooted in faith, guided by kindness, enriched by music and memory. She is a woman who has given much and asked little in return, whose life reminds us that joy can be found in helping others, that strength is built in the quiet moments, and that home is wherever you are with those you love.

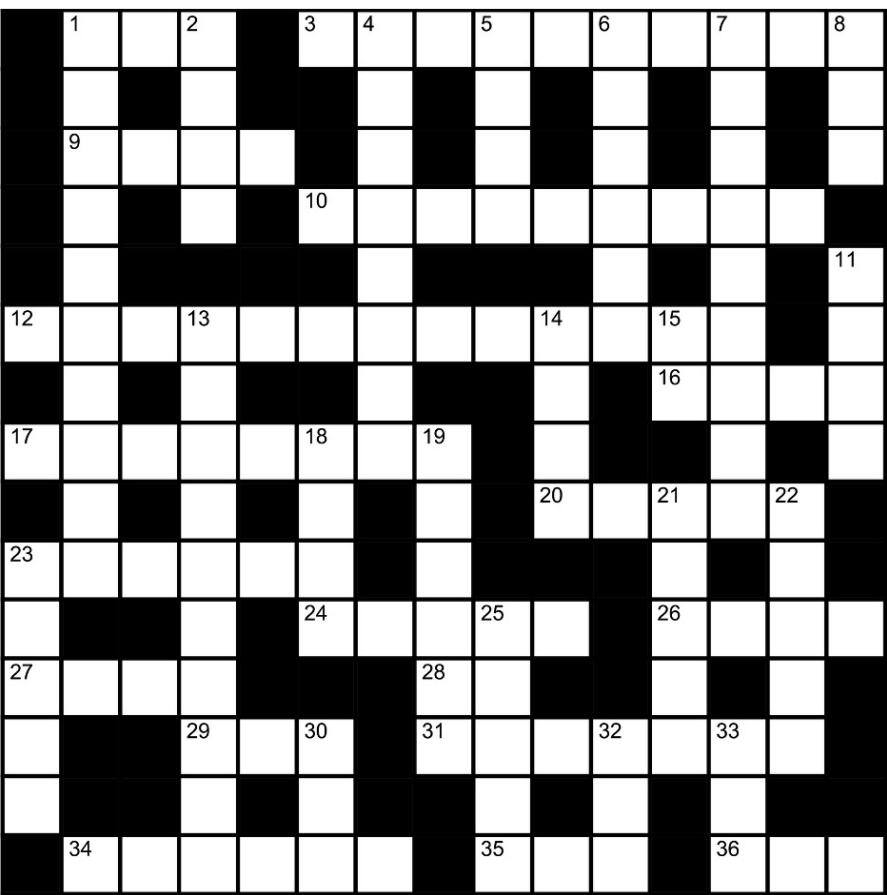
